This article is the first in a 3 month series that coincides with the Strong "Fly of the Month" promotion. The first 60 members attending each of the next 3 monthly meetings will receive the Fly of the Month. The DAS Board of Directors would like to thank Captain Matt Strong of Strong Flies and Shane Ruboyianes of Dreamweaver for this opportunity and greatly appreciate their contributions.

Early Morning Action by Captain Matt Strong



As the first light peeks over the dunes and onto the lake, the ringing of the dinner bell occurs all over the lake. Wire divers start to scream, downriggers pulse, and in the distance, you hear "FISH ON!" This is summer in Michigan. The pursuit of silver kings with nasty attitudes draws anglers by the crowds to the gold coast – mid Lake Michigan: a world class salmon fishery.

As Captain of the Too Strong and Strong Performance, this is my playground! Strong Performance Charters is a family-run charter business for over 25 years. You too can experience my playground, the addiction and challenge of our fishery, regardless of whether you book a charter or you own your boat. Here are a few early morning tips for a freezer full of salmon.

***<u>Get an early start!</u> In Ludington, it is not uncommon to leave the dock at 5 or 5:15am. Already then, there are over 100 boats on the lake. Pick a good starting point, get your rods set, and get ready!

***<u>Keep it simple!</u> Six to eight rods in the dark is a good start, then adding additional rods as it gets lighter and visibility increases. My morning set includes 4 wire divers, 3 riggers, and 2 coppers, with typically the divers taking the first bites of the morning. Make sure you keep your drags loose and clickers on!

***<u>If it don't glow, it don't go!</u> All baits in the early morning should either be super glow or UV glow. 8" and 10" Spin Doctors by Dreamweaver in glow blades followed by Strong Flies are tasty combinations. Some of my favorite Strong Flies are the Glow Mirage, UV Pickled Sunshine, Glow Spook, and Glow Silver Addiction to name a few. In addition to these combinations, I run fixed harness plugs by Ace Hi and Dreamweaver Cut Plugs, all in glow. My 'go to' plugs are the Dreamweaver Double Glow, Dreamweaver Yellow Splatterback, Dreamweaver Blue Splatterback, Dreamweaver Wonderbread, Ace Hi Gray Ghost, Ace Hi Double Glow, Ace Hi Pinky, and Ace Hi Double Glow with Pink Top.

***<u>Slow down!</u> When fishing rotators and plugs, I prefer a slower troll, typically 1.7 to 2.0. To achieve this, I run two sea bags and troll on one engine.

***<u>Match the rotator to the fly!</u> Make sure your rotator matches your fly. If I am running a Blue Bubble Spin Doctor, I will run it with a fly that matches that color, such as a Strong Fly Blue Fairways. If I am running a White Slick Paddle, I will run a Strong Fly Pickled Mirage. The key is finding combinations that you have confidence in. Some of my hot combinations are:

> White Slick (lazer tape) Spin Doctor with a Strong Fly UV Pickled Sunshine Blue Bubble Spin Doctor with a Strong Fly Blue Fairways Chrome Frog Spin Doctor with a Strong Fly Glow Mirage Mountain Dew Spin Doctor with a Strong Fly Mountain Dew Glow UV Paddle with a Strong Fly UV Glow Black Ice Glow (tuxedo) with a Strong Fly Silver Addiction Blue Super Glow spinny with a Strong Fly Electric Eel White Glow Paddle with a Strong Fly KGB

and allow me to find fish and develop a strategy for getting on the fish early Saturday morning. That might have worked if I was able to get out on the lake. Thursday was a no-go all day and afternoon.

On Friday we gave it a go in the morning but I never got out of the river before I turned tail and headed back to West Bay Marina. After sitting around for several hours Friday we gave it another try sometime around noon. The lake had settled down by then and after an amusement park ride getting out of the river mouth we found the lake in great shape and got a few hours of trolling in. The fishing was not great for us but we did go two for four with a couple of Lake Trout coming on large Moonshine double orange crush spoons. We fished straight out of the St. Joe River in 50 to 60 feet of water trolling between 2.0 and 2.4 mph. Both fish came on 6 color lead core.

On Saturday the NOAA weather forecast looked like the lake would be fishable in the early morning but the wind was predicted to increase each hour until it got up to 20 to 30 mph out of the southeast. NOAA nailed it perfectly. Eleven boats attended the 0530 Captains meeting and everyone got out early because the lake was down. After a couple of hours I could tell my small boat was not going to be out there for a noon fish call because the wind was building steadily. By the 0900 fish call we had two small Steelhead and missed one good hook up on a hot lobster. Most boats reported 1 to 2 fish so I knew we were not the only boat struggling to locate fish. By 0930 the wind was too much for me and I headed back to port. By 1000 I was tied up at my slip where I monitored the radio conversation as the larger boats discussed how much longer they would be able to fish. Bob Feisel called the tournament over at 11:30 because it was getting pretty rough by then. With a 0630 start and an 11:30 end we got the required five hours in so it turned out to be an official result. The good news is everyone got back in safely and DAS had a pretty good turnout for the first tournament.

*Reminder: There will be a small prize awarded out of the tackle raffle for the "best fish story" that comes from the St. Joe tournament. Polish up your story telling skills and tell the best story at the May 31 membership meeting and you may win a prize.

The final results for St. Joe: Total number of fish caught: 13 Total weight of fish caught: 95.85 Tournament winner Vicki's Seacret with Bob Feisel and his crew weighing in with 25.85 pounds.

Big Fish winner was Hard Top n Tails with Captain Jim Zanke bringing in a 14.4 pound King. (Complete results on Pg. 5)

Grand Haven - May 21 & 22, 2011

The beautiful port city of Grand Haven will welcome the Detroit Area Steel headers into their waters for our second tournament on May 21st and the 22nd. This is definitely a tournament that you as a fisherman will not want to miss, and remember that this tournament kicks off this year's 3-3-3 fishing contest. Last year we had outstanding weather both days except for the heavy fog on Saturday morning but all of our boats managed to catch fish in what may have been the closest weight contest of the year. Miss Dipsey came out on top of the heap with Tim and Jodi Robinson coming from behind to pull out the victory and finish first out of the thirteen boats that entered the tourney.

It is very important that after you have launched your boat at the Harbor Island boat ramp that you park your trailer in one of the parking areas away from the ramp. I usually park over by the soccer fields and in the many years that I've been attending this outing I've not had any problems at all. I've heard some real horror stories about what has happened to trailers if you leave them in the boat ramp parking area.

Grand Haven is one of a hand full of ports where you might catch the coveted grand slam as Brown Trout, Lakers, Coho, Steelies and the mighty King are available at this time of the year. Fishing can be hot or cold but it's up to the DAS group to seek out these monsters of the deep. Just last year Sloppy Joe and E-Fish-Nsee managed to pull a couple of Kings over the fifteen pound mark. Come prepared for all kinds of action as you'll be fishing the top, middle and bottom waters of Lake Michigan. Be aware that the captain's meeting takes place on Saturday morning at 5 a.m. and that one member of each boat must be present to register the boat and crew in this tournament. Fishing takes place on both Saturday and Sunday as you will be allowed to places lines in the water at 6 a.m. Starting call and fish calls will be at 6 a.m., 9 a.m., and noon. We'll be pulling lines on 2 p.m. on Saturday, with weigh in at 3 p.m. On Sunday we'll be pulling lines at 12 noon with the weigh in at 1 p.m.

The Grand Haven area has several motels/hotels to choose from, I personally can vouch for the Days Inn and the Best Western as nice and reasonably priced places to stay. Many restaurants abound and several are within walking distance from the boat marina as the downtown area is very close. Also I've noticed that in Spring Lake it's cheaper for gasoline than in Grand Haven so you might want to fill your truck and boat's gas tank just before getting to the launch. It's smart to make your dock/slip reservations in advance and you can do that through the DNR website. Also be sure to pay the launch fee and get a receipt as the Grand Haven police are always looking for a source of revenue. Beware of overnight parking in those spots marked for the Farmer's Market on Saturday morning at the Municipal Marina lot.

Hope to see you there and don't forget to bring along a big cooler for all the fish you'll be taking home. **Port Captain Ron Pal** "Lucky Strike" 586-703-8824

Olcott, NY: In Search of Big Kings

After quite a few years absence, The Detroit Area Steelheaders are returning to Olcott, NY for a Boat Trolling Tournament on Saturday, June 11, 2011. This Lake Ontario port can produce some pretty good sized Chinook Salmon. It is with these hopes that we will descend upon Olcott.

There are quite a few things that must be taken into consideration to plan for this trip. First of all you will have to be sure and purchase a New York non-Resident fishing license. You can do this on line at http://www.dec.ny.gov/permits/28941.html or by phone Call 1-86-NY-DECALS (1-866-933-2257). You must be 16 years or older to purchase a license by phone. You can also do this in person at the Town of Newfane Marina in Olcott (see the Handouts on our Website's Tournament page for directions) as well as sporting goods stores and town offices. The non -Resident License fee is \$15.00 for a daily permit or \$35 for a seven day permit. If you did not get the handout at the April meeting you can go on-line also at http://www.dec.ny.gov/outdoor/7917.html to review and download the New York State fishing regulations. As far as possession limits, you are allowed one daily limit per person. You may possess an additional 2 days limits providing those fish are processed. Processed is any canned, smoked or frozen fish. The skins must be on all fillets for identification purposes. MAKE SURE YOU UNDERSTAND ALL NEW YORK FISHING REGULATIONS AND POSSESSION LIMITS ENTERING BACK INTO THE U.S. FROM ONTARIO.

The shortest distance to Olcott would be via the Blue Water Bridge through Ontario. However this requires either a passport or Michigan Enhanced Drivers license. You can apply for the Enhanced Drivers license at any Secretary of State office. Be sure to allow 2-3 weeks for delivery. It is approximately 5 hours to Olcott through Ontario versus about 8 hours through Ohio and Pennsylvania.

There is a very useful website available at <u>http://www.olcottfishing.com/</u>. It has a lot of information about Olcott and Western Lake Ontario fishing. Look over this website thoroughly to get a better understanding of fishing this area. Talk to some charter boat captains once you arrive in Olcott. They can provide some great information.

The Town of Newfane Marina in Olcott will be our headquarters for this event. Dawn, at the Marina, has assured me there will be plenty of room for the boats that will be attending. Be sure to make your own reservations by calling (716) 778-5462. Dockage is \$1 per foot per night. There are showers available at the Marina. Usage is \$1. Sleeping on your boat is no problem, however sleeping in vehicles in the parking lot is discouraged. There is a campground right across Lake Road by the Marina which would allow easy access. The Harbor Resort can be contacted at (716) 778-5190 for reservations. In addition, check out the handouts for motels, cottages, or houses to rent in the area.

We will have the skippers meeting at the Pavilion on the Marina property at 5:00am. The Marina will have coffee and Danishes available at this time also. The tournament will start at 6:00am. You can run to your favorite spot and get ready to fish but lines cannot be set until 6:00am. There will be fish calls at 9:00am and 12:00pm on channel 72. We will pull lines at 2:00pm and you must be in the weigh-in line at the Pavilion at the Marina by 3:00pm. Be sure to let the port captain know on channel 72 when you are in pier heads at tournaments end. We will have the usual catered picnic at the weigh-in.

This tournament should be an out of the ordinary experience and should make for a great road trip. It will give our skippers and crews a chance to explore a new area and should be a good time. We are hoping to have a good turnout to make this a successful event. For more information, you can call me at 586-531-9198.
