On Saturday December 14th, thirty members showed up and were treated to some of the best pier fishing you could ask for. The conditions were perfect, light winds, ideal temps, and Lakers on the feed. When we finished at 2:00PM, over 48 Lake Trout (and four bonus Walleye) made it to the scales, with the largest trout weighing 16.5 lbs.

This event was also the showdown for first place in our Angler of the Year competition. Gaspare Aragona had a 1 point lead going into this event with Bob Paradise hot on his tail. These guys are two of the most competitive fishermen I know. Gaspare knew Bob needed a 3rd place to tie for first or better. Bob held true to form and had a nice three fish limit in no time, while Gasper struggled to catch his first fish until 1:00 PM. When it was time to pull lines, two trout was all he could get. At the weigh-in tensions were high with some nice catches coming over the scale. Bob was nervous and didn't realize he needed at least a third place finish to win.



In the end, Mark Wyrick had three monsters totaling 31.85 lbs to win the event, great job Mark. Second place went to Steve Prout with three fish weighing 29.69 lbs. See where this is going! Third place went to Gary Gross with his 26.75 lbs catch. Fourth went to Bob Paradise with a 26.50 lbs catch. All he needed was an additional quarter pound to tie Gasper but fell just short. What great times we have fishing with out Detroit Steelheader buddies. Congratulations to Al Jimerson for winning the \$150 big fish pool, and Gaspare on his 2019 AOTY championship.

Cold As Ice Outing at Metro Daysail

Detroit Area Steelheaders Angler of the Year Event at Lake St. Clair Metro Park January 25, 2020 7:00 am till 1:00 pm 31300 Metro Parkway, Harrison Twp. 48045

This will be the first Angler of the Year outing for 2020. It coincides with the 94.7 "WCSX Cold as Ice" tournament You can participate in both if you wish, but ours is a totally separate event. The winning catch will be determined by the weight of your five heaviest perch. The outing fee will be \$5 for the shore lunch, with an optional \$5 for the big fish pool. The big fish prize money will be awarded for the single largest perch by weight. Dan Chisholm is coordinating our DAS event. You must register with Dan in person, or by phone before you go out. We will be heading out from the Metro Park Day Sail Ramp at 7:00 AM. It is doubtful the ice will support machines, so we will most likely be walking. Shore lunch and weigh in will be at, or near the same ramp. DAS has rented a table in the WCSX heated tent, and we'll be staffing a membership table during their event. I hope we can do both weigh in and lunch right there. A sign-up sheet to work our membership table will be available at our membership meetings. Metro Park entrance fees will apply. If you plan to fish the WCSX tournament you should google 94.7 WCSX Cold as Ice Tournament and register with them as their event totally separate. Theirs runs until 3 pm so we should be able to complete our weigh in and lunch before theirs ends. DAS Angler of the Year rules can be found on the DAS message board. Please reach out to Dan if ice conditions look iffy.

WHY BE A DETROIT AREA STEELHEADER?

- The Detroit Steelheaders mission is to "protect and promote the Great Lakes sport fishery". We support our Michigan waterways and assist those governing bodies who are charged with the responsibility of sustaining them.
- We are a teaching club. Some of our members are very experienced and talented fishermen. We share that knowledge with other members to help them become better fishermen.
- Membership is inexpensive! Twelve free monthly educational membership meetings where speakers address boating safety, boat maintenance, howto seminars on all types of fishing. Great Lakes forecast on the condition of the Great Lakes for the coming year. Our members have ample time during meetings to network with friends and just enjoy comradery. We also hold voluntary 50:50 raffle and tackle raffle where you can go home with a nice door prize. Monthly newsletter is included in the cost of membership.
- We support parochial and public education by funding and mentoring "Salmon in the Classroom" activities in four separate schools.
- We support continuing education by providing a renewable scholarship to Lake Superior State College for students enrolled in ecological programs.

- As part of a club you meet like-minded people who fish. This can lead to
 friendships and more opportunities to be on the water. We also have a
 "Crews Board" program where boat captains can request crew and others
 can ask for the opportunity to crew for someone.

Each year our Detroit Area Steelheaders organization hosts a group of "Special Friends" for a day of fun and fishing. This is a social outing where our Steelheaders donate our time and talent entertaining people with special needs as our guests having fun fishing and picnicking on Lake Erie out of Toledo Beach Marina. They donate the use of the marina each year and provide free launch, boat slips, ice and other items to help make this event a success.

2019 Skipper of the Year Trolling Season Recap



2019 will be remembered as the year with big, healthy Kings, but there wasn't very many of them. The low number of Kings is believed to be due to the reduced stocking in recent years, coinciding with a year that had poor natural reproduction.

The few Kings that were out there had an adequate supply of alewife to eat so they got big, fat, and happy! The season started on May 4 at St. Joe. Favorable fishing reports had everyone looking forward to a weekend of great fishing. Bob Jones (Bobby's Toy) and his crew did some pre-tournament fishing on Friday and came in with a very nice

catch of 5 big kings, 3 lakers, and a coho. But Friday's fishing success was not repeated on Saturday for the tournament. All 7 DAS boats struggled to find fish. At the 9:00 am Fish Call, Tom Gorguze (Bad Dog) was the only boat to report having fish, and they had just one! Things improved a bit during the day, and at the


weigh-in six of the seven boats had fish. Brett Mauk (Fish the F On) won the tournament with his 5-fish catch that included a 19.4 lb King and 13.1 lb Lake Trout, both of which won the Big Fish prizes. Lake Trout (14) dominated the overall catch for the day as the salmon (5) were hard to find. The 4 Kings that were caught were all very healthy fish weighing over 15 lbs.



Grand Haven was the location of our scheduled 2-day tournament on May 18-19. At the Saturday weigh-in Bob Feisel (Vicki's Seacret) was in first place with a score of 71 points and a substantial lead of 34 points ahead of Hardtop & Tails in 2nd place. On Sunday morning the weather forecast indicated a big storm heading our way and we all agreed to cancel fishing for the day, securing the win for Vicki's Seacret. Overall a total of 6 nice Kings averaging 16.9 lbs were caught on Saturday. Dan Chisholm (Channing) won the big salmon prize with his

20.4 lb King, and Vicki's Seacret had the biggest Lake Trout, weighing 13.85 lbs.
On June 22 we went to Harbor Beach. This port is known for its Lake Trout fishery and this year was no different. Brad Walton ("Moonshot") took first place with his 5 lake trout, plus 1 King and 1 Steelhead which were the only silver fished weighed in that day. Paul Gjeldum (Blue Horizon) had the biggest fish, a 15. 45 lb Lake Trout.

Our next tournament was July 13 at Ludington. This port typically has a very good salmon red Chartier ("Lake Buzzard") won the tournament with 1 King and 4 Lakers for a total score of





King which was the biggest fish, and Bob Jones (Bobby's Toy) had the biggest Lake Trout, weighing 13.85 lbs. Two weeks later we were at Manistee for the tournament on July 27. And the results were very similar to Ludington. Fred Chartier (Lake Buzzard) won first place again, and the lake trout catch outnumbered the salmon 20 to 7! Bobby's Toy had the biggest salmon at 24.0 lbs, and Lake Buzzard had the biggest laker at 14.7 lbs.

Our August 10 tournament was on Lake Ontario at Olcott, NY. Bad weather and the long drive kept most boats at home, but 3 dedicated captains and crews did make the trip. Strong winds and big waves eliminated the chance for pre-tournament fishing on Friday. The bad weather persisted on Saturday, forcing a one-day delay of the tournament. On

Sunday the lake settled down enough to allow the tournament to proceed. Only 4 fish were brought to the weigh-in on Sunday, but they were all Kings with average weight of 14.7 lbs. Bobby's Toy won first place, and also had an 18.85 lb King that won the Big Fish prize.

Our final tournament was at Rogers City on August 24. Brad Walton (Moonshot) scored another 1st place win. The Lake Trout outnumbered the Kings again, 15 to 3. Brad's 18.1 lb King was the biggest fish of the day. SKIPPER OF THE YEAR FINAL STANDINGS:

In the spring of 2019, our five schools released 654 Smolt Salmon in the Clinton River near Yates Cider Mill and 111Smolts in the Huron River at Flat Rock. That amounted to an 84% survival from egg to Smolt, which is pretty good. We are extremely pleased with each school's result and the work they put into the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Salmon in the Classroom (SIC) program. We also wish to thank Dreamweaver Lure Co. for the lure blanks and tape supplies they provided to help make our release day successful. Lastly, we thank the DAS membership, those assisting thru the school year, and those that helped to make our releases successful.

During the last school year, the students have learned the life cycle of the Salmon, what they eat and what eats them. They have touched upon the ecology of the Great Lakes, the land and rivers of Michigan, and a little of how to preserve it.

This school year in November our existing school partners, Kennedy Middle, Oakland Christian Schools, Pine Knob Elementary, and Divine Child High received a total of 669 eggs. As our fifth partner this year, we want to welcome our new school, Independence Elementary of Clarkston. Their two supporting teachers, Dennis Klenow (3rd grade) and Jessica Sorensen (4th grade) received their eggs on Nov.13 and the next morning the whole school learned what 193 Salmon eggs look like. The eggs started hatching' just before Thanksgiving vacation. At this stage, the 'Alevin' are about 1 inch long with a very large orange belly, the yolk sack. The yolk sack contains protein, sugar, minerals, and vitamins. At some point, before New Year, their mouths open and they start breathing through their gills.



Before this, they absorbed oxygen through the orange membrane.

From eggs, to Alevin, to Fry, after 5 to 10 weeks, the yolk-sac will have reduced inside the fish with the skin zipping together over the opening. The young Fry will then move in schools, look like little minnows, and are actively eating. From now till about the second week of May,

called Parr, they will grow to 3-3/4 to 4-1/2 inches. They will develop spots and vertical parr marks on their sides. These markings will help camouflage them from predators. The next growth stage, the dark finger markings on their sides start to fade and are replaced by a silvery sheen and a dark wide line down their back, as they become 'Smolts'. Just as the school year concludes, we will enlist the assistance of our members



to help the students in releasing the Parr/Smolts to the Clinton or Huron Rivers.

In cooperation with the Lake Superior State University Foundation, the DAS Board of Directors has established the "Detroit Area Steelheaders Fisheries Scholarship". The scholarship provides financial assistance to a student majoring in the LSSU Biology, or Fisheries and Wildlife Management program, with a focus on fisheries. It is a \$1500 annual award. This years recipient is Molly Wozniak from Pinconning, Michigan. Molly is a Junior studying Fisheries and Wildlife Management. After graduation she hopes to have a career doing community outreach and researching invasive species.

LSSU students may submit a letter of application to the Chair of Biological Sciences. This award does not automatically renew, however past recipients may apply. Successful candidates; must be a full time student of at least Sophomore status, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and be a resident of the state of Michigan. Members of the biological sciences faculty will recommend a recipient from the applicants for final approval by the
