Take a Free Weir Tour During Fall Egg Take

If you've ever wondered how the DNR gets the eggs it uses for fish production or wanted to see big Great Lakes fish up close and personal, think about catching a tour of one of the northern Michigan weirs.

The Boardman River Weir in downtown Traverse City, the Little Manistee River Weir in Manistee County and the Upper Platte River Weir in Benzie County will be open for free tours to the public and school groups from mid-September through the end of October.

This is the perfect time to see these weirs . structures that block fish from passing upstream . in action, because all three will be used to aid fall fish collection. The DNR will be collecting surplus chinook and coho salmon at the Boardman River Weir. Chinook salmon harvested at the Manistee River Weir support the DNRs work to collect fertilized eggs for this key fish species. Additionally, the weir at Platte River State Fish Hatchery helps staff collect coho salmon in order to extract fertilized eggs for continued production in the hatchery system.



During the tours, students and visitors will learn about salmon biology, how weirs and fish ladders work, invasive species, state fish hatcheries and the impact of egg-collection efforts on Michigans fisheries. The programs tie in components of history, ecology, biology and stewardship.

Tours will begin Friday at the Boardman River Weir, Oct. 2 at the Little Manistee River Weir and Oct. 16 at the Platte River State Fish Hatchery. Group tours are available by appointment. Schedule a group tour now.

Worldwide Records for Salmon Fishing

Did you catch a monster salmon the other day? Did you think it might be a record catch? With the below information yough now know if youghe broken the IGFA (International Game and Fish Association) all-tackle worldwide record for

- Hendrik Henriksen caught an Atlantic salmon (salmo salar) in the Tana River in Norway on January 1st, 1928 that weighed 35.89 kg (79 lbs. 2 oz.)
- Les Anderson caught a Chinook salmon (oncorhynchus tshawytscha) in the Kenai River in Alaska, USA on May 17th, 1985 that weighed 44.11 kg (97 lbs. 4 oz.)
- Todd Johansson caught a Chum salmon (oncorhynchus keta) in Edye Pass, BC in Canada on July 11th, 1995 that weighed 15.87 kg (35 lbs. 0 oz.)
- Jerry Lifton caught a Coho salmon (oncorhynchus kisutch) in the Salmon River in New York, USA on September 27th, 1989 that weighed 15.08 (33 lbs. 4 oz.)
- Alexander Minerich caught a Pink salmon (oncorhynchus gorbuscha) in Washington, USA on September 30th, 2001 that weighed 6.74 kg (14 lbs. 13 oz.)
- Stan Roach caught a Sockeye salmon (oncorhynchus nerka) in the Kenai River, Alaska USA on August 9th, 1987 that weighed 6.88 (15 lbs. 3 oz.)

DON MIKROS Newsletter Printer Late afternoon on Thursday August 1st, after making offers to several people to come along with no takers, Jamie and I motored down towards Bass Lake north of Pentwater to hopefully redeem our previous four empty box trips and a cancelled attempt the night before due to a bad battery bank. We set down to fish and immediately the autopilot started having issues and would not hold course. The lake was nice enough so we set lines and dealt with it. Our streak of fails quickly ended when Jamie brought in a 26lb and a 28lb king in the first couple hours. We kept on trolling and just after dark while Jamie was bringing in fish number 5, a smaller lake trout, the Powerpro Diver with a Moonshine RV Blue Hulk back 115' took off. I grabbed it and let it run. Jamie got her laker to the



boat, and I foolishly put my fish in the rod holder while I netted for her. Once her fish was in the boat, she took over on the dipsey rod. We had one line in, one fish on, and 4 lines left in the water. I pulled the two long lines while Jamie was fighting the fish so we could maneuver a little better. I am a fan of keeping the big fish behind the boat at all costs, and working with whoever is fighting the fish to speed up or slow down to control fish



or let the person fighting get some line. We fought with the fish for probably 40 minutes til she got it close. I knew when I saw it in the underwater lighting that it was a beast, so netting, my heart was pounding. I scooped it up and when I dumped it out of the bag onto the boat floor, I knew immediately it was the biggest fish I or we had ever caught. I put it on my 30lb boga grip on the boat, and it buried the scale. I called Scott from Capt. Chucks and told him I had a fish that was dwarfing the 28lbr that I had in the boat already. He came up to the store at 11:15 at night, and when we put it on the scale, it came in at 35.56lbs. Bested my personal best by over 5lbs. My goal for the summer was to get one 30lbr, so this was a fish of a lifetime.

As you can imagine, all of a sudden, everybody wanted to go fishing. After several successful trips and lots of 20lb+ fish since our trophy, early afternoon on Sunday, Aug 11th, we headed up to Big Sable Point, out to 400fow where we had caught 9 fish the night before. We had some out of town friends who had to drive back across the state, so we said we were only fishing til 6pm. We had three nice steel-head in the boat, and were 9 minutes from pulling lines, when a 7 color goes off. Canyon grabbed the rod and the fish was 800+' from the boat before we knew it. I had slowed to boat down, but there was no moving this fish while in gear. We started pulling other lines, as we were past our cut-off time anyway. I worked the boat in and out of gear until we got the board off, but even then, the fish wouldn't budge. Finally after 45 minutes, lots of in and out of gear, and a few circles, we boated his 30.13lb king.

We definitely didn't catch the most silver fish we ever have this summer, but definitely caught the biggest. We had 9 full -limit laker trips in a row before the kings got here, and 11 guests landed the biggest fish they've ever caught on the boat. We had several skunks as well, but you have to suck it up thru the bad to really appreciate the great.
