On Saturday September 10, 2022 the Detroit Area Steelheaders launched out of the Selfridge ANG DNR ramp to compete in our AOTY outing. The weather was great, the turnout was good, but the fishing was not so good. I think everyone enjoyed the day on the water but the size and number of perch brought in to the weigh-in was disappointing. Twenty three angler brought home 91 perch that were 8 inches and up. Trust me there were a lot more perch hauled up but only 8 inch plus counted for the weigh-in. There were numerous catch and releases because they were undersize.

Of the 23 anglers who participated, Bob Paradise total catch took first place in the AOTY competition earning one point. Curt Smiscik total catch earned him second and two AOTY points, while Gaspare Aragona brought in a catch that earned hin three AOTY points. 



Drones Capturing Fishery Data Take Sail in Lake Michigan

HOLLAND, MI -- Beachgoers and boaters might notice orange drones sailing the waters of lakes Michigan and Huron over the next month.

The drones will capture fishery data on the lakes through about mid-September to help inform sustainable management of the Great Lakes' annual \$7 billion fishing industry, according to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS).

The pair of drones, which are powered by wind and solar energy, were launched by USGS and Saildrone, Inc. on July 28 from Macatawa and began collecting data on Aug. 5.

Their 45-day journey will take them north along the western coast of Michigan in Lake Michigan, under the Mackinac Bridge and then south along the state's eastern coast in Lake Huron.

An exact endpoint in Lake Huron has not yet been determined.

The 23-foot-long autonomous vehicles called Saildrone Explorers use acoustic technology to collect fish distribution and density data 24/7. USGS officials will use the data to help understand the effects of large ship engine noise on fish sampling and catchability.

That information, according to the USGS, will be used to help sustain fishers for states, American Indian tribes and Canada's Ontario Province sharing the Great Lakes.

The acoustic technology isn't hazardous to people or animals and won't interfere with sonar, communications equipment or similar technology, according to the USGS.

The drones have a 15-foot-tall wing sail and weighted keel. The scientific sensors, navigational and communications equipment are stored in the hull.

Saildrone is based in Almeda, California. Their largest surface water drone is 72 feet long. The type of drone used in the Great Lakes study has a wind propulsion speed averaging 3 knots, or about 3.45 miles per hour.

The company has been contracted previously to survey Alaska pollock stock, study white shark behaviors, survey fish populations off the coast of Norway and more.

According to Saildrone, the company's drones broke the record for fastest autonomous vehicle crossing of the Atlantic Ocean at 75 days at sea and were the first to cross it in both directions.
