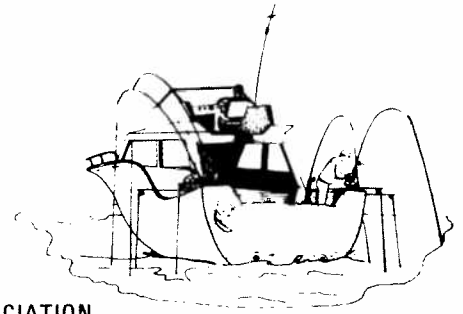

I'll say in all honesty that we need your help and support. So please do your best at selling a membership. 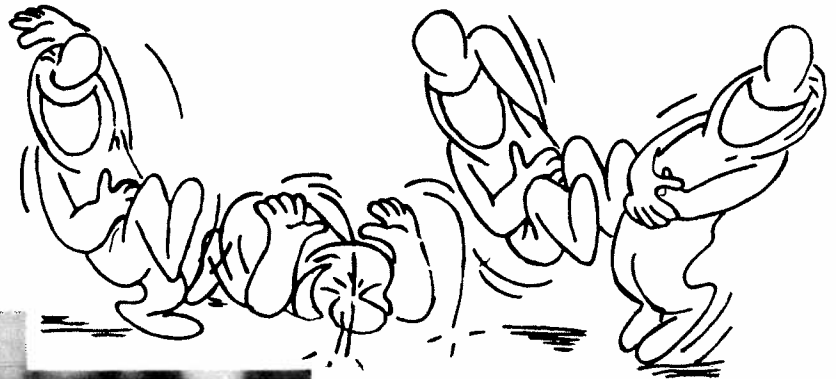

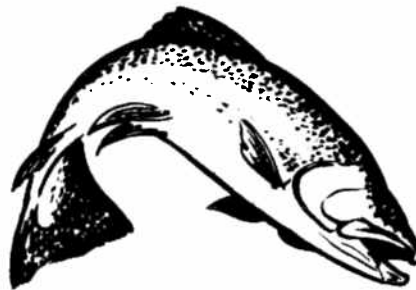
It seems as if our fishery has always operated under the dark cloud of commercial gill netting. Since the Steelheaders were organized in 1966, we have fought the gill netters. Now they have returned and with the possibility of unrestricted gill netting this summer by Indian Commercial Fishermen, we are facing perhaps the gravest threat to our fishery since we began some 15 years ago.

We are currently fighting this battle at every level of government. But at these levels, the battle must be carried forward by only a few individuals. Often our members ask, "What can I do?". In the past we have asked for financial support and you have responded magnificently. But today we need more than just money. With a long hot summer of gill netting in front of us we need public support for our cause more than ever before. You can directly aid the organization in this battle by enlisting

new members. Numbers mean strength and we will need all of the strength we can muster in the long dark days ahead.

All of us have friends, relatives and acquaintances who fish on the Great Lakes but who are not members. Each of these has a great stake in the future struggle. We are hoping that each of us can sign up at least one new member during this summer. I know this will be difficult for those who feel a little leery of asking their friends for something like this. But the future of our fishery and of theirs is at stake today and we must make this extra effort and so must they.

To aid in this effort we are beginning a concentrated membership campaign. This campaign will be co-ordinated through your chapter.



THE GILL NET SLAUGHTER!

In 1968 the Board of Directors of the Michigan Steelheaders resolved that the gill net should be banned totally from all waters of the State of Michigan. There have been other challenges to our fishing resource that have been overcome, but the gill net battle rages on.



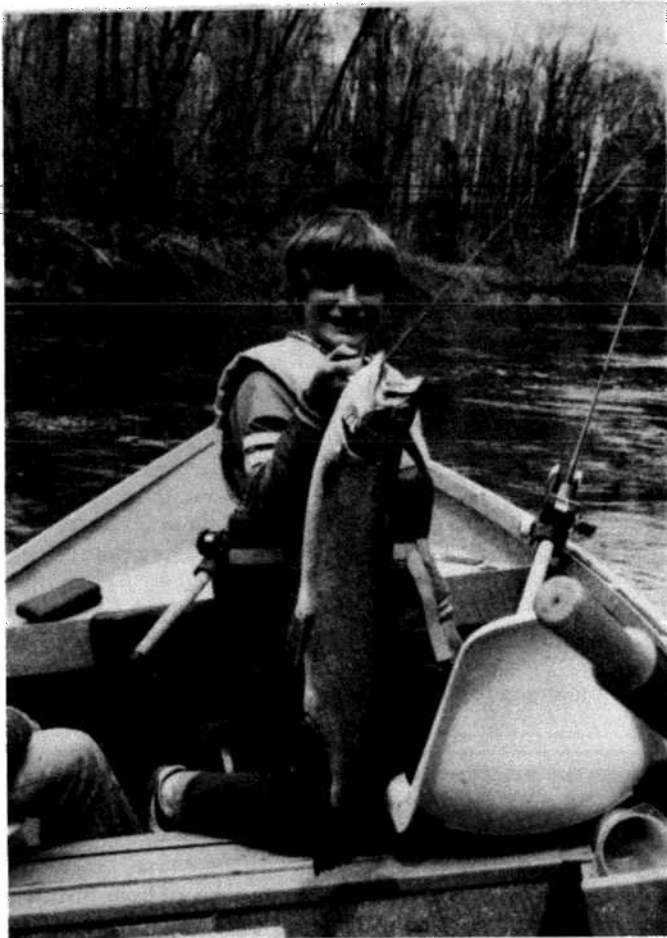

1978 RESEARCH TRIP YIELDS CONTINUING BENEFITS

"Least Likely Fishing Team" scores well at Pt. Sanilac

Back in May of 1978, Jim Boyer led the first Detroit Chapter Research Trip to Port Sanilac. This was the first time anyone had tried to catch trout and salmon out of this port.

The fleet of twenty-eight boats turned in 520 pounds of fish, including 53 Kings, 4 Browns and 1 Lake Trout.

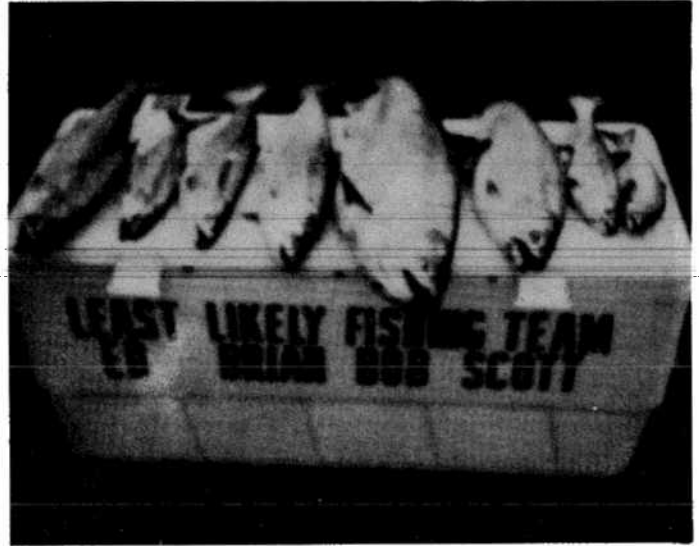
I was fortunate enough to land the largest fish of the day, a 19½ pound King, my first King ever boat trolling.

Last year, Steve Hamilton took 8 boats out on April 28, results — 22 Kings, 5 Coho, 2 Lakers and 1 Brown Trout. So this spring, one-half of the "Least Likely Fishing Team" went back. (The other half of the team was repairing his van.) Brian Glaser and I started setting lines at 6:00 Saturday morning and by 4:00 that afternoon results were: 8 fish caught out of 13 fish on, including 2 Kings that broke 10# test line. The catch consisted of 7 Kings and 1 Coho, ranging from 2 pounds up to 15½ pounds.

We were fishing north of the pier heads about 2 or 3 miles out, in about 20 to 30 feet of water. Hot baits for the day were orange and gold jointed Rapalas (J-11), and blue and silver jointed Rebels. Orange worked best when it was cloudy and blue and silver when the sun came out. We fished the baits 10 feet down and 60-100 pulls behind the ball.

Sunday's fishing was slower than on Saturday. The fish seemed to be scattered but we still put 4 nice Kings in the box, weighing from 6 to 8 pounds each.

The fishermen in the area are very friendly, and I feel this port is very underfished by boat trollers. A lot of good fishing is being passed by for such a short trip from Detroit.



About the only tackle store in the area is Schommer's Sport Shop. The guys are up to date on where and on what bait to use. Phone number is 1-622-9936, so give them a call.
