Trolling director, Bob Feisel will lead the DAS Skippers to set the 2023 trolling schedule and discuss rules changes.

DAS Board of Directors, Officers, and Committee Election

DAS By-Laws call for a Board of Directors election during the annual meeting in December each year at our normal meeting place, Club 54 on Van Dyke just south of 16 Mile Rd.

The board meets at 7:00 pm at Irena's Bistro on Mound Rd. between 16 and 17 Mile Rd. We meet two Tuesday's prior to the general membership meeting each Month. Food and beverages are provided. The board does not meet in August so there are 11 board meetings each year.

Four Officer terms are expiring in December 2022. Dan Chisholm, Tom Gorguze, Jim Zanke, and Steve Prout. Please step up and help your club by volunteering to run for election. There are Officers serving now who would appreciate a break. Please do your part to help maintain the continuity of DAS. New ideas will be welcome and listened to. To run for election, make your intentions known to any board member and we will see that your name appears on the ballot. We need you.

The advisory committee met in Clare at Jay's sporting goods on October 4th to discuss the future plants of coho salmon in the system. The last few years we have helped the DNR in deciding where and when to plant fish in Michigan waters. The ports of Port Sanilac, Harbor Beach, Oscoda and Alpena are the ports used for spring plants and these will be given 50,000 annually starting 2023 along with Port Hope and East branch of the Augre river will receive 150,000 fall fingerlings. As the fishery developed they will add Harisville, Rogers city and Grindstone harbor to fall plants and available fish come about. This will give the lake 350,000 plus coho starting next year.

Randy Tarrain vice chair of the committee says this will bring in a new Era of fishing in Huron not seen in 20 or so years. We also talked to Charles Bronte of the US.F& W about the Great lakes Mass Marking program he has been supervising. Charles will be our guest speaker in November. He will be doing a presentation on their finding of where the fish go after they are planted.

Brown trout yes wild browns have started to show up off Augres the last couple years.according to Dnr biologist April Simmons. This could turn into a great fishery off the Charity island reef.

Lake Michigan is Heading in the Right Direction...... So Far

The following report is credited to Mark Williams. Long time DAS member and member, Ludington Charterboat Association.

Collapse avoided.... So Far! This was the statement, on September 29th, when I attended the Lake Michigan Citizens Advisory Committee Meeting, at Jay's in Clare. The salmon plants for the surrounding states are back to their previous levels before the Lake Committee reduced the plants so drastically. However, Michigan is the only state that is not back to its previous levels, so going forward, we will be the only state that can increase our plant numbers. Michigan will be stocking one million king salmon this year, and at the height of planting we were at three million.

The other good news was that the average weight of a female that was taken for eggs was up to eighteen pounds, which is a 3-pound increase from previous years. All of this shows that Lake Michigan is moving in the right direction, of course there are some things that need to be watched going forward.

The Alewife die off that was seen on the lake was genuinely concerning. I personally saw this out of Ludington and it was reported all the way North to the Bridge. The bait that washed up on the beaches was evaluated, and there was no indication of disease, which is an incredibly good thing. Also, the die off was not seen south of Muskegon. One explanation of this was the weather and currents that was seen this year. Everyone spoke about the number of trips lost due to weather. In Ludington and Manistee, we are used to the currents, but this year they were even more intense. We experienced more current going 90 degrees to each other than in past years. Personally, I had days that I would question the readings of my FishHawk, as the speed and temperature just did not make sense. The intense currents and fierce winds that help create them, could be to blame for the bait fish die off, or so we hope.

Of course, the one thing that was unexpected was the hard to find and catch Lake Trout, up and down the Lake. Everyone reported that our Lake Trout fishery had changed, and not for the better. Charters, that relied on good Lake Trout fishing found it tough going, me included. Spots that would almost be a guarantee for good Lake Trout, turned into small fish or very few fish. I caught my biggest Lake Trout this year, (25.75 pounds) offshore. Our normal spots turned into small lake Trout with small numbers caught. The answer is hopefully the same as it was regarding the die off, weather and currents. The thought was from the biologists was that the Lake Trout did not need to move in from the depths due to the abundance of bait and temperatures offshore. I hope they are right.

Finally, there was the Consent Decree negotiations. There was nothing said formally about the Decree, however, they are still on going with the latest extension being until November 14, 2022. Supposedly, they are 90% done, and from a sportsman's point of view, not in a good way. The Coalition to Protect Michigan's Resources, filed a motion on July 13th to try and become a full party, as it felt the MDNR was not representing the Sport Fishery of Michigan. You can see the full motion on the CPMR website. When this motion was filed, the CPMR representatives were not made welcome by the MDNR director at the motion hearing. In fact, MUCC, a CPMR member, authored an article outlining the discussion that took place. I encourage you to go to MUCC.org, and in the search bar type in Shouting Match between DNR Director. This article tells all of us where things are when it comes to the decree, not good at all.

In conclusion, I would like to say how proud I am when I attend these meetings and thee CPMR meetings as a member and representative of the DAS. The monetary support that our club has given this great fishery of ours does not go unnoticed and is greatly appreciated at all levels. I am continually thanked for it and want to pass that along to all club members. Our board both past and present has generously donated to the CPMR, Salmon in the Classroom, and the fishery as a whole. As members of the DAS, we can hold our heads high in knowing that we help to preserve, protect, and grow our Great Lakes Fishery.
