Great Lakes Fishery Commission unveils project to combat invasive species

DETROIT, MI – The Great Lakes Fishery Commission has unveiled plans at its annual meeting for a \$22 million FishPass project in Michigan that seeks to better combat invasive species by sorting them out from native fish. FishPass, which will be located on the Boardman River in Traverse City, Michigan, is a project aimed at solving one of the world's most difficult fishery management challenges: how to pass fish around barriers and dams while still blocking harmful species like sea lampreys.

FishPass is the capstone of a 20-year whole-river restoration project on the Boardman River. Jim McKane, the Commission's chair, explained: "Tens of thousands of dams fragment habitat throughout the Great Lakes basin. This fragmentation is not always conducive to fishery restoration or management. That said, those dams also block invasive sea lampreys, each one of which will destroy 40 pounds of Great Lakes fish. The Great Lakes Fishery Commission believes technology can be developed to have it both ways: to automatically sort a mixed assemblage of fish so that desirable species can pass an obstruction and destructive species like sea lampreys can be stopped."

FishPass will be constructed on the Boardman River in downtown Traverse City at the location of the existing, but deteriorating, Union Street Dam. It will consist of a sea lamprey barrier just upstream of the to-be-removed dam, a channel downstream of the sea lamprey barrier to test fish-sorting techniques and technologies, and a natural river channel for recreation and normal river flow. The location also will be an improved city park so that visitors can observe the "living laboratory" that FishPass will provide. Many of the FishPass Partners were on-hand for the unveiling. In addition to members of the Great Lakes Fishery Commission, officials present included Jim Carruthers, mayor of Traverse City; Mark Wilson, a councilor for the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians; Marty Coburn, city manager of Traverse City; Gary Whelan, program manager for the Michigan DNR; Frank Dituri, director of public services for Traverse City; Carl Platz, Great Lakes program manager for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; and Brett Fessel, a biologist with the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians.



"The final design for FishPass reflects the project's engineering requirements, the agencies' fishery management goals, and the community's desires," said Doug Stang, the Commission's vicechair. "The Commission and its partners have held scores of public meetings and workshops over the past few years to ensure the project is sound and is a welcomed addition to Traverse City. The design that was unveiled demonstrates we have hit

the mark—a project where form meets function and has the potential to change the way fisheries are managed, both in the Great Lakes basin and worldwide." The Army Corps of Engineers, in collaboration with the firm AECOM, developed the FishPass design with input from the partners and the community. Construction of FishPass should begin in early 2020. Louie Blaze was second with 11.90 lbs., Paul Gjeldum was third with 11.54lbs, and Chris Nytko fourth with 11.26 lbs., and Mark Paradise rounded out the top five finishes with 11.23 lbs..

The biggest fish was won by Luke Paradise who brought a 3.71 lb. whopper to the scale. We also had a payout fo the smallest legal walleye. That prize went to Dan Chisholm with a .60 lb fish. Everyone had fun trying for the smallest fish, as well as the big fish.

Angler of the year Outing July 6, 2019

Please join us at the Sebewaing Harbor Marina Walleye only outing. **Captains Meeting** 5:30 am.

Drop lines at 6:00 am.

Weigh-in by 1:00 pm with shore lunch to follow. **Outing registration**: \$5.00 per person (shore lunch).

Big fish pool \$5.00 (voluntary).

As of this writing the marina is having some electrical work done that is affecting the power throughout the marina. Therefore, the location of the Captains meeting, weigh-in, and shore lunch will be determined the day of the outing. This is a beautiful marina with lots of parking and space for a weigh-in and shore lunch so I believe a pavilion will be available. Launch fee is \$7 to \$10. The marina has 80 boat slips. If you want to reserve a slip there should be one available (\$20 per night). Sebewaing has several motels/hotels/campgrounds if you wish to make it a weekend or overnight it should not be a problem but reserve early.

Competition Rules

All State of Michigan DNR rules apply. Walleye only All DAS Angler of the Year rules apply. Angler of the Year rules are availa-

ble on the DAS website.

This is an individual angler event. Not a per boat event. Be prepared to separate each fish according to the angler who caught each fish.

The individual angler will select the fish within his/her catch to be entered in the weigh-in and entered for the big fish pool.

Total weight of four Walleye selected by the angler will determine each anglers result. In the event of a tie in total weight of the four fish selected, the winner will be determined by the weight of the heaviest fish in the four fish selection. If that's still a tie the length of the heaviest fish will determine the anglers overall result.

No culling will be allowed. Culling will result in a disqualification. Big Fish Pool: Big fish will be determined by weight of the biggest fish. Ties will be decided by length. Winner takes all of the big fish pool. I will be providing a shore lunch so I need to know how many people to expect. Boat captains please let me know how many people will be at the outing (fishing or observing) so I can provide for everyone.


