### **January Financials**



**Dear Good Shepherd Family,** 

We are starting off the year in the positive. This is due to some very generous end-of-year donations as well as a surprise donation of \$10,000.00 from one family. These donations went a long way to helping us stay in the black. January is when our QuickBooks subscriptions renew as well as the GoDaddy subscription. Our total office supplies for the month came in at \$1,558.00. We repaired 3 toilets (2 in Jacobson and one in the office area of **BIA)** and the sink in the small kitchen in the BIA office area was leaking and needed repair. Our inside maintenance was \$1,250.00. All other expenses were normal for this time of year. We were positive \$2,747.36 for the month.

We received a refund of \$935.65 from Commercial Trane on the bill for work done on the HVAC in the sanctuary. I am trying to get an itemized billing for the \$1,932.35 from them. The billing stated to replace the thermostat, which they could not as it was the incorrect part. That was what the refund represented. I still need a bill for what the \$1932 represents.

Please continue to pray for our church. We are still facing challenges this year.


# Lent Soup Suppers Begin 2/14 @ 6:16PM

"GRATEFUL: Giving Thanks to God in All Things"


Foster a Heart of Gratitude - A 4-Session Bible Study by Lifeway Women


