Looking back: Despite the challenges presented to us by the Covid pandemic over the last couple of years, the DAS fishing club is alive and well. Club membership is up slightly. Membership attendance at monthly meetings is holding steady and rising. Our selection of speakers for our monthly meeting has been outstanding. We have adapted. Our monthly meeting venue will be Club 54 during the cold winter months, and River Bends Park in the Summer and Fall months. Judging from attendance, these venues appear to be working for membership.

Regrettably, our Angler of the Year attendance and catch rates was down slightly for some of our events. In large part that was due to some brutal weather, and we can't plan that.

The competition for our Skipper-of-the-Year and Angler-of-the-Year awards for 2021 was very close. Both awards were decided by the last event of the year. Blaise Pewinski held off all challengers in Rogers City to claim Skipper-of-the-Year. The Angler-of-the-Year was wrapped up early by Bob Paradise but second and third place were still undecided until the end of competition in Caseville where Gaspare Aragona and Mark Wyrick held off challengers to claim second and third place.

We have reviewed all aspects of our cash flow to reduce expenses and massaged and innovated our fundraising to keep the club viable during some tough times. Keeping the cash flow under control is important because that's what allows us to support the club's mission of "Protecting and Promoting the Great Lakes Sport Fishery". Supporting local kids fishing derbies, scholarships, support for the DNR Salmon-in-the-Classroom program, donations to other organizations that support and strengthen the Great Lakes Fisheries are all critical to us meeting our mission. We also need to have adequate cash flow to operate our own club functions like attracting inspiring speakers for member meetings while running our own Trolling and Angler tournaments. The DAS is healthy, but we still need our membership to support our fundraising efforts. The innovation in the 2022 largest fund-raising effort (Wild Game Dinner) is we are moving to a new venue (Packard Proving Grounds in Sterling Heights) and moving the date from a Saturday to a Thursday weeknight (3/3/2022). We need membership to support this effort to keep the club moving forward.

Looking forward: Unless conditions out of our control get out of hand, we plan a full schedule of trolling tournaments (8) and angler events (13 fishing outings) for club members to participate in. The time and energy our membership invested in fishing events last year can be repeated in 2022 with some new ports added to both trolling and angler events. The skill set our members bring to these events is amazing and it makes the competition a lot of fun. We are seeing new people rise to compete for recognition and that makes everyone try harder. That's the fun of it.

We also plan to continue our mission of "Protecting and Promoting the Great Lakes Fishery" through support of Salmon in the classroom, local kids fishing derbies, Special Friends (hopefully), scholarships, and other worthy causes. Stay the course, stick with us, participate, learn, and have fun. That's the plan moving forward.

Lake Michigan Citizens Advisory Update

The past years have been challenging to us all, primarily due to the pandemic. However, we have positive good news about Lake Michigan. The Lake Michigan Citizens Advisory Committee, met at Jays Sporting Goods this fall, and the news on Lake Michigan was very positive. All of the numbers point to an increase of King Plants up to 1 million. The committee would recommend this increase, however, due to the ongoing Tribal Consent Decree Negotiations, and the fact that the biological lake committee was not in favor until we saw one more positive year in the data, the plants stayed the same. Personally, I believe this to be solely due to the Consent Decree still be negotiated. The projection for 2023 is that the decree will be in place and we will safely be able to increase our plants lake wide, with Michigan going to a 1 million King Salmon Plant. While this is a delay, it is a positive one. Our fishery in Lake Michigan is tremendous as I saw on my charters this past season. The Coho and Steelhead fishing in the big lake was the best I have seen in twenty years, and this opinion was shared by many charter captains up and down the lake. The King fishing was good as well with lots of big fish being caught, including a new state record King in Ludington! All of these positive signs show that Jay Wesley and all of the committees and biologists have our Lake Michigan Fishery going in the right direction. Yes, we would all like to go back to the days of big number boxes, but I believe that the current fishery makes us all better fisherman. After all, most of us fish because we love the challenge and excitement it provides. I look forward to a 2022 season that will most likely mirror 2021, from a fishery stand point, and I am looking forward to splashing the Silver Addiction and beginning the season in St. Joe this spring! DAS Scholarship

In cooperation with the Lake Superior State University Foundation, the Board of Directors has established the "Detroit Area Steelheaders Fisheries Scholarship". The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to a student majoring in the LSSU Biology, or Fisheries and Wildlife Management program, with a focus on fisheries.

The scholarship is a \$1500 annual award. LSSU students may submit a letter of application to the Chair of Biological Sciences. This award does not automatically renew, however past recipients may apply.

Successful candidates must be a full-time student of at least Sophomore status, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and a resident of the state of Michigan

Members of the biological sciences faculty will recommend a recipient from the applicants for final approval by the Financial Aid Office.

Meet Simon Freeman

Dear Dan Chisolm and members of the Detroit Area Steelheaders,

Thank you for awarding me the Detroit Area Steelheaders Scholarship for this current academic year at Lake Superior State University! It is with great honor that I accept this scholarship as I further my education at LSSU. I am a senior majoring in Fisheries and Wildlife Management with a concentration in Fisheries Management. While I am a senior, this is only my second year at LSSU having transferred from Lansing Community College, and so I am especially thankful to be considered for this award let alone receive it.

In my time thus far at LSSU and living in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan I have made it a point to take advantage of the truly remarkable opportunities offered to undergraduate students here. My first real taste of what this university had to offer came through and has since resided in the LSSU Center for Freshwater Research and Education (CFRE). I spent my first year volunteering several times a week at the CFRE Atlantic Salmon Fish Hatchery, netting adults at brood stock collection and then helping to raise the fish on from there. This volunteering turned into a paid position for the Summer of 2021, which featured not only hatchery work, but also assisting the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) with invasive sea lamprey control in the St. Marys River and Lake Superior.

While volunteering and working, I have also been able to plan, propose, and now carry out my undergraduate research thesis on the decline of the lake whitefish in Lakes Michigan, Huron, and Superior. This is a topic that has always been of great interest to me as I grew up sportfishing for lake whitefish in East Tawas, Lake Huron during spawning runs. The University and CFRE have given me the education, training, mentorship, and other tools necessary to perform this research on a hot topic in Great Lakes science. The lake whitefish is of interest to many organizations due to its value commercially, culturally, and recreationally. One hypothesis for their decline is decreased food (zooplankton) available during their larval stages. I have worked with several agencies on this project such as the Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians, MDNR, USFWS, Little Traverse Bay Bands, Grand Traverse Bands, Central Michigan University, and more. These professional connections, along with skills attained from sampling the Lakes, and processing samples in the lab are invaluable for my future endeavors in fisheries management.

I have much to be thankful for heading through another year of studying. Now as I continue attending classes and carrying out research in the Fall and Spring of 2021-22, I thank the Detroit Area Steelheaders for their support. It is truly with great honor that I accept this funding to further my education, but even more that I do so from an organization involved in fisheries. To be considered and recognized by such a select group in the Great Lakes state is something I am truly grateful for. Please see the pictures attached below!

2021 Skipper of the Year Recap

The 2021 Skipper of the Year (SOTY) competition was almost like "dèjà vu all over again". Last year Blaise Pewsinski (Sea Hag) was in the lead near the end of the season, but Paul Gjeldum (Blue Horizon) improved his score at our very last tournament to win the SOTY award.

This year we had 7 trolling tournaments. The SOTY scoring was based on your best 4 scores. Blaise was in the lead again before our final tournament at Rogers City, but he only had a one-point lead. There were 4 other captains in contention that had a chance to win the SOTY; Fred Chartier (Lake Buzzard), Joe Delisi (Wonder), Bob Jones (Bobby's Toy), and Bob Feisel (Vicki's Seacret),

It all depended on how good, or poorly, Blaise did at the Rogers City tournament and how well the other 4 captains scored. If Blaise took first place at Rogers City he would have a lock on the SOTY win, and if he didn't do so well then someone else could take the lead away from him.

The fishing at Rogers City was very "challenging". The tournament was scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 28, but there was a band of intense storms coming across the state so we decided to postpone until Sunday. As it turned out, the storms parted to the north and south of Rogers City, leaving us with some nice fishing conditions so several boats went out for pre-fishing before tournament day. We didn't have a weigh-in on Saturday, but I know that "Trapshooter" had caught 7 and "Vicki's Seacret" caught 5, so things were looking promising. But on Sunday everyone struggled to find the fish. Our 7-boat DAS fleet caught a total of only 11 fish that day. "Sea Hag" didn't do so well either, he only caught 1 fish, finished in 5th place, and opened the door for the other contenders to move up in the SOTY standings.

Of the 4 other contenders, "Lake Buzzard" and "Bobby's Toy" didn't make it to Rogers City. "Vicki's Seacret" was there but got skunked on tournament day, blowing any chance for SOTY. That left "Wonder" as the only contender. Joe Delisi did pretty well at the Rogers City tournament, catching 2 fish and taking 3rd place, but it wasn't quite good enough.

The winner of the 2021 SOTY (by just one point!) is..... "Sea Hag"! Congratulations to Blaise Pewsinski!!
