

A Skipper's best 4 tournament scores will count towards the Skipper of the Year Award. The entry fee will be \$15 per person. The optional Big Fish bet remains at \$20 / boat and is divided into 3 separate pools: Big Salmon for \$10 per boat, Big Steelhead for \$5 per boat, and Big Lake Trout for \$5 per boat. All 3 pools must be entered to participate. Tournament entry fees and Big Fish bets will be collected at the weigh-in and lunch will be provided at the weigh-in. There are no Skipper's meetings prior to the tournament. Skippers should register at least 3 days prior to he tournament.

The President's Year in Review 2024

Yet another year has gone by! Winter is upon us, it seems like just yesterday I was

prepping the boat for spring. This has been my third year as President. I believe, with the help of the other twelve directors that make up the board, our club is moving forward! We are more organized and have better membership participation. Over 50 members joined in the 13 Angler of the Year events! Digging through the archive of Newsletters, it appears our first non-trolling fishing event was 2011. It all started with an ice fishing outing. Look how far we have expanded! We averaged eight boats per the seven trolling events. Our Christmas Party is always a full house and we had a good turnout for Potluck / Swap Meeting. We have had 10 great speakers this year, covering a multitude of topics and fishing techniques.

The membership numbers vary throughout the year. We maintain between 170 and 185 members. The number varies with expirations, renewals, and new members. This in part is why it is important to recruit at the Ultimate Fishing Show! We need fresh ideas and participating members to keep the club growing.

Here are some of the items that impacted us last. The warm winter and hot summer didn't seem to influence the lake levels greatly. We appear to maintaining a normal height, down from the high waters of 2020. The king population in Lake Michigan looks to be healthy and abundant. The pictures of overflowing waste barrels at he cleaning stations testify to this! Another topic of great concern was the Consent Agreement between the Native Tribes and the Government. I believe the private negotiations contributed greatly to the uneasiness felt by sportfisherman. Overfishing, expansion of gill nets, and expansion of netting in general raised great concern amongst the sport fisherman. Although the Decree is not completely settled, it appears to have reached a middle ground for both the Tribes and the fisherman. My hope is that it puts the health and prosperity of the fishery first for both parties.

My final note here about the upcoming Sportsman Dinner. It will be Saturday, March 8 th, 2025 at Century Banquet Center (formally American Polish Century Club) 33204 Maple Lane, Sterling Heights. This is the one fundraising event that supports our club for the entire year! It covers hall rental, insurance, speakers, raffles, the Christmas Party, Salmon in the Classroom, donations to support fishing in Michigan, kid's fishing derbies, and many of the other incidental expenses it takes to keep this club operational. Please support this event!

A special THANK YOU goes out to Kellie and Carl Ventimiglia for the time and great effort they exert to make this event happen!

The Salmon In The Classroom Program, by Rodney Elnick 2024 Spring Releases

In April and May of this year, the six schools supported by the Detroit Area Steelheaders needed to juggle their schedules and add releasing their Salmon to their river systems. Scheduling the bus, paying the driver, permissions from the principal, the other classes, and the parents does not just fall in place. And choosing a date without rain. The DAS supports four high schools and two elementary schools. This is very dependent on us locating a school whose Principal and participating teacher(s) agree with the extra work.

Eisenhower High School in Shelby was our first release, April 22. They chose Yates Park for the outing with 75 students participating. The river was high and running fast but their favorite station was casting. The release was moved up river about 40 feet to a gravel bar instead of the usual sand bar near the bridge, now under water. They had received 149 eggs and we released 138 Parr. This was by far the best numbers for this Spring, a 92.6% survival rate. Wow!

Pine Knob Elementary of Clarkston chose Riverside Park in Auburn Hills as their location on April 26, for our second release. We, with the help of parents, several teachers, and the principal, oversaw 76 fourth graders. They had received 152 eggs and released 132 Parr. That's 87% survival. We had a fun day rotating the students thru 'casting lessons', 'lure making', and the actual release. The teachers also had several additional stations.

On May 7th, we had Independence Elementary of Clarkston schedule their release at Dodge Park with 74 fourth graders. Another fine day with a good number of parents and several teachers. Again, we had casting, lure making, and the release. Adding digging in the mud for invertebrates, lessons on identifying trees, and free time on the parks' playground. This school received 161 eggs and released 141 Parr. That's 88% survival! See the lure display picture of one group's effort.

May 8th saw Romeo High School at Wolcott Mill Historical Center for their release. They were limited to the distance allowed to travel and the number of students. Along with the casting and the release, the instructor held an in-depth class on water purity and some chemical analysis. With their group, there was a big push to learn how to use a fly rod. The instructor brought four rods and it was up to us with experience to teach.

West Bloomfield High School was our fifth release on May 9th again at Riverside Park. This was the school's first year for a class of 'challenged' students. Only one of the thirteen students new anything about casting. With the strength of young adults, we suffered casts of five feet to across the river to catch a tree. It was positive however that the greatest pleasure came with releasing the Parr in the rocky side stream and tracking them thru the rocks to the fast-running river.

Divine Child High School of Dearborn is our sixth school however they handle their release themselves at the Huron River at Flat Rock. We would like to give a big thank you to Dreamweaver Lure Co. for their lure blanks and lure tape supplies they provided to make our release days successful. Also, we thank the DAS membership, those assisting thru the school year, and those that helped to make our releases successful.

2024 AOTY Caseville Results

As the Caseville outing on Saturday, December 7 approached, we all watched the Caseville pier camera so we could determine how we would be able to fish this particular outing. At first it looked like we would be casting spoons or body baits off the pier because most of the pier was free of obstruction from ice. After that, each day you could see more ice moving in and filling up the space we would need to cast out into open water. By Friday, December 6, it became apparent that our only hope was that there would be enough solid ice that we could ice fish in the marina or possibly enough ice to walk on off the pier. Rahbih Abdallah had been sending first hand reports via WhatsAp so we knew what we were up against when we arrived at the Caseville pier.

Some of us fished the harbor because we believed the ice was better but most DAS members fished the river in front of the parking lot. There were 20 competitors (down from 40+ in prior years) who gave it a try despite the high wind and cold temperatures that were predicted. As it turned out, the wind was not that bad and the temperature was bearable. However, the Lake Trout did not work with us on this day as only three Lake Trout were caught, all by Bob Paradise from the same hole in the ice.

Congratulations to Bob for a well earned win that locked up his first placed effort for Angler of the Year 2024. Big fish earnings went to Bob (\$100 big fish money), second and third big fish money were decided by random draw. A well deserved thank you to Rob Pinskey for running this outing again this year and providing a great shore lunch of spare ribs, baked beans, and potato salad. Rahbih also should be thanked for bringing up some great desserts.

Attendance was down because of a poor weather forecast but the outing turned out pretty well.

MDNR funding HB 6229 has been introduced into the final session of the state legislature and your continued support is extremely critical to its passage. For those that have not received this notice already, Fisheries Chief, Randy Claramunt below, has provided details of the Bill.

Dear Michigan Fisheries Stakeholders, Partners, and Supporters,

On behalf of DNR Fisheries Division, I am excited to share with you that the bill to adjust hunting and fishing licenses has been introduced in the Michigan House as **HB-6229** for the protection and enhancement of the incredible and diverse fishery in Michigan. In addition to the legislative sponsorship, we have received numerous calls and official letters of support from the Michigan Steelhead & Salmon Fishermen's Association (all chapters), Michigan Charter Boat Association, Great Lakes Council of Fly Fishers International, Bass Federation of Michigan, Trout Unlimited, Anglers of the Au Sable, Straits Area Sportsman's Club, Burt Lake Preservation Association, Upper Black River Council and various fishing advisory groups and lake associations across the state. This bill will update the available fishing license fees which were last changed over 10 years ago and have not kept pace with economic changes or changes in the sportfishing industry and community.

In the words of our stakeholders, this license "proposal would generate new revenue that would increase staffing, mostly at the field level, add fisheries technicians and biologists, increase fish production, and many other benefits that will help to preserve and improve Michigan's most important natural resources". The Great Lakes Council of Fly Fishers International also notes that, "It is estimated that recreational fishing generates \$2.3 billion in economic activity for our state and that there are over 1 million licensed anglers."

Our stakeholders and partners also recognized that the previous fishing and hunting license change in 2013 failed to address long-term funding needs for our fisheries. As stated by Michigan Charter Boat Association, "since the last fishing license fee adjustment, the cost of fish food for hatcheries has increased over 70 percent. This explosion in cost is found across all MDNR Fisheries Division activities. It threatens the ability [of the agency] to maintain proper staffing, stock the Great Lakes with sportfish, maintain equipment and repair the infrastructure which supports these activities."

We couldn't state the case any clearer and more succinctly than our partners have here, and we encourage you to voice your support for the license package, which will be a game changer for Michigan's fisheries and future generations of anglers. You can do so by contacting your respective legislator by any means possible (email, letter, call, etc.) and let them know that you want them to support this bill but do so asap as there are only a few days left in Session and thanks again for all your support.

Dear Michigan Legislative Leaders,

Hunting, fishing, and trapping represent an \$11.2 billion economic impact for the state of Michigan, from a 2019 Michigan United Conservation Clubs economic impact study. There are more than 700,000 hunting or trapping license holders, over 1,000,000 licensed anglers, and approximately 3,000,000 individuals who watch wildlife.

In 2013, the Michigan Legislature adopted the first hunting, fishing, and trapping license package since 1996. While impactful, the package failed to address the funding issues of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) on a longer-term basis.

Soon, a bipartisan slate of your colleagues will be bringing forward a license fee adjustment for your consideration. The package includes some significant changes, but importantly includes a consumer price index adjustment built in to ensure revenue gained keeps up with the rising costs of natural resources management, equipment and materials.

To put a fine point on it, DNR Wildlife Division's maintenance costs have more than doubled from \$1.4 million to \$3.1 million since the last license fee modification went into effect in 2014. Fisheries Division's costs of fish food for our hatcheries program now cost a million dollars, an increase of 71 percent over the last several years.

The Michigan Legislature has the opportunity to provide a longer-term solution to the funding issues of the DNR.

Hunters, anglers and trappers are proud to currently contribute tens of millions of dollars in license revenue each year for funding fish and wildlife conservation in Michigan, representing the vast majority of the Game and Fish Protection Fund, but there is a need to expand this pool.

Until this happens, license fees remain the single largest source of revenue supporting fish and wildlife management, habitat management and DNR law enforcement.

We, the undersigned organizations, recognize the need for a license fee restructuring and support the need for the proposal. We are looking forward to working with the Michigan Legislature this winter to ensure that fish and wildlife conservation and management is adequately funded for years to come. Change of Pace Asian Honey Mustard Salmon On Spinach and Mushrooms

Give Asian Honey Mustard Salmon On Spinach and Mushrooms a try. This recipe serves 6. One portion of this dish contains approximately 9g of protein, 9g of fat, and a total of 144 calories. Head to the store and pick up soy, sesame oil, ginger, and a few other things to make it today. From preparation to the plate, this recipe takes roughly 45 minutes.

Instructions:

For the salmon: Pat dry and massage in salt and pepper. In a small mixing bowl, combine creole mustard, honey, and soy.

Place mixture in a bag with salmon and marinate for half an hour. Cook on 450 degrees 20 to 30 minutes in a baking pan coated with a little olive oil. Make sure the salmon is well coated with the marinade. In a large saucepan, saute sliced white onion in sesame oil. Then, add and saute mushrooms, garlic, and spinach, with salt, pepper, ginger, and soy. Cover and cook until the spinach has cooked down.

Ingredients

- 1 bag pre-washed baby spinach
- 5 tablespoons creole mustard
- 2 teaspoons garlic
- 2 tablespoons ginger
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 1 package clean mushrooms

6 ounces to 8 salmon

1 tablespoon salt and pepper

2 teaspoons sesame oil

2 tablespoons soy

1 onion
