Already Time For The 1st Boat Trolling Tournament?

Professor Meadows was responsible for the placement of the research buoy that was placed in Lake Michigan off Ludington in the Spring of 2011. This research buoy measures wind speed, gusts and directions; air & water surface temperature; barometric pressure; solar radiation; wave height, period and direction; water temp. at 8 locations in the water column & the current profile throughout the column.

He will be speaking on the currents in Lake Michigan and how they impact the Sportfishing.

## Inside this issue:

It's hard to believe but its tournament time, I hope you have been sharpening those dull hooks and polishing your dingy spoons. Now's the time we have all been waiting for, it doesn't seem like 7 months have passed since we have had that competitive edge

amongst us. This year should be very interesting on the big water do to the fact that we didn't have much of a winter. If you remember last year we had a very long, cold winter and the lake really never warmed up till almost mid-June. Now we have just the opposite, a short winter with an early warm up. I'm not

sure what to make of it other than get the boat in the pond and give it a go!

St. Joe should give up a wide assortment of fishing opportunity this time of year, we could get great pier fishing or a fantastic off shore bite. For pier fishing a good tactic for Kings at St. Joe is to watch the wind direction and then work the color line where the river and lake water meet. This is where the Kings will ambush schools of baitfish that seek out warmer water and use the dirty wa-

ter as cover from predators. Fishing should be good from 20 FOW to 50 FOW, all the way from the pier to Cook power plant some 7 miles south, and the Cook has its own warm water discharge that can be a great spot for a mixed bag of Kings, Coho, Lakers and Steelhead.



Proven trolling patterns consist of inline boards, divers and riggers set at different depths to cover the water column until the fish start telling you what technique they prefer. As far as lures, riggers

and divers should get a spread of MAG sized spoons in SOG Frog, Purple Smurf, Blue Dolphin and Hot Lobster for big Kings. Inline boards should get a spread of Orange spoons, red Thin Fins, Mixed Veggies and any of your favorite spoons to cover for Coho, Steelhead and Laker .... 3 and 5 colors set for coho and steelhead, with 5, 7, and 10 colors loaded for Kings and Lakers. This same spread should hold up for the off shore bite as well. just head west until you find bait or start hitting fish, then just repeat your direction of troll that you hit fish at and hone in on your school of fish. Plugs do get a work out this time of year with Chrome Red Head, Glows and Pearl patterns working well.

Skippers meeting will be at 5 am. at West Basin Marina, with fishing to start at 6 am, Fish calls will be at 9 am and noon and stop fishing at 2pm. For those new to the St. Joe tournament, the boat launch is on the Benton Harbor side of the St. Joe river..... just keep in mind to hug the north side of the river, this is where the deepest channel of water is until you get down to the road bridge at that point its fairly deep all the way out to the lake. One other place to watch out for is the railroad bridge, where a lot of logs seem to

stack up from the spring runoff. Last year, there were a bunch of large logs floating in the open lake, so be careful.

## Are the Big Salmon Back in Lake Michigan to Stay?

Word around the west side of the state last summer was that big salmon were back. Now that the Department of Natural Resources' annual report on fish entered in the Master Angler Program has been completed, we know the stories were more than just fish tales.

Anglers submitted 33 Chinook salmon that were awarded Master Angler status in 2011, compared to three in 2011. It was similar for Coho salmon; the DNR recognized 13 Master Angler Coho salmon caught in 2011, compared to just one in 2010.

The Master Angler Program recognizes anglers who catch fish that exceed certain size standards. When the program was created in 1973, Master Angler fish were judged solely on weight. As catch-and-release fishing caught on with the angling public, however, the DNR began offering Master Angler status to fish based on length, too. The catch-and-release category now recognizes significantly more anglers and fish each year than the traditional catch-and-keep category.

The heaviest Chinook salmon entered in the program in 2011 was a 37.06-pound behemoth caught by Richard Schulte on Aug. 23. Schulte's Chinook was one of five kings in the catch-and-keep category that bested 30 pounds. (Chinook salmon must weigh 27 pounds for Master Angler status.)

In the catch-and-release category, Craig Morton of Westlake, LA., submitted a fish that measured 43.13 inches (just a hair longer than Schulte's 43-incher). Morton took his fish Sept. 30 while fly fishing on the Manistee River.

Interestingly enough, all five fish in the catch-and-release category were caught in rivers — two in the Manistee, two in the Pere Marquette and one in the Muskegon. In the keep category, only two came from rivers (both from the Manistee), though one was also caught inland, in Pere Marquette Lake.

As for Coho, the largest fish kept – a 14.06-pounder taken on a spoon in Lake Michigan – was caught by Matthew Kemmerer of St. Louis, MO. Only one of the 12 in the category was taken inland, a 12.94-pound specimen taken in Manistee Lake.

The only Master Angler Coho in the catch-and-release category was a 32.38-inch fish taken by Shirley Brock of Canton in the Pere Marquette River.

## 2012 Lake Huron Regional Fisheries Workshops

You are invited to join and participate this spring in the upcoming 2012 Lake Huron Regional Fisheries Workshops offering current research and information related to the status of our Lake Huron fishery.

The Michigan Sea Grant and Michigan State University Extension, in partnership with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Fisheries Division, the USGS Great Lakes Science Center and local fishery organizations will host three regional workshops locally along Lake Huron's coastline. Topics will include updates on Lake Huron fish populations and angler catch data, resurgence of native species such as Lake Huron walleye, forage fish surveys and results from the ongoing Lake Huron predator diet study, updates of fisheries management activities, among other Lake Huron related topics of local interest.

Three evening workshops, hosted across the state, are open to the public and will offer valuable information for anglers, charter captains, resource professionals and other community members interested in the Lake Huron fishery. Workshops are open to the public at no cost; however, pre-registration is requested. Workshop dates and locations include:
