July Meeting

The July regular member meeting will take place on July 26. The featured speaker will be former DAS President and current Charter Captain, Dave Even.

Dave will give the membership an overview of current fishing conditions and techniques for Ludington. With the two Ludington tournaments in August, this will be a fact filled presentation you won't want to miss.

As always, the general meeting takes place at 7:30 P.M. in the hall at 6177 Chicago Rd. (east of Mound Rd., North of 13 Mile Rd.)-Warren,

June 25 Frankfort Tournament

Results:

Several boats had arrived at Frankfort before Saturday's tournament, hoping to pre-fish on Friday and locate good fishing spots. But, nature did not cooperate. The winds were blowing hard from the SW all day Friday and six-foot waves kept the boats at the docks. The winds finally calmed down around 7 PM allowing a few boats to go out

in fishable 3-4 foot waves, just in time for thunderstorms that rolled though area and shut down the evening excursion. Captains that had the opportunity to fish earlier in the week had reported fair results, with a lot of small Kings and some steelhead in the mix.

On Saturday morning we awoke to find calm winds and clear skies. There were sixteen boats registered at the 5 AM captains meeting. On Lake Michigan the water was calm, the breezes were gentle, and the temperature was very comfortable (unlike the 90+ heat wave that was blasting Detroit that day).

In spite of the beautiful weather, the fishing proved to be difficult for most teams. By the 9 AM fish call "Outta Line" was having an outstanding morning, reporting in with seven fish. "Bad Dog" and "Bobby's Toy" both had four fish, and the rest of the fleet had two or less. A lot of small Kings were being returned to the lake (look for an improved King harvest in two more years).

At the noon fish call, "Outta Line" reported nine fish, and "Bad Dog" was close behind with six. Here are the official results from the 3 PM weigh-in:

Bob Feisle – Vicki's Seacret

Manistee Tourny Aug. 27th

Out 8th tournament this year will be held at the port of Manistee. This is a favorite port of many of our Captain's as evidenced by the excellent turnout every year. Maybe it's the variety of fish available or the chance to get that trophy of a lifetime. This port routinely produces master angler entries and this is the perfect time of year to catch that one for the wall. Remember the "Monster Coho", caught here a few years back. With over a million fish planted here annually, there's plenty to go around for everyone. August fishing in Manistee brings mostly large kings and with Cohoes and steelhead mixed in. Two years

ago saw some of the largest catches of any of our club tournaments in a lot of years.

Depending on the weather conditions, one of the favorite areas to work is the shelf or ledge that's about two to three miles out and runs south all the way to Big Sable Point and north to Frankfort. Often, fish can be found off of this shelf in 70 – 300 feet of water. Some of the landmarks in this direction are Gurney Creek and Three Bears. With the recent change to a 20 mile radius from the harbor, you can fish off of Big Sable point along with the boats out of Ludington. Sometimes the big kings will be staging off of the river mouth or just north off the Green Onion in as shallow as thirty to forty feet of water. If finding the big kings becomes tuff, you can always find steelhead and three year old kings straight out in deeper water. A north-south troll usually is best early in the morning and often an east-west troll works best later in the day.

Make sure you have plenty of cable on your downriggers because the fish may be very deep. Use heavy duty terminal tackle. Last year, I bent three swivels on large kings, and snapped off two wire dipsies. Green seems to be the color of choice. Spindoctors (white with green flies) work well, hoochies, j-plugs, and cut bait also works well this time of year.

The Skipper's meeting will be at 5:00 a.m. Saturday morning at the K of C Pavilion just west of the DNR ramp, with a 6:00 a.m. tournament start. Remember we no longer do shotgun starts. You can run out to your spot after the Captain's meeting but don't begin setting lines until 6:00 a.m. when the tournament start is announced on channel 72. Fish calls will be at 9:00 a.m. and noon. Pull lines at 2:00 and be at the weigh-in by 3:30 p.m. The weigh-in will also be at the K of C Pavilion. Pop and hot dogs will be available during the weigh-in ceremonies.

Good luck to everyone and see you there.

2005 Ludington Tournaments August 6th & August 13th

The next two tournaments coming up on our schedule will be back to back at Ludington. The first one is our annual **Ladies Day Tournament** and will be held on **August 6th**. For this tournament, the guys can set lines and net the fish but only the ladies can fight the fish. Once again we will have a Pig Roast as well as each crew bringing a dish to pass during the weigh-in ceremonies. This port has been a favorite of the ladies the past few years because of the opportunity to get into some nice kings. Of course coho and steelhead are also abundant in the area but kings are what'll get you in the top ten in the standings. The following weekend we'll go back to our regular tournament format. There will be hot dogs and pop at the weigh-in.


This port, more than probably any other, warrants checking out the previous week's weather and surface temps. Water temps will dictate where the fish will be located. A north blow for several days prior will tend to push cold water around Sable Point to the north and make the better fishing toward the south. Under normal conditions, most boats will be working the drop off that runs from about 8 miles straight out northeast towards Sable Point. The closer you get to Sable Point the more boats you'll find so it'll be difficult to run lead core. Sometimes the fish will be in close to shore off the Bathhouse or even right in front of the pier heads. (Continued on page 5)

The Project just south of the pier heads has also traditionally been an area that holds fish.


There are many trap nets in this area so watch for the markers and stay clear. The best way to avoid them completely is to get their positions off of the Ludington Charter Boat Association website and load these positions into your GPS unit. Even with these precautions, we became tangled in one just north of The Point last year and lost several cannon balls along with other equipment.

Keep wire cutter handy.

The Skipper's meetings will be at 5:00 a.m. both Saturdays at the Municipal Marina. The tournament starts will be at 6:00 a.m. Remember we no longer do shotgun starts. You can run out to your spot after the Captain's meeting but don't begin setting lines until 6:00 a.m. when the tournament start is announced on channel 72. Fish calls will be at 9:00 a.m. and noon for both weekends. For the Ladies Day Tournament we'll pull lines at 1:00 p.m., and you must be in the weigh-in line at 2:30. For the regular tournament the following week pull lines at 2:00 and be at the weigh-in by 3:30 p.m. The weigh-in for both weeks will be at Peter Copeyan Park which is just off Washington Street a few miles south of town.
