### Tackle Raffle Report

A starter river pack consist of spawn cure, netting and floats, hooks, line, swivels, pyramid sinkers, casting spoons and hot n tots plugs.

For boat safety items we have had first aid kits, flares, fire extinguishers, dock lines, spotlights and boat winterizing kits.
