"Blue Star" wins Ludington tourney

The 1997 Detroit Area Steelheaders tournament at the port of Ludington was a resounding success. The weather co-operated and the fish showed up, providing a great weekend! In total, 29 boats made the tow to the Lake Michigan port, leaving the pier heads right on schedule at 6:00 a.m.

The big question was whether the best fishing would be would be north at The Point, south near The Project, or straight out to "Steelhead Land." Early in tournament week, fishing had been excellent at The Point, but the water turned over on Thursday, to make Friday fishing tough.

The first Fish Call revealed that most boats had caught fish, and several were doing really well, led by "Aquarius" with five in the box. There were also reports of big fish, exceeding the 20-pound mark. The big news was that there were fish at The Point, where most of the club fleet had headed.

The noon Fish Call found most boats re-

porting that fishing had slowed down quite a bit. Most boats had added a couple of fish to the cooler, with "Aquarius" and "Blue Star" tallying eight, "Returner" at seven, "Kare Free" with six, and "Lil' Scratch" at five. These five boats were going to have a shoot-out!

At the weigh-in, it was good to see lots of quality Kings hitting the scales. Over the past few years, Lakers and Steelhead had come to dominate the catch at too many tournaments. The three big Kings in the Big Fish Pool all went over 20 pounds. That's fishing fun!

At the final tally, Stan Bilek's "Blue Star" crew took first place honors with an impressive catch of Kings, while second place went to the "Returner" crew. Congratulations to all! Also, thanks to Bob Gilbert and Dave Even, who helped me at the tournament, and to Tournament Director Chris Nytko, who made sure we were all organized.

The 8:01 a.m. Fish Call (compromise) showed that the northern boats were into fish, mostly Lakers 50'-55' down, and a few at 20'-25' down on free sliders. Green was definitely the preferred color the fish were looking for.

By the 10:01 a.m. Fish Call, I think all boats were reporting fish in the box. About 11 o'clock, the wind began to pick up, but not enough to bring forth severe waves.

BOAT/SKIDDED

The tournament was called at 12:00 noon sharp(!) – according to my official watch – and all boats returned to port. The weigh-in featured a lot of 3'-5' Lake Trout, but no 'hawg' Lakers such as we saw at Port Austin. There were a respectable number of King Salmon. The biggest went 14 pounds-plus, weighed in by "Oh Father" (but not in the Big Fish Pool). Oops!

"Capt'n Hook II" brought a 10-pound, 4ounce Brown Trout to the scale. Way to go, Mary (but Doug forgot to get into the Big Fish Pool)! Dope!! "Kare Free" and "Blue Star" ended up tied for first in the Big Fish Pool. Complete standings are listed below.

Following the weigh-in, the eating festivities began. Yours truly and Ray (V.P.) Banbury manned the grilles to cook up 'burgers for all. The vast array of goodies and eats were set out, and for a short time it looked like a meeting of the Vikings!

MANISTEE TOURNAMENT IS SET FOR AUGUST 23

Our last tournament of the year on Lake Michigan will be held at Michigan's Victorian port city of Manistee, on August 23. Here are a few tips for fishing Manistee:

- Try fishing in 70'-120' of water from the Green Onion (water tower) north of the piers to Big Sable Point south of the piers seems to be the best area.
- Best lures are the Dolphin green and blue, orange and crush ice, black and raspberry, and root beer (Stinger). Since it's late in the season, do not forget to try your Dodger and Squid combos, and J-Plugs.

For more information on how to adjust your Dodger, and how to use the 1-pound ball, ask "Mary K's" captain.






