

But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

"LIVING ABOVE FEAR" Preaching text: Luke 12:32-40

Our country is about as stressed out as it can get. The level of fear and anger these days is palpable. Even though we may be politically opposite of the person we are sitting next to right now there is one thing we share: we have had enough. Isn't it exhausting to be so angry and afraid? I know some people who have stopped watching the news. Maybe that is one way to keep fear and anger away.

In our Bible reading for today Jesus says, "Do not be afraid, little flock."

Have you noticed many events in the Bible begin with those words, "Do not be afraid?" You are probably most familiar with them from the Christmas story. When the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to tell her that she would be the mother of Jesus, his first words were, "Do not be afraid." And "Do not be afraid" was what the angel said to the shepherds in the fields.

"Do not be afraid." What words could be more meaningful for us today? They are comforting words. But how well are we at living them? And how are they even possible?

California farms are being hit hard by not being able to bring in their harvests. There is anger and fear across our agricultural landscape today.

Like I said, this had been a very scary time for our country. The problems are so loaded with anger and fear that it seeps into our relationships. The differences between us as individuals in the same country are so great. The fear and anger are so real I can't even talk about the sources of what's off kilter because we can't agree on the same reality! It seems we have good reason to be afraid.

Or what about the international scene? Things are very up in the air with our world economy. There is war or the threat of war in many places. Allegiances are changing.

And even if neither of those causes any fear in your heart, did you know on an interstellar level that scientists are tracking an object, 31 Atlas, that is possibly an alien ship. It is speeding toward Earth at 130,000 km/hr. It is expected to be here in October or November.

And all of us in our own lives ... or through those we know ... the senseless accident, the onset of disease, the pain of a relationship ended. How do we hear God's words, "Do not be afraid?"

I would like to share with you what I have found helpful in dealing with my fears. It's pretty basic. But it has worked for me. To deal effectively with the things of which you are afraid ...

- | 1st FACE your fears.
- 2nd **EXAMINE** your fears.
- And 3rd, with the help of God, you can **OVERCOME** your fears.

First of all, you have to **FACE YOUR FEARS**. Fear is a very real force in our lives. Show me someone who says they aren't afraid of anyone or anything, and I will show you either a colossal liar or someone whose bubble is off center. No one is immune from fear.

Fear starts early. Children use a nightlight for good reason. Loud noises can scare children. Or big animals.

What about you? We adults have fears, too. Have you ever been lost in a forest or on a hike? Have you ever suspected you had a serious disease? Have you ever worried about your job? Your kids? A relationship ending? Have you ever been afraid that you are out of control in some area of your life?

Once we've faced our fears, it is important to **EXAMINE** our fears. We should ask ourselves, "Why am I afraid?" Am I afraid of failing because I will look bad? Am I afraid of losing my job because my entire identity is wrapped up in what I do? Am I afraid of losing my health because I don't want to be dependent on others? Why am I afraid? **EXAMINE** your fears.

After we **FACE** and **EXAMINE** our fears, we then can ask God to help us **OVERCOME** those fears. This is where faith comes in ... believing that Jesus can help me change. Believing that no matter what is going on in my life or in the world, that God does have the final word.

Ask God to help you **OVERCOME** those fears you have. Have you asked for God's help with whatever you are afraid of? What are you waiting for? You don't have to face those fears alone. Oh, from the outside things might not look much different. Our world will still be the same. The situation and the circumstances leading to those fears will undoubtedly remain, but **YOU** will be different. God will help you, and with God's help you will **LIVE ABOVE YOUR FEARS! AMEN.**

Last year on precisely today's date, one of our granddaughters was married at a beautiful location in Vermont. We flew into Hartford, and then rented a car and headed north on the interstate. We went through Springfield, Massachusetts, which is the home of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. So, we stopped and had a great time.

In today's reading from Hebrews 11, we are given a glimpse into the Bible's "Hall of Faith"! It is known as the "faith chapter" of the Bible because it chronicles the lives of men and women whose trust in God shaped their actions and altered history. From Abel to Abraham, this chapter reveals the heart of faith: a confident trust in God's promises, even when circumstances make them seem impossible.

The reading forces us to ask questions about how healthy and strong our faith is. What promises of God do you need to trust in this season of your life? How can you live out your faith in a way that inspires others?

These are important questions. Fortunately, we know that faith is not blind optimism or wishful thinking; it is a deeply rooted assurance in the character of God. Verse 6 reminds us that "without faith, it is impossible to please God, for whoever would approach him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him." Faith acknowledges that God exists and is faithful to his promises. The chapter gives us numerous examples.

Consider Abraham, who was promised descendants as numerous as the stars. His unwavering faith not only honored God but also set an example for all believers. Faith enables us to act in obedience, even when we do not fully understand God's plan.

- Noah built an ark in preparation for a flood he had never seen.
- Moses led the Israelites through the Red Sea, trusting God to make a way.

These acts of faith were not grounded in visible evidence but in the assurance of God's faithfulness. As Christians, our faith is anchored in Jesus Christ, "the author and finisher of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2).

What an incredible Hall of Faith this chapter gives us! How can we not fail to be inspired by the lives of those who walked by faith and not by sight?

May we, like the HOFers of Hebrews 11, walk in faith, pleasing God and glorifying God's name.
