

RIVER / Pier Time

The bad news is that the summer trolling season is over. The good news is that river and pier fishing is approaching one of the best times of the year.

River and pier fishing for salmon, browns and certainly steelhead is great fun and can be very productive. For those of you who had to give up towing the boat because of \$3 gasoline for towing or \$3.50 gasoline in the marina, here is your chance to get back those lost fishing days.

To begin with, you don't need a lot of equipment. You don't need a big boat. You can stand on the pier, stand in waders or just be a "bankie".

You don't need a lot of equipment. No downriggers. No "hootchie mama". No array of 12 rods bent over. In fact, you can modify the technique you use based upon the equipment you already own. Own bass gear or walleye gear? You may have to buy \$5 bucks worth of fresh line, but you could cast spinners or bottom bounce or soak an alewife off a pier. Buy a Luhr Jensen side planer and run a walleye hotn-tot through a hole in the river. Maybe now is the time to try fly fishing?

If you're not sure how to get started, come to a meeting and start talking to the boys. Or if you really want to learn fast go to a river tournament.

River fishing is fun. Get a bunch of guys together and vou'll experience the same camaraderie we all have come to love during boat trolling.

The fall is beautiful. The leaves are changing. The air is crisp. The rivers and piers can be lightly populated. And, the fish may be biting. Get out there.






Egg Loop Knot A knot that slides on the hook shank

Ande Monofilament



1. Pull about two inches of line through the hook eye and form a loop near the bend of the hook.



2. Holding the loop between a thumb and forefinger, bring the tag end of the line forward and make about five wraps around the hook, wrapping towards the eye.



3. Bring the tag end back through the loop and tighten the knot with tension on the line in both directions.



4. The final product is a knot that slides on the hook shank so that egg clusters and nylon varn can be secured between the knot and the eve of the hook.

Items used on the pier and surf:

Long noodle rods (10' to 14') Spinning Reel - Spooled with 6 to 10 lb. Line Waders (surf only) Leader material (smaller than your main line) **Snap Swivels** Size 10 to 14 hooks Pyramid sinkers Small beads Rod holders for surf (long 4 to 6 ft.) Rod holder for pier (12 to 18 inches) Folding Chair Warm Clothes, Gloves, Boots, Hat (rain gear)

Build Your Own Spinners

Fishing spinners is a popular and effective tactic for taking late fall and winter steelhead. Just ask Jim Bedford who annually takes more steelhead than most of us will catch in a lifetime. One of the keys of successful spinner fishing is being near the bottom and next to if not in river snags. And then, if you aren't occasionally hanging up (and losing spinners) you're not fishing right. Costly!

Building a spinner takes all of two minutes, and the only tool you need is a pair of needlenose pliers. You can buy kits that include a range of bodies, blades. and beads (cabelas.com) or order parts individually for more customization (800-638-2723; www.jannsnetcraft.com). A lot of tackle shops also stock parts. Check out Lakeside, Gander, BassPro or Jay's.



Winterizing Tip

When you are readying your boat for storage this year, pick up a box of scented fabric softener sheets from the local grocery store. Toss some in your storage compartments, the cabin, the bilge, etc. The strong scent of the sheets repels pests that like to chew up seats and wiring. I've been doing this for years, and come fall, the boat is critter-free and "Mountain Spring Fresh".

Legal Ramblings

The Michigan legislature is still considering raising all hunting and fishing fees. Word is that they intend a 25% increase each of the next four years. That on top of an already 50% increase in camping fees and an anticipated income or sales tax hike makes it hard to understand. Let your Senator and Rep. know what you think.

The Inland hunting and fishing rights of the Tribes is about to be resolved. A final Consent Decree has been prepared and will likely be announced shortly. The species most effected will be walleye, steelhead, salmon and deer. It won't make anyone happy, but could be much worse.
