February Financials

YOUR GIVING MATTERS!

Dear Good Shepherd Family,

This month we received several yearly donations and only had one unexpected expense, so it was a good month. We ended the month in the black \$25,681.

The unexpected expense was a leak in the kitchen area of the office building. BIA notified us when the floor felt "squishy". Evidently the sink had not been draining properly because the disposal was not working for quite a while and the water was backing up to the non-working dishwasher. It was then leaking under the floor. Unfortunately, BIA never notified us the disposal was not working and the sink wasn't draining so the floor was soaked by the time we figured out what was going on. The cost of the flooring was over \$2,000.00 plus we had to buy some supplies to fix the floor. We were fortunate in that we had labor, spray and some large plywood donated for the repairs. It is now fixed, and the flooring should be installed shortly. The funds for the flooring were allocated out of designated funds for Campus Maintenance.

During this process BIA requested they be allowed to leave the lease early. The council is allowing them to terminate their lease as of June 30th. There is a group working to try and find a replacement renter. They have already started moving some things out.

We were able to reduce our monthly garbage expense by \$300. by reducing the size of the garbage bin and reducing the pickup to once per week. We will continue to be frugal in our expenses as those yearly donations we received will have to last the full year. Continue to pray for the financial health of our church.

GOOD SHEPHERD IS HOSTING OUR CONFERENCE ASSEMBLY



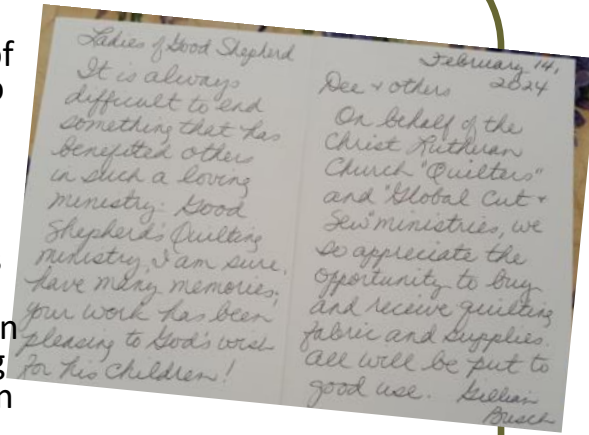

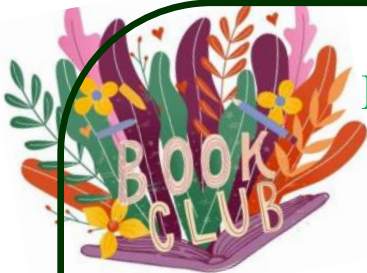
Lent Soup Suppers @ 6:15PM

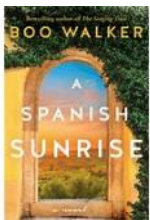

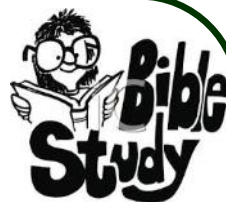
As is our usual practice, our Wednesday evening group does not meet during Lent. We will begin to meet again, Wednesday, April 3.
