I look forward to worshipping with you this Advent. As we celebrate the birth of the Prince of Peace may peace be born in us in new and exciting ways!



# **November Financials**

SEGIVING MATTERS!

**Dear Good Shepherd Family,** 

November was a difficult month on several levels. We had Trane Commercial out to diagnose our HVAC system for the sanctuary. The cost for the evaluation was \$1,046. We received their estimate to fix (it is the thermostat) which will cost \$2,868.00. We have approved them to go ahead and fix the known problem – the sanctuary is useless without an HVAC system. They will be out on December 4<sup>th</sup>. Please pray that this is a final fix! We received a commitment to donate \$1,000. toward the cost and I cannot begin express my gratitude for that donation.

The second issue we are facing is the fence surrounding our property. We share this fence with our neighbors, Woodside Homeowners Association. That fence is over 20 years old. After multiple discussions with us, and much back and forth, the HOA contracted to go ahead with the fence. The total cost is just over \$36,000.00 (the fence extends from Fruit all the way around to San Jose). The choice was to either share some of the cost with them or face a challenge in court and that would cost us more that just half the fence. We approached the Memorial Garden committee and requested a loan of \$12,000. to help toward the cost of the fence and the cost to repair the sand box that had caused the fence to collapse near that section of the fence. We proposed the church will pay back the Memorial Garden when the Employee Retention Credit (ERC) comes in. The committee agreed to loan the church the funds.

As you can see from the figures below, we spent more than came in. The \$23,645.52 is a very real number – we have spent that much more than we have taken in. Our church faces some serious financial issues over the next few months. You will be presented the budget at the Congregational meeting on December 17th. We have tried to reduce the budget where we could. The council will be discussing other areas to reduce monthly costs at our next meeting on Dec. 21<sup>st</sup>.

I know I say this every month, but please, continue to pray for the church's financial health. Pray that the IRS will release the ERC funds very soon. Pray that we can see our way though

this difficult time.





"The Dictionary of Lost Words" by Pip Williams

"The Dictionary of Lost Words" is a historical fiction novel by Pip Williams. The story is set in 1901 and revolves around a young girl named Esme who grows up in the "Scriptorium", a garden shed in Oxford where her father and a team of lexicographers are collecting words for the first Oxford English Dictionary. Esme's curiosity leads her to collect words that are misplaced, discarded, or have been neglected by the dictionary men. Over time, she realiz-

es that words and meanings relating to women's experiences often go unrecorded. While she dedicates her life to the Oxford English Dictionary, secretly, she begins to collect words for another dictionary: The Dictionary of Lost Words. The novel reveals a lost narrative, hidden between the lines of a history written by men, and celebrates the power of language to shape the world and our experience of it.


Even if Diane CONSTANTLY whined she didn't have a heart we all KNOW she really does have a HUGE HEART of LOVE.
