# DAS Port Austin Tournament

**Saturday:** Skippers meeting at 5:00 am near Marina Office with tournament start at 6:00 am. Fish calls are 9:00 am and 11:00 am. Pull lines by 1:00 pm. Be in weigh-in line at Pavilion in Veteran's Park just to the west of Marina by 2:00 pm

After a nearly 2 month hiatus, the DAS Boat Trolling Tournament season resumes at Port Austin on Saturday, July 30. This will be the first tournament at this port since 2009. Since then, the harbor, dockage, ramps and facilities have gone thru a multi-million dollar renovation. Unfortunately, the fish cleaning station that was there has been demolished and has not been replaced as of yet. The nearest cleaning station is in Harbor Beach, 25 miles to the southeast along M-25.

The lake trout fishing in the area remains top-notch with the best fishing found off the Grindstone Reef 4 to 6 miles to the NE of the Port Austin Lighthouse. Spin-glos behind dodgers are the baits of choice run within a couple of feet of bottom. Metallic green/red head, bright green/white head, white w/pink dots seem to be the best colors for the spin-n-glos but donøt be afraid to try others. Hammered Chrome, Trash Can and White dodgers all work well in the ÷0ø size. Although the best



lake trout fishing is near the bottom, suspended fish can also be caught off downriggers set up 40ø ó 60ø down. Dipseys set to run at various depths and 5 to 10 colors of lead off in-line planers can also pickup steelhead, Atlantic salmon and the very occasional Chinook. Check these lines often as pink salmon can go unnoticed and -killøthem from catching anything else.

Words of Caution to those who have not fished here before, do not go between the Port Austin Light and land, stay well to the west and north of the light on your way to the Grindstone reef. There is a reef that connects shore to the lighthouse and many a boat has been caught on the rocks and needed to be rescued. Also, when fishing near the bottom at the Grindstone reef stay OFF the bottom. Cannon balls can be hung up on the rocks and create a hazardous situation that can pull a boatøs transom below the water. Keep wire cutters at the back of the boat just in case a ÷ball does get hung up.





# **New DAS Scholarship Format**

In cooperation with the Lake Superior State University Foundation, the Board of Directors has established the "Detroit Area Steelheaders Fisheries Scholarship". The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to a student majoring in the LSSU Biology, or Fisheries and Wildlife Management program, with a focus on fisheries.

The scholarship is a \$1000 annual award. LSSU students may submit a letter of application to the Chair of Biological Sciences. This award does not automatically renew, however past recipients may apply.

Successful candidates

- Must be a full time student of at least Sophomore status
- Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and Must be a resident of the state of Michigan

Members of the biological sciences faculty will recommend a recipient from the applicants for final approval by the Financial Aid Office.

# What's the Future for Great Lakes Salmon?

PENTWATER - Shortly after noon on a cool sunny Thursday, the 33-foot charter boat Sportsmen came back into the Pentwater village marina carrying four happy fishermen and coolers full of still-flopping fish.

Most of their catch were plump, pink-

tinged lake trout, pale bellies glistening in the bright May sun.

But after they had gotten near their quota of lake trout, Bud Perry and his friends asked Captain Brent Daggett to take them in search of chinook.

The chinook ó also known as king salmon ó has been the linchpin of Lake Michigan sport fishing almost since the moment it was introduced in the 1960s. It is big, it is aggressive and it is good eating.

õWhen youøve got a bigger fish that fights harder, you definitely get excited about it,ö said Perry of Pleasant Hill, Ohio, after he clambered off Daggettøs boat. õThe lake trout come right up to

the surface. They donot fight near as hard as the kings do. The kings? They donot want any part of it.ö

But after a spectacular five-decade arc, Lake Michiganøs salmon fishery appears to be in decline. Anglers are catching fewer fish, and the ones theyøre getting are nowhere near the 30-pounders longtime fishermen recall from decades past.

Some fear the collapse will be as hard as the one that hit Lake Huron a dozen years ago, forcing some charter operators to move to Lake Michigan or forcing many others to go out of business. Overall, sport fishing in the Great Lakes is a \$4 billion-a-year industry.

#### How bad is it?

In 2003, charter fishing clients in Lake Huron were catching an average of three chinook per boat, according to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Charter Boat Survey Program survey. By 2005, that had dropped to 1.2 per boat. In 2010, it was 0.8. The number of charter operators fell by half.

It hasnøt been that bad on Lake Michigan ó at least not yet.

In 2010, Lake Michigan charters averaged about 6 chinook per trip. That actually went up to 7.4 per trip in 2012, õwhich is just

crazy high,ö said Daniel OøKeefe. educator with Michigan Sea Grant, a cooperative program of the University of Michigan and State Michigan University, which supports research, outreach and education to enhance sustainable use of Great Lakes.

But that figure is an anomaly. In 2015, Lake Michigan charters averaged 2.2 chinook per trip, according to the charter survey.

õIt sounds like a terrible drop, and it is,ö OøKeefe said.

Fisheries managers are working to figure out how to strike a new balance among the complex web of native, invasive and introduced species in the Great Lakes, from tiny plankton to the vast proliferation of quagga mussels to lake trout and the mighty salmon. Those who fish for fun so far keep casting their lines as they wait to see how it plays out.

õThe salmon experiment, if you want to call it that, is very unique,ö said OøKeefe said. õHopefully a few years from now it will still wind up being classified as a success but with just a better balance.ö
