Hisey Park is located in Corwin, Ohio, at the corner of Corwin Road and Middletown Road, just two miles south of the quaint and historic village of Waynesville. It is seven miles east of Lebanon, Ohio and only eight miles northeast of I-71.

The park features mature woods, hiking trails, a stream, wetlands, and a beautiful view overlooking the valley.


