Kathy is currently living in a hotel with her family as their insurance company prepares to fix everything so they can move back in. You can imagine the problems that would present themselves if you had to live in a hotel for the next year or so.

We currently have property that is not being rented by anyone. That includes most of the Parish House. Iast week the Church Council approved that we would make the space outside of the wing with our current office available to Kathy. This means the insurance company will be paying her rent while the repairs are made to her house. It seems like a great solution to not only Kathy's need for a safe place to live but also to help with our need to have that space rented.

We are anticipating that this will be a blessing for everyone involved. I am proud that as a community of faith we are supporting Kathy during such a difficult time. And Christmas will have an added meaning at Good Shepherd this year because we are not shutting our doors saying, "No room in this inn!" This year we will literally welcome in the homeless.

If you had meetings in the space we are making available to Kathy we will find another space for you to use. Thanks for whatever adjustments you may have to make so we can continue to be a place that Shares the Love of Jesus!

GSLC Food Pantry Helps Roeding Families




