August 29 MEETING

As always, the general meeting takes place at 7:30 P.M. at the St Pius K of C the hall at 6177 Chicago Rd. (east of Mound Rd., North of 13 Mile Rd.)- Warren.

2006 Grand Haven II

Grand Haven, the final stop for the 2006 Detroit Area Steelheaders tournament tour. This event takes place on September 9th and hopefully the weather will cooperate like it did last year. It's also one of the nicest and easiest ports to drive to from the Detroit area, I-96 all the way. Easy access on the Grand River and the Municipal Marina is just a short boat ride from the Harbor Island launch where you can also leave your boat trailer parked in a designated area, but be sure not to leave your trailer at the boat launch as it might well be removed.

Expect good fishing at this port as the Grand River meets Lake Michigan. Most of the guys work the stained water as the river empties into the lake, but later in the morning you'll want to look toward the deeper water. Keep in mind that the King Salmon will be returning to make their spawning trip up the Grand and that the river mouth could have plenty of boats fishing close to each other. Be sure to use caution and be respectful of the other people's property. Grand

Haven I, May, 2006, was won by Almost Paradise captained by Bob Paradise and he will tell you that the best spoons or plugs are ones that are green in color.

Woods and Waters bait and tackle shop; located on Harbor Ave. (616-842-0198) can fulfill most of your last minute requirements and is also a good source of fishing information. Check with the local charter captains, located just down the dock, as they are very helpful and offer great advice. Be prepared with your equipment as spoons, j-plugs, flies and cut bait offer your best chances for success and look for a good catch of kings, steelhead and an occasional coho.

Once again the tournament will be held on September 9th, 2006, starting with a Captain's meeting at 5 a.m. to discuss where might be a good place to start your fishing, sign in for captain's and crew members and assign inclement weather boats, those vessels equipped with radar. Don't forget to get into the big fish pool, as you never know sometimes it's the guy that only comes in with one fish that outweighs everything caught that day. After the day's fishing, at 2 p.m. you'll be asked to pull your lines, you can relax with the other club members and friends as you participate and watch the fish weigh-in to see how your boat placed in the tourney. Be sure to catch plenty of fish and work up a good appetite as lunch will be served.

For those folks that like to arrive early, Friday morning or early afternoon, there are plenty of things to see and do around the Grand Haven area. Shopping for the gals, the beach is still open for the kids, quite a few good restaurants and sightseeing top the list. Plan to stay over on Saturday night if possible

Frankfort **Tournament Results**

On July 22, 2006, the DAS held a tournament at Frankfort, MI. Great fishing and pleasant weekend weather generated a lot a smiling faces for the captains and crew.

Opportunities for pretournament fishing on Friday were scarce, with windy conditions and waves of 3-6 feet. The few boats that did venture out on Friday did very well, with Kings in the 10-20 lb range and 10-12 lb steelhead being caught.

The winds settled down overnight and waves of 1 ft or less greeted us for the start of the tournament on Saturday morning. The first two hours of fishing were very productive for boats that were in the right area, straight out from the harbor and north to the lighthouse in depths of 100 - 200 ft. Boats that went south to the Herring Hole had a difficult time finding fish. At the 9 a.m. fish-call, Bad Dog and Sloppy Joe were in the lead with 6 fish, with No Liimit and Thor's Hammer close behind with 4 fish.

After 8 a.m. the bite slowed down but captains still managed to add fish to the cooler. At the noon fish-call the leading boats were Bad Dog with 10 fish, Sloppy Joe had 8. and Thor's Hammer and No Limit had 6.

Captains reported that everything was working: regular and mag spoons, J-plugs, and meat. Each boat had their own color preferences, with favorites such as Green Dolphin, Yellow Tail, Blueberry Muffin, and glow Orange Skeleton getting bites.
