Harbor Beach 6/14/26

This year I'm going to pull a Mitch Albom for this report on our tournament at Harbor Beach. I'm going to have to write about something that I didn't attend. But at least I'm confessing up front.

I launched the boat on Tuesday with plans to pre-fish the rest of the week leading up to the Veterans outing and the DAS tournament. After launching, I soon found that the hydraulic lines on the Beaver Troll were leaking. Although I could still fish without the Beaver Troll, I didn't want to be leaking oil in the Marina. I ended up dropping the boat off at home and returning to Harbor Beach that night. I cancelled my Marina slip, my crews for the rest of the week and let Kevin know that I wouldn't be able to fish in the Vets outing.

Before I cancelled my slip I called several of the Captains that normally fish our tournaments to see if they needed one. Besides, one recovering from knee surgery, one rupturing their Achilles tendon, one helping a family member move, one with engine trouble, and my hydraulic lines, five captains made it to the tournament. Allen, (Miss Adventure), agreed to handle tournament duties for me while out on the water.

Wednesday, I fished with Fred, (Lake Buzzard). We ran out to the reef and ended up with a four person limit of Lake Trout and five Steelhead. There were some real hog Lakers and four of the Steelhead were real good size. The surface temps were around 43 degrees. Lakers came about 60 ft down and Steelies about 15 ft down. I went back home that afternoon to take my boat in for repairs. I know Fred went back to the reef on Thursday with similar results. Friday turned out to be a blow day and Saturday of course was the Vets outing. My sources tell me that the fishing was fantastic in shore for the Vets.

Sunday morning, I went back to Harbor Beach to set up the weigh-in equipment, the brag board, and drink coolers. Lunch included broasted chicken, red skin potatoes, coleslaw, macaroni salad and rolls provided once again by Ricky J's. Thanks Allen and Bob Ksionzek for handling weigh-in duties.

Lake Buzzard took first place with 80.0 pts, Blue Star second with 70.6 pts., and Wonder with 68.85 pts. Lake Buzzard had a nice king at 16.8 lbs and big Laker at 11.6 lbs. Miss Adventure had a real nice Steelhead at 8.15 lbs. I understand the best fishing was off of Port Hope in 100-150 fow. Thanks Allen and Bob Ksionzek for handling weigh-in duties. Also, thanks to the captains who participated in the Veterans outing.

Grand Haven 2026

The Grand Haven Outing was May 23, 2026. It's our only 2 day outing this year. Seven boats entered and all caught fish! Due to high winds Friday night into Saturday morning, the outing was delayed until the afternoon. We had lunch Saturday at noon and the event was scheduled for 2 to 7 pm. The lake laid down as the afternoon progressed. Fishing was good, but not fabulous. Wonder came in first weighing in 2 kings, 2 lakers and a steelhead. Down Under came in second with a king, 3 lakers and a steelhead. In third place, Miss Adventure weighed 2 kings and 3 steelhead. Vicki's Secret had 3 kings for fourth place. Slopy Joe came in fifth with 2 kings. Hardtop & Tails had 2 kings. In last place, Lake Buzzard had a king and a laker. Sloppy Joe took big king at 12.25 lbs. Down Under took big steely at 6.8 lbs. Big laker was caught by Wonder at 13.3 Lbs.

Sunday morning we fished from 5:30 to 10:30 am. The water was much calmer and the cloud cover helped the fish bite. Again, all boats caught fish! The results of both days are combined to establish overall standings. There were 2 separate big fish pools, one for Saturday and one for Sunday. Wonder took first place weighing in 4 kings and a steelhead. In second place was Miss Adventure weighing in 5 kings! He also took big salmon at 17.15 lbs. and big laker at 4.75 lbs. Third place went to Sloppy Joe weighing in 5 kings. Vicki's Secret came in fourth with 5 kings. Down Under came in fifth with a single laker. Lake Buzzard came in sixth weighing in 2 kings, 2 steelhead and a coho. His steelhead won big fish at 7.2 lbs. Hardtop & Tails held onto last place with 2 kings.

Many more fish were caught in Grand Haven over the weekend. The above are only the largest weighed in. This has been the best outing that we've had in several years! We hope to see you there next year!

The SOTY event in Pentwater took place on July 11, the AOTY event in Port Austin happens on July 18, and the SOTY event in Ludington occurs on July 25.

I do my best to get the monthly newsletter out to membership close to the middle of each month. The timing of those three events will not allow enough time to cover them in the July newsletter. That means the best I can do is record the results of those outings in the August newsletter. Please be patient.

Also, if event chairpersons wish to advertise their event in the newsletter in an effort to recruit DAS anglers to participate, please get me the necessary information with enough time for it to be reported in the monthly newsletter. Thank you for your cooperation.....Dan.

If you hunt or fish in Michigan, your legislators need to hear from you — right now. Michigan is the Great Lakes State. Fishing, hunting, and outdoor recreation are part of who we are — and they support a combined \$11.2 billion industry and an estimated 171,000 jobs that touch every corner of this state.

Protecting Michigan's outdoor heritage doesn't happen on its own — and it doesn't happen for free. No matter your personal opinion of the DNR, the facts are simple: if we want clean waters, healthy wildlife, safe trails, and well-maintained parks, we have to fund the people responsible for making that happen.

If Michigan's outdoors matter to you, prove it with a two-minute phone call. Contact your Michigan House and Senate representatives NOW. Tell them to vote YES on HB 5093, the critical Fisheries Component, and support the complete package needed to protect Michigan's \$11.2 billion outdoor recreation economy — an industry that affects all Michiganders. This is not just about one activity, one group, or one region. It is about protecting our natural resources, supporting our economy, and preserving the outdoor traditions and opportunities that make Michigan great.

HB 5093 is the key that unlocks the whole package. Don't let it stall. Make the call.

There is a lot of work that goes into planning and executing any DAS Club outing. It starts with the board of directors laying out the annual plan and passing the plan down to the appropriate committee to turn the plan into action. The Skipper of the Year Committee and the Angler of the Year Committee set up meetings where schedules are decided upon regarding what ports we should visit and what dates are good for each port. It can get complicated and prior year results are considered before a schedule is decided upon.

Once a schedule is published (SOTY-AOTY) a whole new plan must be made up where port captains for each port are solicited. This is the part I want to bring to the attention of membership because we all need to do our part to help this club be all we can be. As John Wooden said, "Nothing happens until we all make it happen. The port captain basically runs the outing. Outing registration, fee collection, start/stop times, fish calls, weather boats, member safety, post event weigh-in, record keeping, pictures, and shore lunch all fall to the port captain. The point I'm trying to make is, its not an easy job.

Fortunately, the port captains we have are up to the task and we are glad to have them. But members can make their job easier. Register as early as possible for any event. The port captain has a budget and needs to know how many people need to be fed. Arrangements must be made with the food vendor in advance. If you must cancel, do it as early as possible. Don't make the port captain seek you out for payment. If you have registered, attend the weigh-in. Catch or no catch. At the least, communicate with the port captain to settle registration/big-fish payment. In the event you can not attend the weigh-in, the event registration fee must still be paid. This lets the port captain know everyone is accounted for and makes the job easier.
