<u> Harbor Beach Boat Tournament, Saturday June 13, 2015</u>

Best fishing at a DAS tournament thus far this year!

The rain and high winds set in on Friday, so we were not able to do any pre fishing for the tournament. Late Friday evening the winds settled down and we woke up Saturday morning to light winds with 1 ft or so waves and foggy conditions.

We decided to postpone the tournament for an hour to let some of the fog lift, and also many other boats from the Thumb Area Steelheaders fishing the Veterans Outing were leaving at this time.



At 7:00 am, the

tournament started with 8 boats fishing anywhere from straight out of the harbor to 13 or so miles north. At the 9:00 am fish call, both õSea Hagö and õAquarius IIö reported 5 fish, õBlue Horizonö, õSulukiö and õSloppy Joeö had 4 fish, õVickiøs Secretö with 3 fish, õBobbyøs Toyö & õMoney Treeö each with 1 fish.

At 12:00 noon fish call, both õAquarius IIö and õSulukiö reported 9 fish, õSea Hagö, õVickiøs Secretö and õSloppy Joeö each with 8 fish, õBlue Horizonö with 7 fish, õBobbyøs Toyö with 6 fish and õMoney Treeö with 2 fish. Most all fish

caught were Lake Trout, which came from right off the bottom with spin n gloøs behind dodgers to flasher/flies and magnum spoons on 300 copper all the way up to 5 colors of lead. Lake trout seemed to be everywhere as different boats

fished at different depths and locations of water from 50 FOW to 120 FOW.

At the 3:00 pm weigh-in, most boats had 9 or more fish to weigh in. After all was said and done Chris Nytko and the Aquarius II Crew took first place and also big fish. (Way to go Chris and crew and nice to see

Based on intel from local captains and some of my fishing out of Muskegon the last couple years in mid July we mostly fish 80 to 140 FOW. Spinney flies, meat rigs and spoons should be in your arsenal. Long/deep copper and Dipsey lines seem to produce better than riggers.

However, a couple years ago in mid July after the winds created the right water temps close to shore we fished North of the pier heads in a North/South troll in 40-60 FOW and caught a limit of nice kings.

Last year in a week long fishing trip in July we caught a lot of steel-head in 200-240 FOW SW of the pier heads, using the old standby of orange spoons in Super Slim and Stinger sizes. Not necessarily tournament winning big fish, but a good backup plan if kings go dead late morning and you need your 8 fish. BTW, my go to spoon for steelhead is a Silver Streak "Orange Skirt", which seems to catch fish every trip.

As far as North vs. South I cannot predict where they will be a month from now, but we normally see good numbers of 4 year old fish in the 80 - 140' waters.

Regarding the nets, the local commercial fisheries will be moving their nets to their summer fishing spots in the next couple of weeks. I'll try to get the GPS coordinates for these and post them to the DAS website before the tournament. Although it's risky, I've found over the years there is good salmon fishing in the area of the nets.

Muskegon is less than 20 miles North of Grand Haven, so most of your Grand Haven fishing techniques should carry over for this port, and if you want to run down there and have hot waypoints, go for it.

Another thing to keep in mind while fishing out of Muskegon (especially if it's foggy) is the Lake Express Car Ferry that runs between Muskegon and Milwaukee. It will be coming into Muskegon at 9:30AM, then leaving Muskegon at 10:15AM.

Fish stocking creates numerous fishing opportunities throughout Michigan

The Michigan DNR announced it is in the middle of its new fish-stocking season. This spring, people are likely to find DNR fish-stocking trucks releasing their prized cargo at hundreds of lakes and streams throughout the state.

Over the course of a typical year the DNR will stock roughly 20 million to 25 million fish weighing nearly 400 tons, including eight species of trout and salmon and four cool-water species such as walleye and muskellunge. DNR fish-stocking vehicles will travel nearly 140,000 miles to stock between 700 and 1,100 locations

Multiple openers kick Michigan fishing season into high gear

The Michigan DNR is reminding anglers to dust off their fishing gear and get ready for the Michigan fishing season. The statewide trout season and the Lower Peninsula inland walleye, northern pike and muskellunge seasons all opened April 25.

Anglers also are reminded that in Upper Peninsula waters, the walleye, northern pike and muskellunge seasons opened Friday, May 15. And due to recent regulation changes the catch-and-immediate-release season for largemouth and smallmouth bass is now open all year on all waters (unless otherwise closed to fishing). The possession season for bass opens statewide May 23, except for Lake St. Clair, the St. Clair River and the Detroit River, which open June 20.

DNR Offers Steelhead Fishing Clinic June 27 at Tippy Dam Recreation Area

The Department of Natural Resources will present its Summer Run Steelhead Clinic Saturday, June 27, at <u>Tippy Dam Recreation Area</u> in Brethren, Michigan. The class starts at 10 a.m. and will run about nine to 10 hours.

The classroom portion of the clinic will take place at the recreation area headquarters. In the afternoon the class will hit the water, where instructors will show attendees how to fish and what to look for

For those who are interested in attending but cannot make this date, the next steelhead clinic will be held the last weekend in March 2016.

Participants are encouraged to plan a camping trip and stay the weekend at Tippy Dam Recreation Area campground.

Volunteers Report That Wild Salmon Dominated Catches in 2014

Anglers enrolled in the Salmon Ambassadors program found that wild Chinook Salmon made up 57-82 percent of the total catch in areas around Lake Michigan and northern Lake Huron.

The modern Great Lakes salmon stocking program began in 1966 and for many years anglers and fishery biologists lived by a simple equation: more fish stocked equals more fish caught.

By the late 1980s the situation was more complex. Chinook Salmon catches dropped off as bacterial kidney disease (BKD) took its toll, and biologists realized they had come close to the limit of salmon that Lake Michigan can support.

Another wrinkle to the equation was the increase in natural reproduction of Chinook Salmon. Hydroelectric dams and stream habitat improvements led to successful spawning of salmon in Michigan rivers. The gradual colonization of new rivers by this nonnative species led to what has been called a %unaway freight train+ of young salmon produced by reproduction in streams of Michigan and Ontario.

Anglers might be surprised to know just how many wild Chinook Salmon they are catching. Thanks to an angler science project led by Michigan Sea Grant and Michigan State University Extension, anglers can now share information on wild and stocked catches with each other and with trained biologists.

Volunteers of the <u>Salmon Ambassadors</u> program track the length of each Chinook Salmon caught and look for a clipped fin (the adipose fin) that indicates a stocked fish. Last year, 125 anglers signed up for the program. At the end of the 2014 fishing season, 59 volunteers provided useful data on 3,460 Chinook caught from Lake Michigan and northern Lake Huron. Wild Chinooks made up the majority of the catch in the following areas:

75% - wild in Manistee

70% - wild in the Ludington area (including Pentwater)

74% - wild in the Grand Haven area (including Muskegon and Holland)

65% - wild in South Haven

74% - wild in St. Joseph and Benton Harbor

62% - wild in Door Peninsula, Wisconsin

57% - wild in southern Wisconsin (Illinois border to Port Washington)

67% - wild in Illinois

82% - wild in northern Lake Huron (Straits of Mackinac to Alpena)

Each area included at least four volunteers reporting complete results. At least 200 Chinook Salmon were caught in each of the areas above, with the exception of Illinois where only 63 Chinooks were reported in volunteer catches.

Some of the results were expected. For example, volunteers in the Ludington area saw an early-to-late season increase in wild salmon (from 58 percent to 79 percent). Nearby spawning rivers like the Pere Marquette and Pentwater rivers probably contributed to the increase of large (30 inches and up) wild salmon in August.

Other results were a bit more surprising. St. Joseph and Benton Harbor do not offer as much.

Wild Salmon Contop from Pg. 7 high-quality spawning habitat, but even here in southwest Michigan

nearly ¾ of all Chinook Salmon caught were wild. However, most Chinooks caught by St. Joe area volunteers were taken early in the season.

Across the lake in southern Wisconsin the situation was different. Southern Wisconsin ports dong offer much spawning habitat either and volunteers here reported the lowest contribution (57 percent wild) of naturally produced Chinook Salmon. Although southern Wisconsin volunteers reported a low level of satisfaction with the late-season Chinook Salmon fishery, they did find that large (30 inches and up) stocked salmon were an important contribution to fishing in August and September.

A <u>detailed report on Salmon Ambassadors results by port is now available at the program web page</u>. Results provide anglers an indepth look at how stocked and wild fish contribute to fishing success at their favorite port.

The results are also available to biologists and fishery managers faced with the difficult task of maintaining the delicate balance of predators and prey. The old equation, \(\mathbb{m}\) ore fish stocked equals more fish caught, \(+ \mathbb{i} \) obsolete but this one is timeless, \(\mathbb{m}\) ore information equals better decisions. \(+ \)
