Dear Friends,

I was born on May 8, 1970. That was 25 years to the day that Germany surrendered in World War II. At this point in my life, I know 25 years is not that long of a time. As I grew up, I learned about the history. Whenever someone wanted to bring up someone evil, Hitler was often that person. Example: Is God's love so great that even Hitler goes to heaven?

I also grew up seeing the Nazis portrayed as goofy (Hogan's Heroes), greedy (Raiders of the Lost Ark) and psychotic (Schindler's List) on our television and movie screens. I have never seen a positive example. Many of us grew up having to read The Diary of Ann Frank. Even Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German pastor, risked his life to take out Hitler because he was so evil. Central to this evil, of course, is the genocide of Jews that was occurring by the Nazis.

One thing I thought I would never see again is widespread anti-Semitism. The news reports today have said that not only is anti-Semitism is growing around our world but also here in our country.

The above scripture passage is what we were studying at our last Kingsmen Men's Group. We are part of the Judeo-Christian faith. The Judeo part means our heritage begins with our Jewish roots. We are not Jewish people but we have the same Father.

Sometimes interfamily fighting can be brutal. People are divided on the right thing to do about what is happening and has happened in Israel. I don't have the answers for how to bring peace to the Middle East, but peace is what I pray for. Maybe peace will happen by everyone laying down their weapons now or maybe peace will happen after a time. Peace is what Jesus prayed for Jerusalem. They had problems back then too.

Please join me in praying for peace. When you see the violence of war and the suffering of children it's heartbreaking. To hear anti-Semitic words of hate here in America is unimaginable to me, yet here it is. Join us at worship this Sunday where we will continue to pray for peace both here and abroad!

October Financials




Dear Good Shepherd Family,


This month, after I processed payroll and had paid all the bills on the 26th, we were short \$2,500. I had to transfer that amount from our memorial account to cover the payroll and outstanding bills that had not cleared (PG & E, our lawn person, and our weekly janitor) which would clear on Monday the 30th before any deposits made on Sunday would populate. Fortunately, we had a deposit of \$8,400. so, I was able to transfer back the \$2,500. back to the memorial account. The total for the 29th makes it look like it was a good month, however, we received BIA's rent check for November on Sunday. This means our November income will be lower than usual (BIA's rent is \$5584). We are ending the month with a general funds checking account balance of \$6112. That's a scary amount given the rent belongs as November income ...

We did not have any unusual expenses. We have a phone call to the Fresno commercial Trane company to have them come out and look at the sanctuary HVAC. It will not come on in either the heating or AC mode. More to follow after they have completed their evaluation. Please pray for our church's financial health... it is looking a little rocky.



DWLS



Several flight paths were cancelled for October 16th's potluck meeting but eleven Hooties successfully landed at Sandy's. Our guest speakers were "Buddy the Beekeeper" (A.K.A. Steve Kapalko) and Becky Thompson. Many thanks to Kay Provost who had been trying to coordinate our program since before the pandemic hit.

Most of the time bees won't attack unless threatened. Only then will they react. A finger or knife scrape will prevent the venom sack's release. Smoke dispatches bees to their hive. Country hive boxes must be 100' from an inhibited structure and 200' from the road. The honeycomb tray boxes can weigh from 75-100 pounds. A 1/4" space between the trays is adjusted for winter and raised in summer.

Ten thousand in a swarm the size of a basketball may take residence on a limb for 2-4 days during February to March. Bees are never quieter than when they swarm to keep their queen warm. The queen

may take her distaste of the comb design with half of the colony in search of new digs. Florida greets 70% of the migrants.

Worker bees consist of 95-96% of the hive existing for six weeks to gather nectar. They will search 2-5 miles from the hive to gather food. Sunset glows on their "bee line" (straight line) back to home base. Drones (stud football fans) make up 3-4% with their dark, boxy bodies half the size of their queen. Then there's the Royal Highness. She can lay 1500 eggs per day. FEMALE workers nudge her if she's not dropping them fast enough.

Our Hooties buzzed to swanked out "Buddy the Beekeeper" with his bee socks and boots engraved with his name to purchase his morning's freshly jarred honey.

Guidelines for plants/flowers attracting bees is to stop or limit the use of pesticides by spraying not on the plants but as little as possible close to the structure. Bees need plants/flowers, their

food needs water, no water . . . no produce/food for us. And the Catch 22 evasive solution has got to be somewhere out there with communication and cooperation being the key.

We and those little bumble bees all struggle with issues never realizing that all we have as an escape route is to LOOK UP. Sorry looks back. Worry looks around.




