MANISTEE 1991 IS SUPER!!

Finally, finally we got a good weekend of weather that was super and finally we got a weekend of fishing that was super.

The Detroit Area Steelheaders headed to Manistee July 20 for our sixth stop on the 1991 tournament trail with at least some apprehension based on weather and fishing results so far this year. For the early birds, Friday morning gave us a little scare with 4-7 foot waves that sent boats back to shore. However, quite a few fish were caught and by Friday evening the winds had calmed down and the forecast for the balance of the weekend was good.

As our fleet of 26 boats left the harbor, most boats headed for the shelf beginning at the 70 foot depth, 3-4 miles off shore. Radio chatter was light until the 9 am fish call when all but one boat reported having fish, with a total of 96 fish being reported.

The spirit of sportsmanship and camaraderie then emerged as the skippers began sharing all kinds of good information and soon there were 10-12 boats in a tight circle at the "hot" waypoint. By the noon fish call 155 fish had been boated and there was little doubt that there was going to be an exciting weigh-in.

The most productive lures all day were spoons--all colors from silver/red to lime green/greento black/purple--fished 20' to 30' back over 45' to 90'. The weigh-in was a fantastic display of big fish, number and variety of fish. For

example, consider the following: *The top ten boats all weighed in 8 fish.

- *Many boats had 10-15 fish
- *All boats weighed in fish
- *In 1989 we weighed 44 fish; 1990 78 fish and 1991 152 fish
- *Over 200 fish were caught in total

Hopefully, this is an indication of the state of our fishery in Lake Michigan and is a beginning of a resurgence of the fish population.

When the final results were posted, it was only fitting that Don Redmond was announced as the winner. His unselfishness in sharing of information made this a special first "First Place" for Trena Dawn. Congratulations Don!

We had a team doubles tournament on Sunday with 9 teams weighing fish. Although fishing was off slightly, a lot of fish were still weighed in. The winning team was Lil Scratch and Lucky Falcon. Congratulations guys! Elsewhere, in this newsletter, you will find the results and totals for both days.

Thanks to all that helped make this a most successful outing including Mike and Cindy Wakulski and Bob Herman at the grills, Don Redmond and Bob Mitchell at the weigh-ins, Les Jump for the photography and Dick Shirk for his overall tournament responsibility. Coho City, if you would because coho has been the predominant prize catch of this tournament. Out of 64 fish caught in 1990, 47 of them were coho. All of our ports so far this year have seen an increase in our catch, so hopefully Frankfort will follow suit and do the same.

As far as honey holes are concerned, you can take your pick. Lucky Falcon and crew won the tournament last year and never left the shadows of the pier heads. Don Anton and crew on Happy Bear took 2nd place and went South to the Herring Hole. Little Big John went North to Betsie Point and caught enough to secure 3rd place. If that doesn't confuse you I don't know what will!

I would say that the top bait will be a dodger with a squid or fly trailing behind. Dodger colors could be either chrome or chartreuse/lime. Start running your baits down 40-60 feet and then start making your adjustments accordingly.

We are again going to be battling the Benzie area chapter boys for bragging rights and the keg of beer, so what do you say gang? Don't let me down and lets be at our very best come Sept. 7 and show the people up there that we do know how to catch fish.

Good luck and drive carefully, and we'll be seeing you at the docks.

FUN & RESEARCH TRIP SCHEDULED FOR OLCOTT, N.Y. AUGUST 24 ab's 2nd annual research trip to out to the sides. MANISTEE TEAM DOUBLES

The Club's 2nd annual research trip to Olcott New York is on tap for August 24th. Eleven boats made the trip last year and received quite an experience in some fine catching. There were a couple of 30 pounders landed along with numerous ones in the 25-28 pound range. Although we had to run 10-15 miles off shore to get to them, it was still worth the trip. This year, they might just be in close like they were in 1989; no more than 1 or 2 miles off shore.

Baits should be both magnum spoons and regular size Northern Kings, Diamond Kings and Silver Streaks. Colors should be black and raspberry combos and green with silver combos. Don't hesitate to put down a dodger and squid on drop weight lines and of course, good ole reliable dipsey divers

Tackle stores are usually open late at night and early in the morning to get licenses. You skippers may want to enter your crew and yourself in the ESLO derby for some big prize money

I'm sure that you have the information packages that I handed out so refer to that for anything you need to know. Call for any other questions at 777-8900 between 8 & 5:00. Check those wheel bearings, drive carefully and we'll be seeing you at the docks.


