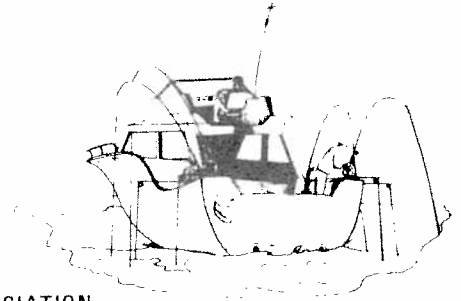

Fishing was fair, with most hooking at least one fish. The best results came from the Dam down to Boy Scout Hole, with the high banks being most productive.

I fished out of the "Rusty Hook" with Skipper John Tymensky and fellow crew member Brian Glaser. We took two out of the four fish hooked, a very satisfying first drift boat trip for me.

Following the weigh-in, results were tabulated and announced during a presentation ceremony held at Desi's. The winning individual team was made up of John Wesley (who took the largest fish of the day), Mark Clifford and Dave "N" (no last name supplied). Boat Trolling Update

High winds prevailed throughout most of the weekend of the Port Sanilac Chapter Outing, and the resulting rough seas severely hampered the fishing activity.

Fishing all during Saturday was spotty at best. There were a few good catches, but most people did rather poorly.

Sunday, three boats weighed in fifteen fish, fourteen Kings and one Lake Trout, averaging 5.3 pounds per fish. The total weight was eighty pounds, and the largest single fish was an eleven pound King.

Best fishing was found in thirty to forty feet of water, fishing down thirteen to twenty-four feet. The best lures seemed to be the J-11 jointed Rapalas in all colors, Loco Spoons, Lucky Lures, Fireplugs and Northport Nailers.

Fishing should improve as the winds and waters stabilize, and the Port Sanilac area should offer a good fishery for several more weeks.

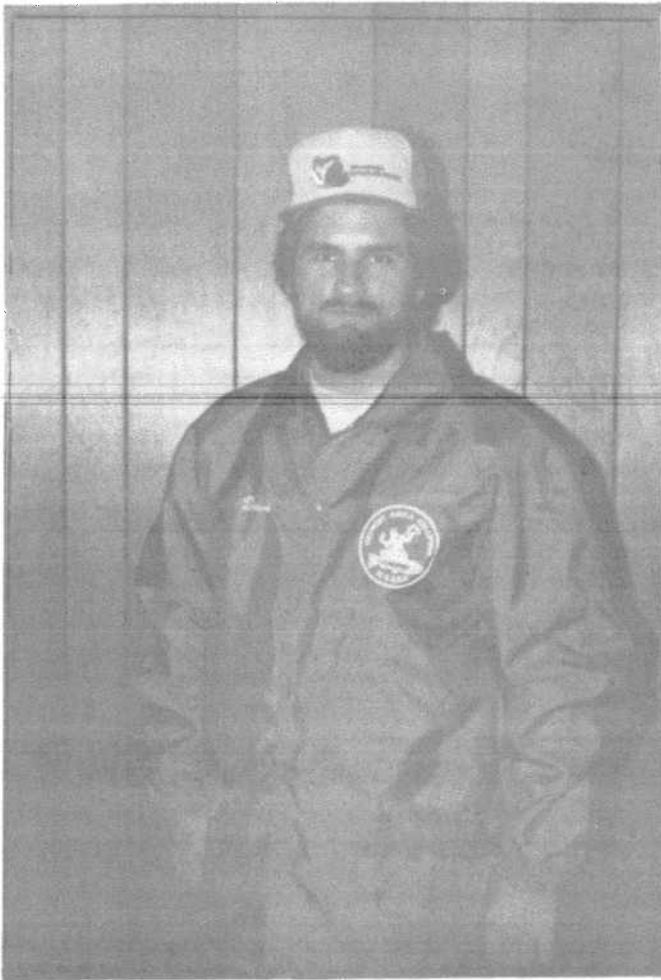


DNR HOTLINE

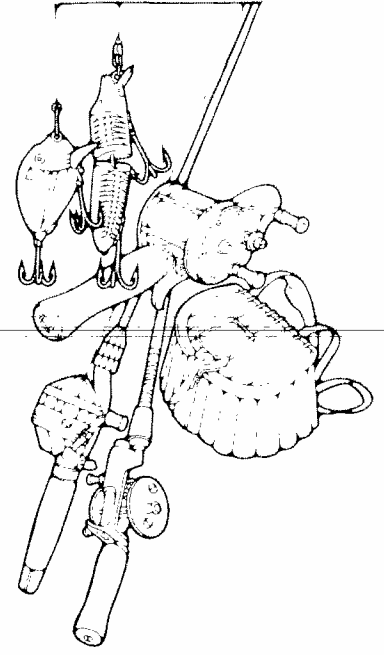

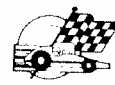

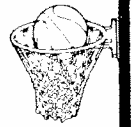

Benton Harbor opens boat tourney season

Participants in the Benton Harbor tournament awoke to near-freezing temperatures, and by the 7:00 a.m. starting time, the air temperature was still only about 34°.

Seventeen boats headed out into what turned out to be fairly calm water. The wave height was only about one to two feet, and wave conditions remained about the same all day. The sun finally came out and we warmed up somewhat, but, all in all, the fishing was not affected. J-Plugs, Locos, and an assortment of other lures seemed to be the hot baits.


Nine of the seventeen boats weighed in their eight fish limits, and the rest of the fleet had at least three or four on Saturday. The total for the first day weigh-in was 99 fish, with 77 of that total being Kings. The Saturday leader was Bob Kring and "The Drifter," with "Gray Ghost" and Gary Gray, and Toby Lampi's "Jessie III" still in the running, as Sunday's action would show.

Bob Kanas, skipper of the "Least Likely," thought he had the \$70 top prize from the 50/50 Jackpot all wrapped up when his crew landed a 22 pound, 5 ounce King during Saturday's action. However, those hopes were dashed by the crew of "The Nooner." Mike Curzenski's team landed a 22 pound, 9 ounce salmon on Sunday to claim the Jackpot! Sorry Bob, Ed, Brian, Scott. I guess some guys just don't have any luck.

Sunday morning was a little warmer, and also a little bit windier. A wind com-

Of the 17 boats which showed up for the first Chapter tournament of the year, all caught at least a few fish, and everyone had a good time. We will hope for a bigger turnout and more competition for the upcoming tournaments. Thanks to all who participated, and I hope to see you at South Haven.

Experienced sportfishermen often make strange discoveries while cleaning their catches! They find that the fish have gobbled all kinds of manmade objects that have fallen into the water. Key rings, false teeth, bottle tops, paper and plastic objects are just a few.

Many things that boaters casually toss overboard can be lethal to fish. Especially items which resemble familiar foods: filter tips from cigarettes can look tempting like grubs; crumpled bits of foil from candy wrappers become attention-getting reflectors of light as they flutter down through the

water; wads of chewing gum look like fish eggs or other morsels.

Often a hungry fish will swallow any such item tossed overboard. As most of these objects are indigestible, they can harm or even kill a fish.

Also, as part of the sportfishing scene, it's a fact that litter from unconcerned boaters often helps to ruin the fishing grounds.

As the above examples so clearly show, littering by some pleasure boaters does happen, and it has all kinds of consequences. Be a boater who cares.
