

Living Life After Death – Food Vendor Requirements

(Nevada State & Local Regulations)

All food vendors must follow Nevada laws for Temporary Food Establishments (TFE) and mobile food service. Failure to comply may result in removal from the event without refund.

1. Temporary Food Establishment (TFE) Permit

- Apply with the Nevada Division of Public & Behavioral Health (DPBH) or Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD).
- Submit application at least 5 business days before the event.
- Fee: \$50 per event (nonprofits may be eligible for reduced fee ~\$25).
- Must be displayed at your booth during the event.

2. Food Handler Certification

- All staff handling or serving food must hold a Nevada Food Handler Card.
- Cards are valid for 3 years and can be obtained online or in-person through a state-approved course.

3. Health & Safety Standards

Vendors must:

- Keep cold foods at or below 41°F and hot foods at or above 135°F.
- Use a calibrated thermometer to check food temperatures.
- Have a handwashing station with warm water, soap, and paper towels.
- Store all food off the ground and protected from contamination.
- Provide sanitizer for surfaces and follow proper utensil storage rules.
- Dispose of wastewater and trash in designated areas.

4. Mobile Food Vendors (Food Trucks) (if applicable)

- Must have a City of Las Vegas business license for mobile vending.
- Must pass Fire & Life Safety inspection and SNHD inspection.
- If propane is used, a current Nevada State LP System inspection is required.

5. Additional Notes

- Vendors are responsible for bringing their own tents, tables, equipment, and electrical needs unless arranged otherwise.
- All food and beverage sales must comply with Nevada tax laws.
- You may be inspected during the event by the health department.
