DNR Drafts Walleye Management Plan for Inland Waters

A healthy, abundant walleye population is a big part of Michigan's fisheries. These native fish provide exciting opportunities for world-class recreational fishing and play an important ecological role as a top predator. Though several local, regional, and Great Lakes-centric walleve plans exist, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources has drafted the first statewide walleye plan focused on inland waters. Seth Herbst, the DNR's aquatic species and regulatory affairs manager, is leading the initiative. He said this draft plan was developed to guide the department's management effort toward maximizing both angler satisfaction and the ecological benefits of walleye fisheries. "Walleye is a high-priority species for management in Michigan because of its ecological, social and cultural significance," Herbst said. "Walleve fishing is a big draw for anglers."

Although walleye reside in the Great Lakes, rivers, and inland lakes, Herbst said this draft plan takes a narrow

focus on inland waters—primarily inland lakes—because the walleye management in those other bodies of water is primarily addressed in various other existing management or rehabilitation plans.

The new walleye management plan for inland waters aims to provide an overview of:

- •The status of the species in Michigan.
- The biology and ecology of inland walleye populations.
- Angler perceptions about walleye management and fishing opportunities.
- ·A brief description of previous management efforts.

The plan also identifies several management goals that broadly address social and ecological characteristics of walleye fisheries, because both elements are key to successful future species management.

The DNR Fisheries Division developed the draft "Management Plan for Walleye in Michigan's Inland Waters" with assistance from Michigan State University Fisheries and Wildlife Department faculty and in consultation with Tribal governments. tains who charter out of Ludington, MI. They also share fishing strategies through Great Lakes Reel to Reel Outdoors Podcasts. Throughout their talk they took the perspective of smaller boats who are not able to run the multiple lines of a charter boat. They emphasized the importance of controlling speed and a consistent direction of troll in any current. They gave tips on how to maintain a consistent speed and direction of troll through a wind and chop that is trying to move your boat around, like it or not. Their talk ended with questions and answers from members. Their talk was on-point and useful for the coming season and they have been helping to get us through the Covid-19 thing with great and interesting information. Thank you, Mark and Adam.

Ine evening did not end there. After we benefitted from the evening's speakers, we went right into the clubs' major fund raiser of the year where we raffled off ten winners of \$500 each. Carl Ventimiglia put together a terrific program where 100 tickets were sold at \$100 each with DAS profiting \$4,600 after expenses. Algonac Walleye Drifting Outing Saturday, May 8

As the weather begins to warm, the St Clair River walleye fishery starts to catch fire. For most local anglers, jigging Spring walleye is a favorite method for catching table fare. Even if you've never tried it, you probably already own the equipment required. Most any six-to-seven-foot rod, paired with a reel loaded with a low stretch line, is a good starting point. In the St Clair River ³/₄ ounce jig heads tipped with a plastic minnow or worm, are typical rigs. Adding a live minnow and stinger hook to the jig can improve your luck, but some days that's just overkill.

A vertical presentation is key so you can feel your jig bounce off the bottom as you drift. The fish you target are holding to the bottom and they can see your presentation heading their way. On the St Clair River anglers can keep six fish as long as they meet the 13" minimum length.

Contact Bob Paradise at 586 457-4073, or Tom Gorguze at 248 343-8397 if you plan on fishing this event. As usual, the entry is \$10 per angler, and



\$10 for the big fish pool. Let a port captain know if you plan on fishing this event by Thursday, May 6th so we can make lunch arrangements. Saturday registrations are too late. Memberships must be current to receive AOTY points. **The outing winner will be determined by total weight of your five-best fish. The big fish winner will be determined by length of the longest fish.** If there is a big fish tie, weight will be the tie breaker. **Anglers can only weigh fish they have personally caught**, so use separate or suitable method to mark each angler's catch.

Boats and anglers must depart from, and return to, the DNR North Channel boat launch. You can launch and leave the ramp at any time, but you can't start fishing until 6:30 AM. Pull lines at 12:30, but leave enough time to have your catch at the scale by 1:00 PM.

Grand Haven SOTY May 15th & 16th

Grand Haven is an active small town with plenty of restaurants and lodging. Our mid-May tournament usually coincides with a beachfront kite flying event held there, so it is recommended to reserve rooms early. Airbnb and VRBO also offer houses to rent in the area. The municipal marina generally has plenty of room and reservations are available on the Michigan DNR website.

Grand Haven is the only two-day tournament the Detroit Area Steelheaders have. The two-day tournament is accumulative, so if the fish don't cooperate on Saturday, Sunday affords a second chance. We fish Saturday 6am to 1pm and Sunday from 6am to 11am. Luncheon is served on Saturday only. There are two independent big fish pools, one for Saturday and one for Sunday. The Kings and Coho generally cooperate with good catches!

Just a note about boat registration. We no longer have a 5am Captain's Meeting. **All registration is done online.** The registration form can be found at the DAS web site under the SOATY menu. Bob Ksionzek has made this incredibly easy to use. No

downloading, just open the form, fill it out, and hit the submit button.

PLEASE REGISTER NO LATER THAN THE THURSDAY BEFORE THE TOURNAMENT. The earlier, the better. This is not an iron clad contract; you can cancel by phone or email to the port captain or tournament director -Bob Feisel. From a personal perspective, early registration is not only courteous, but gives the port captain a more accurate number for lunch. As port captain I have served as few as 6 fisherman and as many as 40 at tournaments. This often results in a great waste of both food and money. Thanks.


