
On March 30th the Metro West and Detroit Area Steelheaders have our annual get together for a Spring Steelhead Challenge! As in years in past, things will pretty much be the same. Folks have the freedom to fish where they please; on the pier, beach, or river. Boats fishing below the Insta-launch railroad bridge are not eligible.

You can start fishing as early as 6:00AM, and we will come together for the weigh-in at 5:00PM. The weigh in location will be Traks Bar and Grill, located at 5073 High Bridge Road, in Brethren. PLEASE DO NOT BE LATE – You be disqualified after 5PM!

A simple tally of total weight between the two clubs will determine the 2019 Spring Steelhead Challenge winning club. Steelhead/Rainbows are the only eligible species with a minimum size of 15" to be considered for weigh-in.

Big Fish: For those that wish to participate, we will have a \$5 big fish pot with 100% payout to the largest Steelhead by weight - regardless of



It's just about a month until our St. Clair River walleye outing and fish fry on April 27th. Last year's outing was great. AUSABLE RIVER STEELHEAD OUTING Oscoda, MI Saturday, April 13, 2019

The Detroit Area Steelheaders will be fishing the Ausable River in April. The Ausable is In the Lake Huron watershed and is recognized as a prolific Steelhead fishery. While the river originates in the middle of the state, Steelhead are found in the lower river, below the Foote Dam. It's 11 miles from the dam to where the river flows into Lake Huron at Oscoda. This section of river receives significant plants. Gary Gross is organizing this event. **Call Gary at 586-291-1290 before April 5, 2019 to enter into the outing.** He needs to know how many people are participating to order the food.

Chef's Table

Sweet and Spicy Honey Sriracha Salmon

This is an easy recipe. It's the perfect combination of sweet and spicy. You can either bake or pan fry the salmon. Sweetness from the honey is paired with spicy Sriracha in this recipe. You can make it a meal adding rice and veggies.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 salmon filets, skin on
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 3 tablespoons low sodium soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 2 tablespoons sriracha
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1/2 tablespoon olive oil, for pan fry method

INSTRUCTIONS

In a large ziplock bag add together the garlic, soy sauce, honey, sriracha and water. Close the bag, and shake it to combine the ingredients.

Add the salmon pieces and place in the refrigerator. Let sit for an hour.

Take the salmon out of the marinade and discard the marinade.

Cook the salmon following either of the methods below.

Serve immediately with a sprinkle of green onions and sesame seeds for garnish.

To Pan Fry: Add olive oil to a large skillet. When the pan is hot, add in salmon skin side down. Cook for about 4-5 minutes on each side. The salmon should start to turn opaque. Take off of the heat. When the salmon is cool enough to handle peel off the skin.

To Bake: Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Spray a baking pan with cooking spray or layer with parchment paper. Place in the oven and cook for about 15 minutes or until the salmon is cooked through. Make sure not to overcook the salmon. When the salmon is cool enough to handle peel off the skin.

New Boating and Fishing Laws to Prevent the Spread of Invasive Species

Michigan's Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act has been amended with changes for boaters and anglers that take effect March 21, 2019. The changes are intended to strengthen protection for Michigan waterways against the introduction and spread of aquatic invasive species.

What boaters need to know: Prior to the amendment, the law only required that a person not place watercraft or trailers in the waters of Michigan if an aquatic plant is attached. In addition to this requirement, the new changes require all of the following prior to transporting any watercraft over land:

Removing all drain plugs from bilges, ballast tanks, and live wells. Draining all water from any live wells and bilges.

Ensuring that the watercraft, trailer, and any conveyance used to transport the watercraft or trailer are free of aquatic organisms, including plants.

This means that after trailering boats, and before getting on the road, boaters must pull plugs, drain water and remove plants and debris.

Violation of the law is a state civil infraction and violators may be subject to fines up to \$100.

What anglers need to know: For anglers, these amendments codify the Michigan DNR's Fisheries Order 245 regarding the release of baitfish, collection and use of baitfish and cut bait, and release of captured fish, specifically:

A person shall not release baitfish in any waters of this state. A person who collects fish shall not use the fish as bait or cut bait except in the inland lake, stream, or Great Lake where the fish was caught, or in a connecting waterway of the inland lake, stream, or Great Lake where the fish was caught if the fish could freely move between the original location of capture and the location of release.

A person, who catches fish other than baitfish in a lake, stream, Great Lake, or connecting waterway shall only release the fish in the lake, stream, or Great Lake where the fish was caught, or in a connecting waterway of the lake, stream, or Great Lake where the fish was caught if the fish could freely move between the original location of capture and the location of release.

Whether purchased or collected, unused baitfish should be disposed of on land or in the trash – never in the water. Any baitfish an angler collects may be used only in the waters where it was originally collected.

Anglers who are catching and releasing fish should only release the fish back into the same water or in a connecting body of water the fish could have reached on its own.

Violation of the law is a state civil infraction and violators may be subject to fines up to \$100.
