The U.S. Government, Tribes, and the State of Michigan are negotiating issues that will affect "all" fishing rights within the Treaty area. Use of Gill nets, boundaries, and catch limits are being discussed.

June 4 Skipper of the Year Pentwater tournament recap

Pentwater Tournament "June 4 th 2022"

RJ and myself were invited to fish with Tom and Diane Gorguze on the Bad Dog for this tournament. We left from Manistee Friday morning, motored down just north of the point before we set up a trolling program. We tried different depths, speeds and presentations trying to get a game plan for tournament day as we trolled south towards Pentwater. After a long day of trolling we only had 2 hook up's and lost both fish.

Tournament day started at 5:30am this yr. and at the 6:30am roll call we had 7 boats report in. We set up south of Pentwater today and it wasn't long before we had the skunk out of the box.

At 8:30am we did our first fish call, Nathan Case and his son Nathan on the Equalizer already had 6 fish in the box, followed by Sea Hag and Wonder, both with 4 fish, Bad Dog and Sloppy Joe had 3 fish each, followed by Lake Buzzard with 2 fish and Hard Top and Tails with 1 fish. We did our 2nd fish call around 10:30 am and the Equalizer added a couple more fish to the cooler as they reported 8 fish. Wonder had also added a few more fish reporting they had 7 fish, followed by Sea Hag with 5 fish, both Bad Dog and Lake Buzzard with 4 fish, Sloppy Joe still on 3 fish and Hard Top and Tails still on 1 fish.

The Tournament ended at 12:30 pm and everyone was back for the weigh in before 1:30 pm at the Municipal Marina. After everyone weighed in their fish, Bad Dog pulled out 1st place along with the biggest King Salmon (18.85 lbs.) which paid out \$70. 2nd place went to Lake Buzzard, 3rd place was Equalizer, 4th place was Sloppy Joe, 5th place was Wonder, along with the biggest Steelhead (6.85 lbs.) paying out \$35. 6th place was Sea Hag along with the biggest Lake Trout (3.40 lbs.) paying out \$35. Hard Top and tails finished 7 th place. For lunch we had some different types of pizza's and a box of boneless chicken wings from the Pizza / Grinder Store in town along with drinks and snacks. We will have a big fish pool at \$10 per person and every body on a boat must be entered to qualify. Plus \$10 for entry fee. Let me know who is a guest on your boat.

Salmon in the Classroom Update



Angler of the Year 2022 event registration Please follow this format:

Registration will be done by TEXT entry. The event coordinator has plenty to do and keep track of, so texting provides a record of the participants intent to compete. The text is your agreement that you will show up and pay your entry fees. Entry fees are \$20 per person. The entry fee covers your shore lunch (\$10) and enters you in the big fish pool (\$10). The entry for the big fish pool is not mandatory. If you do not wish to compete in the big fish pool, simply opt out of it in your text. The text should be sent to the event coordinator prior to 4 pm on the day before the scheduled event. Cancellations can

be made by text also, prior to the starting time of the event. Your entry text should include your phone number in case the coordinator needs to contact you. In the case of individual events where no boat is involved, you only need to communicate your personal information. Where a boat is involved, you need to communicate the name of the boat and the names of all individuals who are with you. Also, where a boat is involved, all participants are responsible to pay the \$20 entry fee as in any of our AOTY events. In the events that involve a boat, all participants on the vessel will either be in big fish pool, or all will opt out. Also remember, that these AOTY events are for each person's individuals points. You must keep each person's catch separate, or in some way individually identified. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. Detroit Area Steelheaders P.O.
