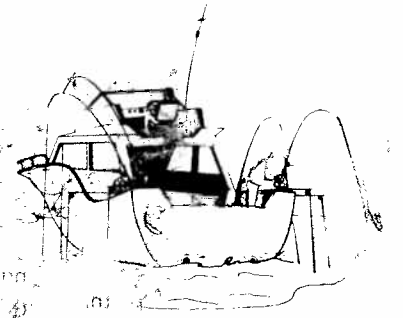

Membership News

The size of the Detroit Area Chapter declined again in 1981. Though discouraging to us old-timers this trend is not surprising and it could have been worse had it not been for Dennis Holoway and his crew working the shows, clinics and meetings. That and frequent mailings of renewal notices have kept us at about 500 members most of the year. However, our current members helped hold the line by recruiting and signing new people every month. For each new member resulting from the efforts of this committee or recruited by the State, Chapter members have signed up TWO new members! Despite all the good work, though, we still have fewer members than a year ago.

In addition to the obvious losses resulting from "back door" chapters drawing from us now and before, we have here in Michigan outrageous unemployment, a direct contributory factor in our fluctuating numbers for the past seven years. Joblessness in 1975-76, 1978 and now has been the barometer to signal this committee that renewals will decline drastically.

In 1982 we'll work even harder to stop the decline and with all the shows, clinics and special events, perhaps we can reverse the trend. Our Annual Meeting in December is usually very well attended and renewal business is quite brisk. To encourage this we have a bonus offer: everyone signing up that night will receive a free Chapter patch. Our patch is the Swiss-embroidered, 7-color, 5" circle that's the envy of the entire MSSFA. In addition to that, each renewal kit will have a free ticket for the Super Tackle Raffle that night. Even if your membership runs to March, it might be wise to renew because we automatically extend your present expiration date. Experienced sportfishermen often make strange discoveries while cleaning their catches! They find that the fish have gobbled all kinds of manmade objects that have fallen into the water. Key rings, false teeth, bottle tops, paper and plastic objects are just a few.

Many things that boaters casually toss overboard can be lethal to fish. Especially items which resemble familiar foods: filter tips from cigarettes can look tempting like grubs; crumpled bits of foil from candy wrappers become attention-getting reflectors of light as they flutter down through the

water; wads of chewing gum look like fish eggs or other morsels.

Often a hungry fish will swallow any such item tossed overboard. As most of these objects are indigestible, they can harm or even kill a fish.

Also, as part of the sportfishing scene, it's a fact that litter from unconcerned boaters often helps to ruin the fishing grounds.

As the above examples so clearly show, littering by some pleasure boaters does happen, and it has all kinds of consequences. Be a boater who cares.

Why I fish for Steelhead

The tightening arc of the line on a downstream drift. The sudden jolt of electricity in your arm, transmitted instantly to your brain.

The sudden self-same action of yelling "Fish On!" and setting the hook. The silver flash and surge of power on the end of the rod.

Yes, this is Steelheading, but I don't believe for a minute that this is all there is to fishing.

After a few years of Steelheading, you advance to a much higher plateau. I have developed a deep respect for what I consider the greatest game fish in the world.

Showing a friend a new fishing hole and seeing him land not only his first steelhead, but having him win a tourney — ah! That's satisfaction!

And, lest I forget, the MSSFA—the greatest fishing organization in the world—which gave me the opportunity to develop myself, the vehicle to teach my methods, and the chance to meet so many great people. Yep, that's why I fish for steelhead.

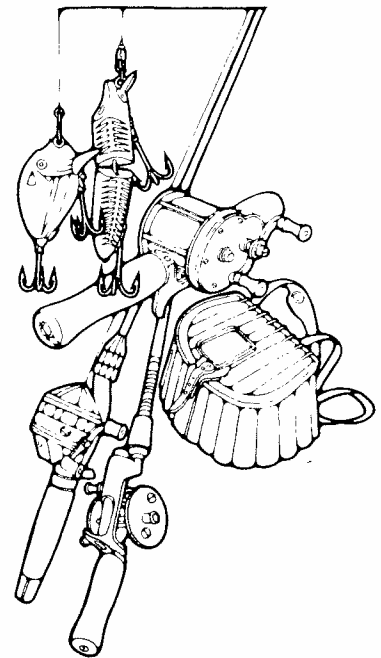
DNR HOTLINE

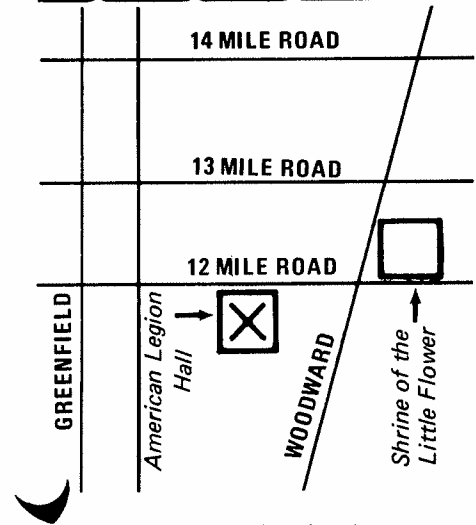
