May 7, 2022 AOTY Algonac Walleye Outing and Fish Fry

The bite is on! Join us for a fun morning fishing on the St. Clair River, followed by a weigh-in and fish fry at Tom and Diann Gorguze's Algonac cottage. DAS members can count their results towards AOTY scores. Best five walleyes by weight. Guests are welcome. Entry is \$10 per person for the outing, and \$10 more to participate in the Big Fish pool. The big fish pool is optional and will pay three spots. If you fish in a boat and want to enter the big fish contest, everyone in the boat must be entered in the big fish side bet.

When: This Saturday, May7th

Fishing starts at 6:00AM and concludes at 1:00PM. You may launch beforehand. Coolers must be in line at the weigh-in by 1:30 PM. Fish Fry is 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM.

Where: NORTH CHANNEL DNR RAMP

All boats must start from the North Channel ramp. The DNR Ramp is located at 2635 Pointe Tremble Rd, Algonac, MI 48001 (across from the Kroger). It is located roughly 18 miles north of the 23 Mile Road (exit #243) on I-94. Weigh-in and fish fry location is 2815 Pointe Tremble.

Bait shops near Algonac:

Anglers, Next to the Fair Haven Ramp,

Master Bait, behind the Sunoco Station (just after the Colony Tower),

Minnich's (just north of town next to Snoopy's Bar).

You don't need a big boat to fish the St. Clair River. In fact, you don't even need a boat. The St. Clair River also offers numerous locations to fish from the shore. This outing has evolved into a club favorite. Last year was a banner year for walleye in the St. Clair River, and the outlook remains good for the future. Vertical jigging is a favorite technique for early spring eyes. Use your trolling motor to correct for the wind and drift with the current. Only Walleye can be weighed at the scales. **If you will be attending this event text Tom Gorguze by Thursday, May 7th**. If you have other questions, please call **Tom Gorguze at 248 343-8397**. If you are looking for a ride, or have room for an extra angler, let Tom know. Perch and Walleye donations from your winter catch are welcome. Fish going into a shared cooler or live-well, must be marked to identify the owner.

May 21/22 Skipper of the Year Grand Haven two day tournament

Grand Haven May 21st & 22nd

Grand Haven is the only two day tournament the Detroit Area Steelheaders have. The two-day tournament is accumulative, so if the fish don't cooperate on Saturday, Sunday affords a second chance. We fish Saturday 6am to 1pm and Sunday from 6am to 11am. Luncheon is served on Saturday only. There are two independent big fish pools, one for Saturday and one for Sunday. The Kings and Coho generally cooperate with good catches! Last year we had seven boats participate.

Grand Haven is an active small town with plenty of restaurants and lodging. Downtown offers some small restaurants and bars. Some chain restaurants are located outside the downtown area. There is a Meijer's on the south end of town. Our mid-May tournament usually coincides with a beachfront kite flying event held there, so it is recommended to reserve rooms early. Airbnb and Vrbo also offer houses to rent in the area. The municipal marina is one of the most up to date facilities. It features floating docks, cleaning station, and modern amenities, including Wi-Fi. Reservations are available on the Michigan DNR website.

We no longer have a 5am Captain's Meeting. **All registration is done online.** The Big Fish pool is a check box on the registration form and is voluntary. Both fees will be collected on Saturday. The registration form can be found at the DAS web site under the SOTY menu. Bob Ksionzek has made this incredibly easy to use. No downloading, just open the form, fill it out, and hit the submit button. **PLEASE REGISTER NO LATER THAN THE THURSDAY BEFORE THE TOURNAMENT.** The earlier, the better. This is not an iron clad contract; you can cancel by phone or email to the port captain or tournament director -Bob Feisel. From a personal perspective, early registration is not only courteous, but gives the port captain a more accurate number for lunch. This is very important to me, as I plan and buy the ingredients for a good, hot lunch ahead of time. Thanks.

June 18, 2022 Skipper of the Year Tournament Harbor Beach

Harbor Beach

June 18th the Detroit Area Steelheaders fleet will be fishing out of Harbor Beach. To finish with the top boats in this tournament you'll need to target Lake Trout.

The traditional method of targeting the bigger Lake Trout is to go low and slow. The normal tactic for this is to station a crew member at each corner and constantly adjust the downrigger depths to tap the bottom. You don't want to drag bottom, especially further north toward Port Austin as the shale bottom tends to snag cannon balls. It's always a good idea to have a set of wire cutters handy in case you get hung up. On the riggers, try Spin-N-Glos behind cow bells or a dodger. My favorite setup is a Chartreuse and Lime Spin-n-Glo with white wings behind a Tin Can dodger. Lead length should be about one and a half times the dodger length or about 22". Wire line dipseys run close to bottom also work well.

At our March membership meeting, guest speaker Captain Paul Nienaltowski of Team Mermaid Fishing Charters out of Port Austin talked about the improving Steelhead and Coho fishery in lower Lake Huron. He also mentioned that more recently the Lake Trout can be caught using magnum sized spoons about five feet off of the bottom trolling at speeds around 3 mph. He also runs free sliders to target Steelhead and Cohos. At last year's tournament, there were several Cohos weighed in.

Two years ago, many Pink Salmon were caught and with their two-year life cycle, they should be around this time as well. Although they won't be big enough to count towards your tournament results, they are known to be great table fare. Check your lines often as you could be dragging one without knowing. I always say, "You can't catch a big fish if there's already a little one on your line". Areas to fish are anywhere from 60 - 120 fow either north, south or straight out from the Harbor. My experience has been at this time of the year, the better fishing will be north of the harbor. With the 20 mile radius from pier heads limit, you could fish all the way north off of Light House Park or east of Grindstone City. Last year the best fishing seemed to be off of Port Hope which is about 7 miles north.

We no longer have Skippers Meetings. You need to register online on the DAS website. You can leave the pier heads at any time with the tournament start on the honor system. Setting lines at 5:30 a.m. with fish calls at 9:00 and 11:00. We'll have a roll call about an hour after tournament start to confirm which boats are on the water. Pull lines by 12:30 p.m. with the weigh-in at 1:30 p.m. at the Municipal Marina. The minimum size for Lake Trout is 15 inches with a creel limit of 3. Hope to see you there. Good Luck.

DNR asks anglers to report tagged walleye

The Michigan DNR will jaw tag 3,000 walleye across multiple Saginaw Bay tributary rivers. As the DNR adds more tagged walleye to Michigan waters, anglers are asked to report tagged fish to assist data collection efforts. Anyone catching a tagged fish is asked to report the following information using the tag return form at Michigan.gov/EyesInTheField:

- · Species.
- · Length.
- · Weight (if known).
- · Tag location (where tag was attached).
- · Identification number (the larger of the two sets of numbers).
- · Tag return address (for example MICH DNR MM-1).
- · Capture date and location. In the notes box of the form, please list time of capture and sex of fish (if known). Each tag is stamped with a unique identifying number. Once a fish has been successfully reported, the angler will receive a letter detailing the fish's history. "The information reported is essential to measuring the health of the population and is critical data for planning the future management decisions needed to protect and enhance this important fishery," said David Fielder, PhD. research biologist out of the DNR's Alpena Fisheries Research Station. "Besides ensuring the walleye fishery

remains sustainable, we also annually estimate the population size with the aid of these tag reports." The DNR has tagged more than 100,000 walleye in the Saginaw Bay area since 1981. Jaw tagging is part of a long-term research project to monitor survival and harvest rates and to learn about walleye movement. About 10% of the tags include a \$100 reward for reporting. To be eligible for a reward, photos are required of the flattened tag. Anglers can keep or release the fish. If anglers are not interested in a reward, please do not remove the tag before releasing the fish. Tagging occurs each spring on the Tittabawassee River and other Saginaw Bay tributaries during the walleye spawning run. Walleye are collected with electrofishing boats that temporarily stun the fish to allow fisheries biologists and technicians to collect vital statistics, tag the fish and

release them back into the river after the fish have recovered. After spawning, walleye migrate back into Saginaw Bay and a large number migrate out of the bay into Lake Huron. The fish that migrate out of the bay have been found ranging to the Straits of Mackinac to the north and Lake Erie to the south. The second study will take place in Saginaw Bay this year in which 150 walleye will be implanted with acoustic transmitters that allow researchers to track the fish and learn more about their movement. Those walleye will have belly tags and will also include a \$100 reward for the return of the transmitter. To learn more about marked and tagged fish, visit Michigan.gov/TaggedFish ².

Saslmon-in-the-Classroom (SIC) Update

DAS Salmon-in-the-Classroom ambassador Rodney Elnick reports that salmon releases are successful and ongoing. On Friday, April 22, (126) salmon were released by Oakland Christian at Riverside Park in Auburn Hills. That represents an 85% success rate. Following that, on April 29, (132) salmon were released by Pine Knob, also from Riverside Park in Auburn Hills. That represents an 87% success rate.

Coming attractions:

Independence Elementary plans on releasing their salmon on Monday, May 16 at Dodge Park.

The DNR lottery system has awarded Pine Knob, two, Lamprey for observation. They will receive the Lamprey on May 10 and the children will be able to observe the Lamprey in the same tank the salmon were raised in.
