Lake Huron Salmon Unlikely to Rebound, Study Says

Ann Arbor ô Lake Huronøs glory days as a salmon fishery are likely gone forever, according to a study whose lead researcher says Lake Michigan is following a similar pattern.

Lake Huron@ population of the alewife, the herring-like fish that are the Chinook salmon@ main food source, collapsed in 2003, according to researchers. Heavy stocking of Chinook in Lake Huron contributed to increased predation of alewives; the sharp Chinook decline started soon after.

In Lake Michigan, populations of alewives and salmon are both declining.



The study, published Monday in Ecosystems, used a food-web modeling approach to determine factors on the decline of salmon in Lake Huron. It determined that heavy stocking of salmon led to increased predation of alewives. The increase in non-native mussels also competed with small fish ô such as alewives and rainbow smelt, another salmon food ô for nutrients.

õWe are seeing all the same warning signs in lakes Michigan and Ontario,ö said Yu-Chun Kao in a release. Kao conducted the work for his doctoral dissertation at UM under study co-author Sara Adlerstein -Gonzalez. õWe@re seeing decreasing nutrient loads, a decrease in soft -bodied, bottom-dwelling invertebrates due to the mussels, a decrease in rainbow smelt and, as a result, Chinook salmon feeding almost solely on alewives.ö

Kao is working to follow this research with a study that focuses on Lake Michigan. He is now a post-doctoral researcher at Michigan State University who works at the U.S. Geological Survey in Ann Arbor.

Additional modeling work will be needed to determine if the pressure on the alewives population is as high in Lake Michigan as it was in Lake Huron, said study co-author Ed Rutherford, a fisheries biologist for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. No single factor contributed to the decline, he said.

õIt took a sort of perfect storm,ö he said.

While there is a fear that there will be an alewives collapse in Lake Michigan, it is possible that the population could rebound, he said.

õSome are worried itos happening right before our eyes,ö Rutherford said, referring to the Lake Michigan alewives population. õAlewives tend to have reproductive events in years that are warm. I think itos a little to early to tell if they are going to collapse and not rebound.ö

Rutherford said alewives are notorious for having wide swings in population size.

A September report from the Michigan DNR said that the Lake Michigan salmon population is down 75 percent from its peak in 2012, due partly to reduced stocking rates and declines in reproduction from a lack of prey.

ŏDNR biologists believe the only way to keep Lake Michigan from following Lake Huron is to manage the fisheries by balancing predator (salmon) and prey (alewife) so neither collapse,ö that report said.

Rutherford said it can be tough to find a balance.

õWhat we know a little bit sooner is what@s going with the fish population,ö he said. õThe ability for management to respond very quickly is harder to do.ö

Pacific salmon were introduced into the Great Lakes in the 1960s to control non-native alewives. But the alewife and rainbow smelt populations crashed in the early 2000s for reasons that included the invasion of foreign mussels that disrupted aquatic food chains.

Researchers say Lake Huron resource managers should focus their efforts on restoring native fish such as lake trout, walleye, whitefish and lake herring.

Closure for Walleye on Inland Waters Around Saginaw Bay

The Michigan DNR reminds anglers that regulations approved by the Natural Resources Commission in October 2015 impact walleye and yellow perch recreational fishing in Saginaw Bay. The new regulations had immediate effect and will remain in place for the 2016 fishing season.

For walleye, the daily possession limit is eight (8) fish and the minimum size limit is 13 inches. For yellow perch, the daily possession limit is reduced from 50 to 25 fish.

The waters where these walleye and yellow perch size-limit and baglimit regulations apply are known as Lake Huron management unit MH-4 but also include the Saginaw River up to the Center Street Bridge, which is immediately upstream of the Rust Avenue boat launch in Saginaw.

It is very important for anglers to remember that fishing seasons for walleye were not changed for these waters. The Saginaw River is considered inland water, so walleye season closes Tuesday, March 15, whereas the waters of MH-4 are considered Great Lakes waters and are open year round.

These regulation changes will be the starting point for a new management process where future possession and size limits will be tied to the status of the walleye population. If the population diminishes, the regulations will become more conservative, but if the population remains high, then regulations will remain liberal.

NEW!! Angler of the Year Rules and Qualifications

Alright here it is, the Angler of the Year (AOY). If you wish to participate and have outing results count towards your AOY score, you must have your membership dues up to date and paid before you fish an event. Results for any outing fished between January and November will count towards AOY. The winner will be announced at our annual December membership meeting.

Here is how events will be scored. Rules for individual events and weigh in results will be scored by the port captain. Port captains coordinate events, establish event rules, settle disputes, record weigh in results, determine the event winner, and report event results. Fisherman weigh their three biggest fish to count towards an event score. If an event is fished from a boat, the individual who reels in the fish will count it towards his score. Fish placed in a common cooler should be tagged or marked to identify the angler.

First place will receive 5 points
Second place will receive 3 points
Third place will Receive 1 point

This will open up the club awards to people who may not have a boat or may not be into the skipper of the year as much as they would outings in river ice pier etc. If there is a tie, points will be evenly dispersed for that event.
