# DECENT Fishing at Olcott

We certainly didn't experience the kind of fishing that the Niagara Pro-Am money tournament did on the weekend of June 4 and 5 but I think most of the DAS Skippers were satisfied with their catches at Olcott, NY on Saturday, June 11, 2011.

86 boats in the Niagara Pro-Am held the weekend before weighed in a total of 1,678 fish with a total weight of over 13,200 lbs! Expectations were high for the 7 DAS boats that made the trip. Many of them did some pre -fishing on Friday to try and pin point where the fish might be on tournament day. However, a cold front that pushed through Thurs-

## Couldn't Make the May Meeting?

Resembling the staging lanes at a DNR Launch Ramp, the parking lot at the American Polish Cultural Center took on a completely new look for the DAS May Membership meeting on Tuesday, May 31, 2011. It was the Annual Boat Trolling Demo that filled up the north parking area. President Bob Jones introduced each Skipper to give a rundown on their boat and how it is set-up for Great Lakes Trolling.

First up was Jerry Zabel and his fully equipped river boat, "Wish-Full", a 1998 16' Lund It is set



-up for back drop fishing, using 5 rods behind the boat utilizing the river current to activate the baits. Long oars are used to move the boat along with a chain anchor to keep it under con-

day evening had the fish pretty well scattered. Boats reported getting fish from 60 FOW all the way out to 300 FOW but there did not seem to be a concentration of fish in any one location. Most of the fish caught were in the top 50 feet; no one bait seemed to be the ticket as the fish were hitting anything from spoons to flasher/flies to J-plugs. All boats did find some fish but plans still were not very clear for the morning.

The weather forecast did not sound too promising Friday evening, however, Saturday

It was a really tough fishing week-end at Grand Haven this year. The club had a very nice turn out of twelve boats this year but only a couple of the skipper's caught more than a hand full of fish. Leading the way was Captain Bob Paradise and crew mate Tom Thieda on Almost Paradise



and finishing second was Captain Paul Gjeldum and his crew on the Blue Horizon. Not many boats caught a whole lot of fish but it was encouraging to see a new club boat make the trip, Nite Moves with Captain Carl Ventimiglia and crew making their debut and finishing fourth. trol. It also has a depth sounder along with speed and temp. for general usage. The boat fishes with up to 3 people comfortably. The motor uses a Jet-Drive to avoid damage from logs, rocks etc. There is also are an auxiliary motor and a bow mounted Electric for other types of fishing. Jerry thoroughly explained the boat's rigging and then fielded a slew of questions from the crowd in attendance. Next was Dan Chisholm and his nicely appointed 2006, 19 foot Monark open fishing boat, "Channing", with pass through wind-



shield and a canvas convertible top. It is powered by a two stroke 115 HP Mercury Optimax outboard motor. Equipment includes Bow mount electric trolling motor, 80# thrust, long shaft, Eagle fish finder w/ GPS, Fish Hawk X4 (new this year, still learning how to use it) and Down rigger bar across the stern with two Mag10 down riggers. Dan also had a great presentation about the boat and fielded questions from the curious in attendance. The third and last boat in the demo was Tom Gorguze' "Bad Dog". It is a 1997 221 Center console with 225hp Mercury and 8hp Yamaha kicker. He has used it to fish club tournaments since 2007. He would like to add an isinglass enclosure



the t-top, and high speed electric riggers. Tom thoroughly explained his set-up and answered plenty of questions. The BOD would like to thank Jerry, Dan and Tom for hauling their rigs down, setting them up and taking the time to explain their set-ups and answering questions. Those in attendance really enjoyed the demonstrations and Q&A sessions following.

After the demo, the crowd moved inside and the Prez introduced our featured guest speaker, Bob Easterbrook, an avid outdoorsman, youth hunting instructor and organizer of the Great Lakes Bow Fishing Championship. Bob explained the basics of bow fishing, the equipment involved and the structure of the Bow Fishing Championship along with a slide show presentation. He definitely had the audience's attention with the pictures of huge carp and the boatloads of fish shot during the Championship. Thanks to Bob for a very interesting presentation.

After a 15 minute break, Bob Ksionzek took the floor with reports on the tournaments at St Joe & Grand Haven and presentations of the Top Five plaques for each tournament. He also had last minute information for the Olcott NY tournament.

Following this our President took numerous fishing reports from the floor. This was followed with the usual great selections for the tackle raffles and an extraordinary lucky evening for two tables. Of the eight different tackle prizes including a Large Salmon Net, all were won by two different tables. Continuing that streak of luck, the 1st prize of \$60 in the 75/25 Drawing was won by Ron



Pal at the luckier of the two tables. Not wanting to miss out, Blaise Pewinski moved from the unlucky table he was at and sat at Ron's table and, believe it or not, won the \$30 2nd prize.

Finishing off the evening, Carl Ventimiglia at the other lucky table won the \$100 when his name was called for the Every Member drawing. One truly amazing stretch of luck that this person and probably most in attendance has never seen before. Congratulations to all the winners.!

How Far is Too Far?

Leads and leader lengths are as important as the lure you are trolling. The next time your favorite lure is not producing, try a new lead. By shortening or lengthening your line on your downriggers, your presentation of that lure changes. As a rule, shortening a lure increases its action, whereas lengthening decreases your action. When running spoons, I like a short lead, 8 to 12 feet, from the ball. While running Dreamweaver Spin Doctors and Strong Flies, I prefer a longer lead, 20 to 40 feet. This produces a slower roll or spin. Here are some presentations that produce great action!

#### **Downriggers**

-Spoons: 8 to 20 feet lead. The smaller and lighter the spoon, the shorter the lead.

-Dreamweaver Spin Doctors: 20 to 30 feet lead off the ball

-Dreamweaver Paddles: 30 to 100 feet (30 to 50 feet on one or two outdowns, with a longer lead of 100 on the deepest downrigger)

#### **Copper and Lead**

-30 to 40 feet of 20lb or 30lb flouricarbon

#### **Dipsy Divers**

-8 to 10 feet. Remember that when running Dreamweaver Spin Doctors or Paddles that the lead increases due to your fly lead. I prefer the longer leaders on my divers. Due to the length of these leads, it is best to hand line the fish to the net.

#### **Fly Leaders**

- -8" Dreamweaver Spin Doctor: 22 to 25 inches to Strong Fly
- -10" Dreamweaver Spin Doctor: 30 to 32 inches to Strong Fly
- -12" Dreamweaver Paddle: 4.5 feet to 5 feet to Strong Fly



-Additionally, I like to run Strong Fly Meatless Teasers on my 10" Dreamweaver Spin Doctors and 12" Paddles. This presentation works best on wire dipsys and my deep riggers.

So, instead of changing that "go to lure", try changing your lead lengths. Being consistent on your leaders and lead lengths is a great way to put more fish in your boat!



## 2011 Pentwater Tournament July 9th

The next tournament coming up on our schedule is at Pentwater. Pentwater is a quaint tourist town with many shops and restaurants and a nice marina with an excellent fishing cleaning station. You can reserve a slip on the DNR website.

We've moved this one to July so the fishing should be excellent assuming the weather cooperates. This time of the year usually has some of the most stable weather so if you can find the fish while pre-fishing, they should be in the same areas all weekend. This port will provide us with the opportunity to get into some nice kings. Of course coho and steelhead are also abundant but kings are what'll put you at the top at the weigh-in.

Fishing this port is similar to Ludington, in that with points to both the north and south it warrants checking out the previous week's weather and surface temps. Water temps will dictate where the fish will be located. A north blow for several days prior will tend to push cold water around the Big Sable Point to the north and Little Sable Point to the south making the better fishing straight out. There's excellent structure north towards the Project and south to Little Sable Point. I've done very well the past two years fishing straight out.

There are trap nets in this area to the north so watch for the markers and stay clear. The best way to avoid them completely is to get their positions off of the Ludington Charter Boat Association website and load these positions into your GPS unit. Even with these precautions, keep some wire cutters handy. If you get hung up, your better off cutting your way loose rather than trying to save what's hung up.

The Skipper's meetings will be at 5:00 a.m. at the Municipal Marina. You can run out to your spot after the Captain's meeting but don't begin setting lines until 6:00 a.m. when the tournament start is announced on channel 72. Fish calls will be at 9:00 a.m. and noon. Pull lines at 2:00 and be at the weigh-in by 3:00 p.m. The weigh-in will be at the pavilion at the south end of the Municipal Marina.

dawned with some unexpected changes to that forecast. The rain was supposed to hold off till the afternoon and the tournament started with waves around 1' at 6:00am. The boats scattered in all directions hoping to find the hot spot. Leading the way at the 9:00am Fish Call were "Bad
