Salmon in the Classroom 2021 Releases

This last year, because of COVID, three of our schools chose to utilize the DNR's video/ZOOM option of raising Salmon. Our three other schools stayed with the live program. Pine Knob Elementary of Clarkston was our first release, on April 24, Saturday. Being on Saturday meant the parents were bringing the students to Yates Park across from the cider mill. The lead teacher, Miss Megan, had divided the students into four groups to alleviate crowding and help with parking. The release went very well with the parents enjoying it as much as the students. Pine Knob started with 151 eggs and released 74 Salmon. Along with the egg losses, a number of hatchlings (Alevin) experienced deformities, appearing to be in the spine. They were curled and could not straighten their bodies. These were discarded and the total reported to the DNR.

Near the end of the month, we will be delivering kits to the students in the classroom, composed of a lure blank and several colored tapes. They will be able to complete a lure to take home to Dad and Mom. Thank you, Dreamweaver Lure Co for the materials.

On May 5, Wednesday, Oakland Christian Schools in Auburn Hills did their release at Yates Park. They brought two busloads comprised of; 31 fourth graders, 10 seventh graders, 6 teachers/admin, and 3 volunteers. Wow. We had Doug Karakas, Ken Cione, Blaise Pewinski, Dan Chisholm, Mike Lolly, and Jim Zanke. And a number of mothers who stopped by to watch.





We set up five stations and divided the students to rotate around. The 1st station was to measure & release the Parr. The 2nd station was searching for invertebrates in piles of mud on plastic trays. The 3rd station was learning to cast & retrieve in the river. The 4th station was building lures from lure blanks and tape which they took home. The 5th station was a field game with large balls, an effort to burn off a lot of energy.







April Meeting Recap

The April membership meeting was the fourth and last in a series of Great Lakes Reel to Reel Outdoors Podcasts created for DAS by Adam Knudsen (Hiatus Charters) and Mark Williams (Silver Addiction) as they worked with us to get through the challenge of Covid-19. The focus for April was Spring salmon fishing on Lake Michigan out of St. Joesph and Grand Haven. The featured speaker was Winn Wolfe (Win-N-Angel) as he led us through tips and tricks out from the great port of Grand Haven.

My notes from his talk are a little bit scattered but basically:

Watch the weather reports for several days prior to the outing to help determine where the optimal water temperature will be. Fish the top 50 to 60 feet of water with Super Slims and Stingers. Green with black dots or white with black dots will serve you well. Best speed will be around 3.2 mph. Best direction out of port is likely to be SSW. Paddles and meat are not your best bet. That is what I was able to capture and hopefully some of it will work.

I am very happy to report that the next five Detroit Steelheaders membership meetings will be conducted outdoors under a pavilion located in Shelby Townships River Bends Park. We met there several times last year and it worked out very well. With some luck the weather will treat us kindly and we can conduct business as usual with speakers, fishing reports, raffles, and comradery. Still the last Tuesday each month and still at 7:30 pm.

During the May member meeting we will also complete our special charter raffle where two people will win the opportunity to enjoy an afternoon charter on board Silver Addiction out of Ludington on Friday July 30, 2021. The day before our club outing scheduled for Saturday July 31. Tickets are still available and easy to get. When you open the DAS club website the first thing you will see will be the opportunity to purchase tickets. This was a generous donation by Mark Williams of Silver Addiction and the club could really use the income in this challenging year.

St. Clair Walleye Outing, June 12th

On Saturday, June 12, 2021 the Detroit Area Steelheaders will be holding the St. Clair Walleye Outing at the St. Clair City Marina. Fishing will start at 6:00am, pull lines by 12:00 noon. You must be at the weigh in by1:00pm.

Launch fees are \$7.00 box/envelopes on pole where you back down to the ramp.

"ALLOW PLENTY OF TIME TO PULL YOUR BOAT OUT AND GET YOUR COOLER IN LINE, there is one ramp in/out and it can get congested".

For anyone with a boat that sits taller than 8'10" off the water, the bridge does not open until 8:00am and opens on the half hours. If you have a height problem, contact me. FOR THOSE EXCEPTIONS AND ONLY THOSE, you will be allowed to launch at Marysville as an alternative launch site.

We have the second pavilion reserved, same as last year (Southside of parking lot next to the large one with garage doors).

Entry fees are \$10.00 per person for the AOTY 5 fish per individual event, "MAKE SURE TO MARK/KEEP each person's fish separate". Big fish pool is \$10.00 per person. Payout will be 50% for 1st./heaviest fish, 30% for second, and 20% for third.

2021 DAS SOTY HARBOR BEACH TOURNAMENT

June 19th the Detroit Area Steelheaders fleet will be fishing out of Harbor Beach. To finish with the top boats in this tournament you will need to target Lake Trout.

You can catch Lake Trout higher in the water column with dipsey divers, lead core and copper setups but these fish will typically be smaller, (5-6 lbs.) You may also pick up a steelhead or maybe even a salmon. Fishing slow and bouncing bottom is the key to targeting the bigger Trout. These will usually run in the 7-9 lb. range with the occasional 10-12 pounder.

The normal tactic for this area is to station a crew member at each corner and constantly adjust the downrigger depths to bounce off the bottom. You do not want to drag bottom, especially further north toward Port Austin as the shale bottom tends to snag cannon balls. It is always a good idea to have a set of wire cutters handy in case you get hung up. On the riggers, try a Spin-n-Glo behind cow bells or a dodger. My favorite setup is a Chartreuse and Lime Spin-n-Glo with white wings behind a Tin Can dodger. Lead length should be about one and a half times the dodger length or about 22". The lead on Cow Bells can be shorter. Areas to fish are anywhere from 60 - 120 feet of water, north, south, or straight out from the Harbor. My experience has been that at this time of the year, the better fishing will be north of the harbor. With the 20-mile radius from pier heads limit, you could fish all the way off of Light House Park or straight east of Grindstone City.

We no longer have Skippers Meetings. Tournament start is at 5:30 a.m. with fish calls at 9:00 and 11:00. Pull lines at 12:30 p.m. with the weigh-in at 1:30 p.m. at the Municipal Marina. The minimum size for Lake Trout is 15 inches with a creel limit of 3. Hope to see you there. Good Luck.



Understanding Declining Productivity in the Offshore Regions of the Great Lakes

A report submitted to the International Joint Commission by the Great Lakes Science Advisory Board, Science Priority Committee Declining Offshore Productivity Work Group.

In June 2020, the International Joint Commission's Science Advisory Board (SAB) completed a report entitled Understanding Declining Productivity in the Offshore Regions of the Great Lakes. The report includes a number of findings and a recommendation aimed at improving coordination between water quality and fishery managers and improving the understanding of ecosystem impacts of nutrients in both nearshore and offshore waters of the Great Lakes. Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement recognizes the complexity of the Great Lakes basin ecosystem and its interacting components of air, land, water and living organisms in lakes comprised of many different types of habitat in the nearshore and offshore regions. The Agreement embraces coordination, the ecosystem approach, adaptive management and science-based management as recommended principles and approaches. We find the subject report to be in line with these principles and approaches with advice to help managers evaluate and better understand the dichotomy between excess nutrient levels in the nearshore while levels are declining in the offshore. The reductions in the nutrient levels offshore are affecting services including restoration of fishery production. This report is a unique compilation of all available information about declining offshore productivity and shows this is a significant issue. This report explores the dual challenges of nearshore nutrient enrichment and reduced ecosystem productivity in the offshore, with particular emphasis on the latter, and includes the completion of a contractor report under the guidance of a multidisciplinary SAB work group. This report includes sections on a description of the problem, a literature Understanding review, an analysis of recent Great Lakes trends, an examination of various models, findings, knowledge gaps and a recommendation. The report identifies the need for Great Lakes water quality managers to partner with fishery managers to break down information silos and adopt an adaptive management framework that considers both the upper and lower food webs. Targets set for nutrient reductions under the GLWQA require an ecosystem-level analysis to consider potential impacts on offshore waters and strike a balance between ecosystem services. A key finding in the report describes how invasive mussels are implicated in sequestering nutrients in the nearshore. This underscores the importance of applied research and the work of the Invasive Mussel Collaborative to control invasive mussels. As such, GLEC may wish to explore with the Great Lakes Commission and the Invasive Mussel Collaborative how they might provide insight and support in addressing this issue. The Commission will partner with the Great Lakes Fishery Commission to communicate key messages from this study to, and seek feedback from, fishery managers and other organizations in the context of other work being carried out on nutrient management. We expect that this report will be useful to governments to inform actions under Annex 2 (Lake wide Action and Management Plans), Annex 4 (Nutrients) and Annex 10 (Science) as managers strive to control excess nutrients, maintain algal species consistent with healthy aquatic ecosystems while at the same time taking steps to restore and protect native fish species.2
