Manistee Then Frankfort Wrap Up The Season

Some Get 'em, Some Don't at Manistee

On August 25 the Steelheaders headed north-west to Manistee for the Manistee DAS Tournament. The weather was perfect. Temperatures were comfortable in the mid 80's, sunny skies, with 2 to 4 foot waves. We had eight boats ready to compete. Friday morning the winds were 15 - 20mph out of the south with waves of around 2 to 3 feet. Most of the boats ventured out on Friday trying to figure out where the fish would be. Bad Dog and Thor's Hammer started out strong with early success going straight out and finding fish almost immediately. Almost Paradise headed south and found some 6 pound fish pretty quickly. However, after fishing for about an hour, the Almost Paradise boat experienced some technical difficulties with the boat's auto-pilot. They ended up losing two rods and reels to the chilly waters of Lake Michigan. The waves started building around 10:00 am, and most of the boats headed in. Bad Dog (Tom Gorguze) invited all of the Steelheaders over to his place for lunch, which turned out to be feast. As most of the Steelheaders were enjoying delicious food, a few drinks, and wonderful company, the Sea Hag and his crew were busy catching salmon in Bad Dog's backyard on Manistee Lake – 3 salmon in total!

Saturday morning the forecast was for 1 to 3 foot waves, which are favorable conditions for salmon fishing. There were very few reports of fish from the eight boats. Once again, the Almost Paradise crew decided to head south to stay clear of all the boat traffic that was straight out. They started three miles south of the harbor in 150 foot of water. For the first hour they did not see a fish but did not give up. By the 9:00 am fish call the majority of the Steelheaders were not on the fish. Bad Dog had 6 fish and Almost Paradise reported in with 7. The Almost Paradise crew kept trolling south. They ran two riggers (120'-140'), four Dipsy Divers, two wire, and two fire line 200' to 350' back. However, the real action started, when they put out a 300' copper with a 6 oz. dive bomb with a latter-back J plug. Then the rigger went with a spin-doctor and fly . . . that's when the fire line divers started to take off. At the

Season Finale In Beautiful Frankfort

Our Season Finale took place on Sept 9th in the beautiful port of Frankfort. The DAS had not held a tournament here since 2007 and I had forgot just how nice and also friendly this port was. Unfortunately, most of the week there had been a steady wind out of the south, which kept the warm water in the area. A few boats including "Miss Dipsey" fished on Friday and despite the warm water the boats that pre-fished all faired well. "Miss Dipsey" fished dropping lines at 6:30am and pulled lines at 9:15am and came in with 9 nice kings. We had 5 of the fish come on the blue and white John King paddle/ fly combo, 2 fish on a blue cut bait rig and the rest on the J plugs.

Saturday morning we held the Captains meeting at 5:30 and 6 boats reported. Although, overnight the wind had switched to the north and was blowing hard. The Ludington buoy was reporting 6' waves and the north shore buoy was reporting 3' waves. With that information in hand and the safety for all a top concern the captains made the decision to wait until twilight to head out and see if the water was fishable. "Sloppy Joe", "Miss Dipsey" and "Bad Dog" were the first boats to head out, Once hitting the pier heads "Sloppy Joe" and "Miss Dipsey" turned back to the docks and "Miss Dipsey" called over the radio and canceled the tournament for the day. "Bad Dog" decided to see if water conditions were better off shore and re-

We pulled lines at 12 noon and had to be at weigh in by 1pm. 5 boats managed to find fish, but "Bad Dog" sat down first thing in the morning on the fish and managed to bring 7 fish to the weigh in and take 1st place with 118.95 points. "Hardtop & Tails" not far behind with 5 nice kings wrapping up 2nd place with a score of 82.35 and also winning the \$30 big fish pool with his 14.50 king.

Although the weather was not what we would have liked, we all managed to catch some fish throughout the weekend and spend some time in one of the most beautiful ports we visit.

Portions of Betsie River and Betsie Bay to be closed to fishing

To protect salmon and steelhead spawning runs (SPECIAL BULLETIN received Sept 15, 2012)

The Michigan DNR announced on September 15 that a portion of the lower Betsie River and the eastern end of Betsie Bay will be closed to fishing from October 10, 2012, until further notice to protect the fall salmon run in the Betsie River. While the closure will not officially go into effect until October 10—the earliest date it can be enacted under state law—the DNR is urging anglers to avoid the area. "Anglers walking around on the exposed sand flats are unintentionally spooking fish, causing the fish to beach themselves and die before they can enter the river to reproduce," said DNR officials.

Low water levels in Lake Michigan have caused very low water levels in the east end of Betsie Bay, with sand flats becoming exposed. Because of the extremely low water, Chinooks are exposed to high water temperatures and have had a hard time entering the Betsie to spawn.

The fishing closure will read as follows: "East end of Betsie Bay (or Betsie Lake) closed to fishing from October 10 until further notice. Closure from the Betsie Valley Trail Bridge (former RR trestle bridge) west to a line in Betsie Bay between the westernmost dock of the Northstar Marina and the westernmost dock of the East Shore Marina. The closed area will be marked with buoys."

The order declaring the closure will be signed Sept. 17. Under state law, 21 days must elapse after the order is published in a newspaper in the affected county or counties before it can take effect. Publication will take place Sept. 19, 2012, making the order's effective date Oct. 10, 2012.

The Betsie River salmon run is made up mostly of wild, naturally reproduced fish. The Betsie River is not stocked by the department. The Betsie River provides outstanding spawning habitat, particularly for Chinook salmon, and has become famous as a salmon fishing river. The wild salmon produced in the Betsie provide fishing for many anglers. That's why it is so important that we allow these fish to proceed upstream to spawn.

Despite the closure, much of Betsie Bay remains open to fishing. The deeper western and central portions of Betsie Bay will still be open. This includes the publicly accessible fishing piers at the "Open Space" in Frankfort and at Bayfront Park in Elberta. Salmon fishing opportunities can also be found at other nearby areas, including Platte Bay and the Platte River, Manistee Lake and the Manistee River.

If Lake Michigan levels remain low, the fall and spring steelhead runs may also be threatened. It is for that reason that the area will remain closed to fishing until further notice.
