Port Austin Tournament June 4th, 2005 Team Doubles

It's that time again for the Detroit Area Steelheaders to visit the most successful port on the Great Lakes. Lake trout should be the main catch of the day with a few kings mixed

in. Last year we even had a catch of Brown trout weighed in.

Lakers should be taken on a variety of lures, with White Dodgers and spin-n-glo's, presented a foot or two off bottom. The best spoons like Wal-mart, glow screwballs, M,J'S and Dolphins, fished deep or for suspended fish. I would expect we will have some heavy coolers at weigh-in. Good areas to fish: the "CAN" located N.W. of the lighthouse. And the area 3 miles N.E. of the light on the reef in 60-100 ft of water.


A word to the wise **DO NOT GO BETWEEN THE LIGHT HOUSE AND SHORE!** Many boats have been damaged by this shallow reef. Remember stay west and North with your travels.

Skippers meeting will be at 5:00 a.m. Located by the Restrooms. Tournament starts at 6:00 a.m. Fish calls at 9:00 a.m. and at noon. Pull lines by 2:00 p.m. You must be at the weigh-in by 3:00 p.m. at the park west of the restrooms.

Team Doubles will be picked after weigh-in for Sunday. (1st boat paired with last, 2nd with next to last, etc.) Be sure to let me know if you will be staying. This is a great way to learn from others.

Trailer Lights

Probably the number one complaint among DAS towers is the amount of time and effort it takes to keep trailers in shape. We demand a lot of a trailer. We often tow 250 miles each way and at least part of the trip is in the dark. That means for safety sake and to avoid tickets, we need working lights. And lights are the number one problem with trailers. We've all spent way too many hours lying on our backs trying to find the loose wire or replacing the burned out bulb just before a long haul. Replacing the bulb is a lot cheaper than the damage to your boat when someone doesn't see that you are standing on the brakes.

Now there is finally help on the way. LED lights are showing up on commercial trucks and trailers for a very good reason – durability. These lights work.

They last longer, they are totally waterproof and they use less electricity. For regular light bulbs you can expect about 3000 hours max., of service. (If you're lucky) LED's are rated for 100,000 hours.

Fortunately, replacement kits are now available for retro-fitting boat trailers. Yes, they are more expensive than cheap, regular lights. A set will probably run \$50 to \$80. But, that is the price for peace of mind and rock solid durability. Places like Boat US, West Marine, Mikes Marine, etc., all carry replacement LED based lights. The swap is generally straight forward and shouldn't take more than an hour or two. You don't have to, but, consider replacing the entire wire harness for even better results. Cut a deal with your buddy to help do each of your trailers. Make this a must have upgrade to your trailer this spring and you'll never regret it.

Rainbows for Sanilac & Lexington

I read on www.michigan-sportsman.com a thread from a young guy named Jason(not me)who sent a letter to James P. Baker, Fisheries Unit Manager for Southern Lake Huron after hearing there would be no steelhead plants in Lexington/Sanilac this year, and Mr. Baker, in very short order, managed to locate some extra fish and had them planted last week. I personally saw the fish in the harbor last week. I sent a quick note to Mr. Baker just saying "thank you". Here is the response I got. Just thought I'd share it...

Thanks for your note, Jason.

Just so you have the whole story, here's what transpired. Our Lansing people who match the stocking requests with the hatchery inventories got finished with that task and found that they had some extra Eagle Lake domestic rainbow trout in the inventories that were over and above the stocking requests for 2005. In other words, we had a temporary surplus. They sent out a note asking if anybody had a "home" for these extra fish. I have been hearing from pier anglers at Lexington that they were catching a fair number of these domestic rainbows in the late fall, after we closed down our creel census for the year. (We had discontinued stocking the domestics after 2001, as they showed very poor returns during the April - October period when our creel census was operating.) One of these guys sent me a bunch of digital photos of rainbows that he and his buddies caught, and they clearly showed the left pectoral fin-clips that identified these fish as Eagle Lakes. I used this information to justify getting 15,000 Eagle Lakes for Lexington and 15,000 for Port Sanilac, and was successful in doing that.

I need to stress that I can't guarantee that I can get these fish again next year (though I am looking into it.). Salmonid stocking levels in the Great Lakes are capped by international agreements between the states, Ontario, and the tribes. Any variance from established stocking levels must receive approval from the Lake Huron Committee of the Great Lakes Fishery Commission. Given the state of the forage base in

Lake Huron at this time, I don't know whether they'll approve any long-term increases in stocking of any species in the near future. (I might add that I had some explaining to do after proposing this plant for 2005.) In any case, we got the fish for this year, and I will probably propose re-establishing this plant at those two ports only to bolster near-shore opportunities in the late fall.

Well, as Paul Harvey says, "that's the rest of the story". Thanks again for your interest.
