Claims DNR going against its word

"The Department of Natural Resources has gone back on its word," said Frank Krist, regional representative to the lake Huron Fisheries Task Force. "During a meeting at Higgins Lake, John Shrouder informed us that they are preparing a proposal to issue a trap net permit to a tribal netter from Cheyboygan," said Krist. "They lied to us and have dealt us the worst blow since the gill nets first appeared off Presque Ilse Country!"

Krist said that the proposal will allow for the taking of sport fish by the tribal netter, a direct contradiction to document statements by the DNR that sport fish would never be a part of the catch by tribal netters.

Under the proposal, the tribal trap netter would be allowed to keep all walleye, all perch, five percent of all lake trout caught, and any whitefish over 17 inches in length. Krist added, "This will be a tremendous blow to a blossoming walleye fishery in the area. The proposal allows that the DNR does not have the ability to handle the resource. This is not the tribal's fault, but the DNR's! I don't know how we can trust the DNR any further."

The proposal will also allow for a minimum of eight trap nets to be set between 40-Mile Point and Hammond Bay Harbor of Refuge. Furthermore, the proposal would allow for dual licensing of the tribal trap netter, another direct contradiction of earlier DNR testimony to the opposite. Krist stated that the DNR's response was that they had to look ahead to the end of the agreement (the 1985 Consent Order), but he said that they are giving everything away before the agreement ends. "It appears that there won't be anything to negotiate with in the year 2000 - it will have all been away well before then," he added.

Krist confronted Shrouder and Fisheries Director John Robertson of the Higgins Lake meeting and said, "We showed that we are willing to word with the commercial fishermen, in the area and now you lie to us. Krist explained that the DNR has assured him that any discussion would include area representatives, and nothing like this would ever be allowed to happen. "We lied to! There is no nice way to put it,"

WEATHER DAMPENS WILSON TOURNAMENT

Ole Mother nature done another job on us at Wilson, N.Y. over the weekend of May 18th - 19th. We went over to the port with high expectations of putting some nice fish in the boxes, but it just wasn't to be. We all awoke to some real winds Saturday morning, so my crew and I went out of the pier heads around 5:45AM to check out the conditions before I would announce any go for the tournament. What we found was 5-6 ft waves pounding the break-walls so we put a hour delay to start time, then another, and then another, till finally I just canceled it for Saturday and decided the best place to be was by the keg of beer with a hot dog in each hand, scheduling Sunday as the make up day. Well after the festivities were over, we were able to put a few hours of daylight out in the water, and were able to put a few fish in the box but nothing overpowering. So by now, we're all geared for Sunday morning countdown and what a beautiful morning it was. Flat water and a great sunrise. The only problem was that due to the front that passed through we had a tremendous turnover of the water. It went from 55 degrees to 46 degrees in one day. Well, as you can guess this didn't exactly excite the fish. When I announced first fish call at 8:30 we had 25 total fish for the 21 boats on the water, with only 6 drawing a blank. By the 10:30 fish call we had doubled that with a total of 50 fish with Lil "Scratch" in the lead with (7) and Bob Ksionzek and crew on the Last Dime right on my heels with (6), followed by Teacher's Pet . Trena Dawn, and Anticipation with (5), (5). and (4), respectively. By 12:00 noon it was time to announce to pull lines and head for the scales. Surprisingly enough we weighed in a good amount of fish. A total catch of 27 Kings , 13 Coho, 12 Lake trout and 11 Steelhead, totaling 63 fish was put on the scales, enabling Rob Pinskey and his crew on Anticipation to lock onto first place with total 79.02, Last Dime II. a real Close 2nd with a total of 78.15 followed by Teacher's Pet with

71.31 for 3rd place. Congratulations to you and your crew, Rob! So the overall fishing was somewhat disappointing, but still not all that bad considering what ole mother done to us. Well, maybe we'll make up for it in August, at Olcott. Lets all keep our fingers crossed, so until then, good luck in your catching and we'll be seeing you around the docks.

Dave Even and gang wasn't far behind with a great catch of (6) lakers, weighing a total of 87.11 for a lock on 2nd, and trusty Trena Dawn with Don Redmond at the helm to tie down 3rd place with also a nice catch of (6) lakers that weighed in at 71.03

It was one of those days that you had to troll with the winds, and then pick and run while taking a pounding in order to get in some decent fishing. There's no doubt it was tough fishing with (9) out of the (30) boats drawing a blank. Last year only 4 out of 35 were shut out. The catch was down considerably also. 
