For Your Information . . .

DON'T MISS LADIES DAY AT HARRISVILLE ON JUNE 23

Remembering last year's cool and breezy weather at this event, Port Captain Dave Roehr has requested for warm and sunny conditions with calm seas for us to enjoy in 2001. Harrisville, about 18 miles north of Oscoda off U.S. 23, offered a friendly, very helpful marina staff in 2000, so we're all eager to return this year.

The key question is whether the fish will show up in good numbers to help the ladies show the men how it's really done. In this tourney, the men are allowed only to set lines, steer the boat, and work the net, once the fish realize the futility of fighting our determined ladies! The ladies do the hard stuff, such as manning the rods when the reels start to scream.

The Skippers meeting will be at the marina office at 5:00 a.m., with boats leaving the pier heads at 6:00 o'clock. Fish Calls will be at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on VHF Channel 72. We'll pull lines at 1:00 p.m., and if you're fighting a fish when the call to pull lines comes, you must inform the Port Captain or Tournament Director. All skippers weighing in fish must be in line by 3:00 p.m.

As for the fishing, many Skippers will head north toward the mouth of the Black River and on to South Point at the outer reaches of Thunder Bay. Last year, a few had luck straight out from the harbor, while others headed south toward Oscoda. Harrisville offers a nice variety of fish, so check with area bait shops and charter Captains for fishing information. Be aware there may be commercial trap nets in the area, as Gauthier (?) Fisheries is due to move its operation from Rogers City to Harrisville as part of the new tribal fishing agreement.

As is the Ladies Day tradition, there will be a Pot Luck picnic after the weigh-in. This has long been one of our favorite events of the year as we anxiously anticipate the delicious goodies on the menu, so please bring your favorite dish to share. Remember to store potato salads and other perishable items in a separate cooler until the time of the picnic. We sure wouldn't want anyone to turn green, now, would we?

There are a number of fine places to stay, eat and shop. And don't forget, it's just a short

drive back to Oscoda for the annual "Art on the Beach" event. If you enjoy arts and crafts shows, bring your checkbook because this is one of the best shows of its kind in the state. ERIEAU TO HOST SPECIAL STEELHEADER OUTING

The Detroit Area Steelheaders are again having a special outing at Erieau, Ontario, on July 14, to fish for giant 6- to 10-pound Walleye and Steelhead. For those who haven't tried this fabulous fishery, this is a good opportunity to go with club members who know the ropes there and can help you out. While not an official "Skipper of the Year" tournament, we will have an informal competition, and lots of fun. A good route to Erieau is to enter Canada at the Ambassador Bridge, pick up Highway 3 and connect to Highway 401. Take Highway 401 to Highway 40 at Chatham and go east to Highway 3. Follow Highway 3 to Highway 10, turn left and proceed into Erieau. Be sure that you and your crew members each have valid Canadian fishing licenses. There are a number of bait shops in the area. Erieau is a quaint fishing town and has a few shops and restaurants to choose from.

FRANKFORT TOURNAMENT FIRST SINCE 1994

The Detroit Area Steelheaders fleet will return to Frankfort the weekend of July 28. This is a beautiful area with fabulous fishing, and Frankfort is a charming town with shops and restaurants within walking distance of the marina. For a fantastic view of Lake Michigan and the town of Frankfort below, take a trip up the hill in nearby Elberta. Follow the road along the south side of Betsie Lake, and watch for the entrance on the left (all you'll see is a road with a steep grade, that's it!). It's well worth your time!! The Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore park is within easy driving

distance on M-22. There are private campgrounds in the area (Benzonia), and motels and bed and breakfast accommodations.

At that time of year, Frankfort should provide good action for Chinook, Steelhead, Coho, and even a few Brown Trout. Keep an ear tuned to the marine radio for reports on what's catching fish. Typical summer tactics of downrigger fishing, Dipsy Divers, lead core, and possibly dodger squid/fly combinations may work. Action may be great in 100 feet, or 600 feet, or anywhere in between. Advance scouting and local information should help. The tournament will start at 6:00 a.m., with Fish Calls at 10:00 a.m. and noon, lines pulled at 2:00 p.m. and in the weigh-in line by 3:00 p.m. Be sure to attend the 5:00 a.m. Skippers meeting for any late changes. STEELHEADER PHOTO CONTEST RETURNS FOR 2001












