St. Joe Salmon Trolling Bonanza ... Saturday, May 4, 2013

It's the time of year we have all been waiting for, the start of the DAS boat trolling tournaments. I hope all of you have prepared for another great year on the big water, I know I have!

The St. Joe area of Lake Michigan has produced some of the finest salmon and trout fishing offered for spring boat trollers. The fish aren't always the biggest of the year but Kings are often caught in the 15 lbs. or larger size. They are probably some of the finest eating and fighting fish. Having spent the winter in the lower lake and waiting for the water to warm seems to send these fish in a feeding frenzy once the waters warm to 42 or 44 degrees. Great spots to find warm water off St. Joe would be the warm water discharge by Cook power plant and off the river mouth. Both areas hold nice schools of salmon and trout when the water warms.

Last year was a little different. We found the warmer water further out in the lake and a little deeper than usual, and the fish were snapping at everything. A few boats did well only fishing lead core lines in 5, 7 and 10 color, while others had great bites on riggers, divers and cores. Many boats came in early with limit catches of large and small fish, the bigger fish seemed to bite later in the morning.

Lure selection this time of year all depends on water, cold water means body baits like jointed Rapalas, Bombers, Shad Raps, Hot-n-Tots. Warm water means spoons large and small or rotators and flies. Watch for floating bait fish to determine the size spoons to run or go to a fish cleaning station and see what size the bait is in their stomachs, it also helps to have charter captain friends in the business to get the hot bite information. Lure speed is very critical this time of year, cold water = slower speed; warm water = faster speed. Pay close attention to your speed when you fish in and out of the warm water discharge areas and fine tune to the fishes behavior in that area.

This year the DAS club will also be having a fish-off against the Huron See St. Joe on Pg. 2

2013 Manistee Spring River Fish-Off



The plan was to fish the Big Manistee River (Suicide Bend) in the morning and if the fish were not there we would pack up and try the piers. We all arrived at the river around 6:30 am (only car there). As we walked down the steps, which were ice and snow covered, we had high hopes.

The first hour was un-successful with only 1 fish on and off in 20 seconds. So, at 10:00 am we decided to head to the piers to see what was happening there. We also called Bad Dog, aka Tom Gorguze, who was fishing off his dock to see what was going on there. He told us he had seen a couple fish caught at the boat

launch, but he did not have a bite. So off to the south pier we went. There were 7 people on the south pier when we arrived which meant all the good spots were gone. 

Besides fishing, the Grand Haven area is a very popular destination with clean beaches and a great downtown shopping/restaurant district just a block away making your trip fun for all.

The 256 mile long Grand River flows out a huge mud line into Lake Michigan. Seasonal fishing tactics for early spring often include trolling the heavily stained water outside the pier head. Early morning success can be found in shallow water trolling with planner boards and dipsey divers using Rapalas or Hot'n Tots. Go with darker colors in the early hours and brighten up as the day becomes brighter. Orange and gold and pearl and white are good combinations for this time of year.

I'm still mulling over what to serve at the weigh-in but I have some time to come up with something good. Bring your appetite and your best attitude. Let's have some fun at the clubs second tournament stop in 2013 at Grand Haven.



Stocking of Atlantic Salmon in Lake Huron and tributaries to occur this spring

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources today announced plans to release approximately 100,000 Atlantic salmon into Lake Huron and two of its tributary streams this spring. Yearling Atlantic salmon will be stocked in the St. Mary's River, Au Sable River, Thunder Bay River and in the Lexington Harbor in southern Lake Huron in the coming days.

The DNR's Fisheries Division originally experimented with rearing and stocking Atlantic salmon from 1972 to 1982. These stockings resulted in only modest returns, and the program was essentially inactive until 1986. That year, Lake Superior State University (LSSU) began rearing and stocking Atlantic salmon into the St. Mary's River under a memorandum of agreement with the DNR. The fish are reared at the LSSU aquaculture laboratory, located directly on the St. Mary's River. The laboratory now serves as the sole source of Atlantic salmon eggs in Michigan and continues to offer recreational fishing opportunities on Lake Huron while providing LSSU students with educational experiences in fisheries research, culture and management.

In 2010, the DNR began experimental rearing of Atlantic salmon at its <u>Platte River State Fish Hatchery</u> near Beulah. After two years of working through disease problems and investing in equipment to control disease outbreaks, the production of Atlantic salmon yearlings in 2013 has been exceptional.

"This year's production of Atlantic salmon yearlings has gone according to plan, and we're pleased to report the fish are healthy and disease-free," said Ed Eisch, Northern Lower Peninsula Area Hatchery manager. "Fish production personnel have worked hard to raise these fish from eggs to healthy yearlings. The fish are starting to smolt and are ready to be stocked into a lake environment.

According to Todd Grischke, Lake Huron Basin coordinator, the stocking of these fish in Lake Huron represents the culmination of many years of planning and cooperation.

"Fisheries Division managers have been working with constituent organizations over the past 18 months to identify appropriate stocking locations for Atlantic salmon," said Grischke. "Many sites were proposed and evaluated according to things such as stream temperatures, public access and the ability for the DNR to evaluate returning adults. We also focused on those locations that would optimize the chances of success and provide stream, pier and open water fishing opportunities."

Atlantic salmon are one of several species of salmonids stocked in the Great Lakes, and are caught by anglers on both Lake Huron and Lake Michigan.

Fish stocking creates numerous fishing opportunities throughout Michigan

The Department of Natural Resources is the middle of the new fish stocking season. This spring, DNR fish-stocking trucks will be pulling up to lake and stream banks throughout the state to release prized cargo.

Fish stocking is used to restore, enhance and create new fishing opportunities in Michigan's inland lakes, streams and the Great Lakes. The DNR's Fisheries Division accomplishes this task by rearing fish at its six fish production facilities located throughout the state; cooperatively managing up to 50 rearing ponds and 12 Great Lakes net pen locations; and by maintaining a fleet of 17 specialized fish stocking vehicles.

Over the course of the year, the DNR will stock roughly 19 million fish weighing nearly 370 tons, including eight species of trout and salmon and four coolwater species such as walleye and muskellunge. DNR fish-stocking vehicles will travel nearly 138,000 miles to stock more than 700 locations.

Michigan anglers have access to four Great lakes; 3,000 miles of Great Lakes shoreline; more than 11,000 inland lakes; and more than 36,000 miles of rivers and streams. That puts residents and visitors no more than 10 minutes away from great angling opportunities and world-class fisheries.
