## Manistee I & II Tournaments

This year our last two club tournaments are in Manistee. The fishing this time of the year could be good or great! Check with the local bait shops, charters, or Tom Gorguze for update information. Manistee has no nets this year to hamper with your trolling (what is Vickies Secret going to do?). Fishing should be good on the shelf or right out in front of the piers. Spoons, cut bait, flasher-fly, or J plugs will work. As always, DAS captains that fish this port have lots of options on where to fish. Here's a quick run-down on fishing in Manistee.

There is plenty of good bottom structure in this area but the most popular area to target is the shelf. The shelf is a natural drop that runs from Pentwater to Frankfort. Straight out from the Manistee piers it's just a couple miles off shore to a drop that starts in 70 feet of water and continues to about 150 feet. Most boats will head straight out or south from the piers because the shelf in this area runs parallel to the shore line. You'll recognize this area by the long line of boats trolling north and south.

Out past the shelf there is a second dramatic drop between 280 and 500 feet. When surface temps and the thermal cline are both high, fish can be found out deep looking for a cool place to spend the day. Just because the water is deep doesn't mean the fish are. You can usually find a mix of Steelhead, Kings, and Trout in the upper water column far from shore.

Big Sable Point to the south usually holds fish and is popular with fisherman out of Ludington as well as those that make the 15 mile run from Manistee. The lighthouse at the point is frequently referred to as the 'stick' by local fishermen. Depending on wind direction and water temps, fish may be found either north or south of the stick.

North of the pier heads the drop starts a little further out. If you head northwest from the pier there are two areas where the bottom holds about 50'. After you clear the second flat you'll find the shelf. This area is referred to by the water tower on shore that resembles an 'onion'. Since most Manistee boats can only turn left heading out of the piers, this area doesn't get much pressure, but stay alert for occasional boats trolling east and west.

Onkama is only 11 miles north of Manistee. Between the two ports are a pair of large mounds on shore that sit either side of a low sand dune and resemble a 'saddle'. Just north of the Onkama pier in 60' of water is a depression that reaches 120' deep. After an east wind water temps on the Michigan coast rise and this hole which is known as the 'barrel' provides a cool place for big kings to hide.

If near shore temps are low you might want to try your luck out front of the piers. When the big lake is cold, batfish seek relief in the warm water run-off from Manistee Lake. The Big and Little Manistee rivers meet in Manistee Lake before

emptying into Lake Michigan. Staging fish ready to spawn pass through this area and fishing can be fast paced when spawning fish are on the move.

The overall catch numbers are down from recent years but the size is way up. This summer a number of Kings in the 25 to 30 pound class are being caught. In addition to the healthy fishery there have been a number of improvements around town that will make your visit more enjoyable. New bathrooms at the city marina opened this summer and the Harbor Masters offices also boast an improved lounge and laundry. The new building also includes a second floor common area that offers excellent views of the harbor. The city also improved the free city ramp on Manistee Lake and installed a handicapped accessible fishing pier. The fishing pier gets 'land locked' fisherman a little closer to the action as Kings and Steelhead stage in preparation for their run up the Big Manistee River.

The Manistee I tournament is Saturday, August 27. Port Captain is Bob Paradise (586-457-4073). Manistee II is Saturday, September 10. Port Captain is Tom Gorguze (248-544-0958).

For both tournaments; the Skippers meeting is at 5:00am at the Lions Pavilion at the west end of the County launch. You may set lines for the tournament start at 6:00am. There will be fish calls on Channel 72 at 9:00am and 12:00am. Lines must be pulled at 2:00pm. You must be in the weigh-in line by 3:30pm, again, at the Lions Pavilion. As usual, lunch will be served at the weigh-ins for both tournaments.

The Manistee I tournament is the last of three "333" contests. For \$20 entry fee for this tournament, you can pick out your 3 heaviest fish to enter. The fish must be chosen before being weighed on the Club scale. The 3 heaviest fish will win half of the pot collected for the Manistee event. If you paid to enter the previous (2) "333" contests at Grand Haven and Ludington II, you are also eligible to enter the Overall "333" where the (3) heaviest fish designated by you have a chance to win the remaining total pot from all (3) events. If you have not designated any fish from those previous (2) tournaments, then you will have to do so at this tournament. If you did not enter either of the previous "333" contests or only entered one of them, you can pay the difference at this event and still be eligible for the Overall "333". A total of \$60 paid will get you entered in the Overall. Any questions about the "333" contest call Tournament Co-Chairmen Bob Ksionzek at (586)-531-9198.

Let's have a good turnout for the last (2) boat trolling events of the season. Hope to see everyone there!

## Ludington II August 13, 2011
