SEA GRANT REPORT

The 2020 Sea Grant Workshop was attended by 70 people. DAS Longtime Members and Charter Captains Bob Mitchell, Dave Even and Doug Karakas were in attendance with me as well. The message from Sea Grant and all the presenters was very clear that they want our input in addressing the issues facing the Great Lakes. The topics had the usual cast that has been discussed in previous articles I have written on.

- The Predator Prey Model is working, and they are optimistic about the increase in Alewives. This
 will hopefully bring the stocking levels back, in 2021, to where they were before the cuts were
 made.
- The two primary methods for taking the pulse of the alewives in the lake, bottom trawls and acoustic were discussed. For the first time since I have been attending these meetings, they finally stated that the bottom trawls are not as effective as they use to be. The main factor being the water clarity. I thought this was common sense.
- The Water Levels are expected to break the record high set in 1986. As of this meeting, the Lake Superior Winter Low was 3.125 inches above the record of 1986. This water is coming to Lakes Huron and Michigan. If we have just an average year, this year, we will set a record. The highwater levels will create a more focus effort of enforcement on No Wake Zones so please take note.
- The Stomach Digestive Study is going well. It is helping the biologists see exactly what the fish are eating. It was not surprising that in Lake Michigan the primary diet was the alewife for all salmonids. Lake Huron, however had the more traditional results, specifically the steelhead. In Huron they had the bugs, while Michigan had primarily alewives. The Lake Trout are consuming the Gobies, but they are eating the alewives especially in Lake Michigan. This makes sense as the gobies are found among the rocks, which are native to most of the Lake Huron structure that is fished whereas the Lake Michigan structure is more along the clay. DAS help and support of this project is greatly appreciated.
- There is a new project that Sea Grant just received funding for to take OUR input as stewards of the fishery. They are putting together a "think tank" to take the public input on the issues facing the fishery and how to address them. I am hoping to take part in this and keep the club involved.
- The Lake Michigan Citizens Advisory Committee Meeting is in April. Hopefully they will have all the
 data for 2019 compiled and it will be presented then. I will have an Article for April if possible, but
 for sure in the May Newsletter.

Dan O'Keefe, of Sea Grant, did mention the DAS and the continued support that our club gives. It is a good feeling when our club from the eastside of the state is mentioned in such high regard in the Great Lakes fishery and science community. This of course would not be possible without our Wild Game Dinner. I will be attending the dinner, so if anyone has any questions, please feel free to contact me through email or at the wild game dinner!

DAS OUTING UPDATE

Unseasonably warm weather has played havoc with our AOTY ice outings. The Metro Park 'Cold as Ice' event originally scheduled in January, was first postponed until February 8, then eventually cancelled. The Saginaw Bay event on February 15, was also cancelled due to sketchy ice conditions. Our popular Mitchell's Bay event was also postponed then recently, we made the decision to move it to Higgins Lake. Higgins Lake is big and deep. Traditionally it takes a little longer to freeze, but the latest reports are very good. We'll be fishing for Lake Trout, but Higgins is also popular with anglers targeting Smelt, Cisco, and Perch.

Cost: \$5 outing registration required. Optional \$5 big fish pool. Both paid at the ramp before going out. Big fish pool will be paid by weight with length being the tie breaker.
