Community Connections

- Otterbein Nature Series: March's program on "Vernal Pools and Spring Salamander Breeding" was led by Caesar Creek Lake Army Corps of Engineers Park Ranger, Jessica Zimmer. She did a great job, and they may be interested in joining for future presentations.
- Butterfly Garden at Landen Deerfield: local artists Amy Lynn Johnson and Lynn Baird are nearly finished with the project. Installation will be the next step! Jeff, you mentioned possibly having a rain barrel and gutter system to donate for the shelter next to the garden. If this is still the case, please email or text me!







- Cub Scout Pack 417, Den 9 Bears: Scouts have constructed mason bee houses for the solar/pollinator area. I would love some help deciding where to hang them. Ideal locations are 6' off ground with morning sun exposure, but there are 12 of them (4"x6" each) so we can try lots of different spots to see what works best. FYI, mason bees are solitary bees that are excellent pollinators. They are docile and will not sting unless severely provoked; in fact, the males don't even have stingers!
- American Heritage Girls: Wildlife Badge activity at St. Margaret of York on 4/4/19. We studied the taxidermy fox, owl, and raccoon, plus they met the program turtles and snake. 15 girls and 5 adults in attendance.
- **New Volunteer:** Dennis Borda, an OCVN and Otterbein resident, would like to help monitor the bluebird houses at Keever Park. I've put him in touch with Dave Woehr and Bill Lindauer. We are excited to have him join our wonderful team!

Long-Term Projects

Solar Array/Pollinator Project: Solar array is hooked up and powering the park! Seeding of annuals per Ohio Pollinator Habitat Initiative specs will take place in early May. Perennial seeding will take place in December/January. There has been a LOT of behind-the-scenes work going on! All of the "bare dirt" area in the picture below, including the portion inside the solar array, will be filled with native wildflowers! Dianna Kenneally can provide details about the status of her grant project for signage.



- Wildflower Restoration Project and Accessible Trail: at Landen-Deerfield Park is moving forward. I'd like help coming up with ideas on funding signage for this area when it's finished. Nature Works grant?
- Little Miami Conservancy Partnership: I've been meeting with Eric Partee from LMC and Melissa Proffitt from WCSWCD. LMC has funding to purchase several high-tech water monitoring kits and would love our help utilizing



them for educational programs with the public. They will lend us the equipment, and we can run the programs. I know we have several areas within our PD where we could do some "stream encounters" with this technology as well as macroinvertebrate sampling. Kits are to be purchased by mid-summer and we can utilize them as soon as they are in. If you can think of Little Miami River watershed access points within our PD, please let me know! This could be an excellent opportunity to educate the general public on water quality and citizen science, and there's no cost to us!
