

DAS Threesome Retains Travelling Trophy



First Stop on the Tournament Trail

Lexington, April 18, 2015

Lexington Harbor (810-359-5600)

Captains meeting at 5:30 drop lines at 6:30

(These times may change to coincide with Spring Fling Tournament)

Must be in harbor by 2:00pm Weigh-In 2:30 in the Park behind the marina

Keep in mind since the Lexington harbor will not officially open until May 1. That makes all utilities and personal conveniences weather dependent. We may not have operating restrooms or fish cleaning station. Gas, water, and electricity may or may not be available depending upon how early the weather breaks and allows the State to get the harbor fully functioning. Ample parking is available right at the launch and annual or daily stickers are required.

It is not necessary to reserve the boat slips since it is so early in the season but keep in mind the Lake Huron Spring Fling two day tournament is running April 18 and 19. That a popular \$200 money tournament operated by Anderson Pro Bait so that could make things pretty crowded. The tournament committee will be adjusting our times and rules so that DAS members may fish both tournaments simultaneously. Channing and crew will be in Lakeport State Park (810-327-6224) 11 miles south of Lexington. The State Park will be open and you can register online for a campsite or boat slip reservation (http://www.midnrreservations.com) or call (800)447-2757.

Get your boats ready, strip your lines, sharpen your hooks and get ready for the first tournament of the year in Lexington. Use the DAS web site to find crews or captains and get ready to break the winter grip.

Some information you can use to fish the Lexington area:

Fish are scattered so work until you find them. When you find them stay on them. A box with some big Lake Trout will outweigh a larger number of Steelhead. (However, if you fish the Spring Fling Tournament also, you can weigh-in up to 10 fish per day but only 1 of those 10 can be a Lake Trout). Some Salmon and Steelhead can be taken in 70 to 100 foot of water, North of the harbor with spoons off the downriggers and also on some 2,3, 5, and 10 color lead lines off the Offshore boards. The bright orange and black, black and white, silver and blue, and green colors will work. Lake Trout can be taken North, and straight out of the harbor in the 80 to 100 foot of water areas, using dodgers with the spin and glows, or clean spoons down 90 to 120 feet.

Lake Huron Regional Fisheries Workshops

You are invited to join and participate this spring in the upcoming 2015 Lake Huron Regional Fisheries Workshops offering current research and information relating to the status of our Lake Huron fishery.

The Michigan Sea Grant and Michigan State University Extension, in partnership with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Fisheries Division, the USGS Great Lakes Science Center and local fishery organizations will host three regional workshops locally along Lake Huroncs coastline. These annual spring Lake Huron fisheries workshops bring communities together with fisheries research and management partners to discuss research findings, management updates, and fishing trends.

Three evening workshops, hosted across the state, are open to the public and will offer valuable information for anglers, charter captains, resource professionals and other community members interested in the Lake Huron fishery. Killer Shrimp may be Next Invasive Species to hit Great Lakes

A species of shrimp native to Eastern Europe is now a cause for concern for the Great Lakes. Its scientific name is *Dikerogammarus villosus*, but experts know this voracious crustacean simply as the killer shrimp. The shrimp itself is only about an inch long, but its large mandibles make it an aggressive predator and it is notable for its tendency to kill even when not hungry. Already a nuisance in Western European waters, researchers at McGill U. said that the killer shrimp could pose a problem for the Great Lakes before 2063.

In 50 years, the Great Lakes would be populated with many new invaders, most of which may come from waterways where Europe and Asia meet—the region around the Black Sea, stated the university. This region is the source of some of the most disruptive invaders in the Great Lakes today, such as the zebra mussel, and still has many species at a high risk of invading the North American lakes and rivers, such as the killer shrimp or the monkey goby. Researchers said that the danger these invasive species pose to North American waterways depends upon what kind of legislation is in place to protect against them. More than 180 non-native species moved into the Great Lakes over the past 200 years, but recent safeguards—such as rules on how ships can use ballast water—have dramatically lowered the chance for new species to get in.

No new species have been recorded since 2006. We may have closed the door on ballast water-mediated invasions. That remains to be seen. But other doors are still open.

They have a really big mouth and claws, and they literally shred their prey. They are very aggressive in any of the systems that they get into.

Summary of 2014 Chinook Tagging

This was the fourth year that all Chinook salmon stocked into Lake Michigan and the U.S. waters of Lake Huron received a coded wire tag and an adipose fin clip (ADCWT). Using two automated trailers, the lab tagged and clipped about 2.5 million Chinook salmon. Additionally, about 400,000 fish were adipose fin clipped only (AD only) and stocked into Lake Superior. These efforts required coordination and cooperation with seven state-administered hatcheries in Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana, and Illinois.

Chinook Salmon Tagging Comparison 2010-14

This year had continued high performance in efficiency and throughput that is attributable to consistent operator experience, and hardware and software improvements. Average throughput has remained constant at over 8,700 fish/hour for the last two years and has risen from 6,800 fish/hour in 2010.
