LIVING IN AN IMPERFECT WORLD Preaching text: Luke 16:1-13

Jesus often taught using parables. A parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. It's a small story with eternal implications. It is different from an allegory ... in that in an allegory every detail has inner meaning. But in a parable, there is just one point. Most people who write about Jesus' parables exclude this one from their collections. It's our gospel for today. The reason it is so often excluded is because Biblical scholars can't agree on what the point of this parable is.

Just <u>prior</u> to today's text is the story of the Prodigal Son.

Remember, he asked for his inheritance early and then squandered it on loose living. Immediately <u>after</u> our text is the parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man ... where the rich man fails to share what he has with the poor, destitute Lazarus and so he ended up in hell.

Our reading for today, known as the Parable of the Dishonest Manager, sits sandwiched right in the middle. There is a reason why it is in between these other parables.

The dishonest manager was squandering someone else's wealth that he was entrusted with ... just like the Prodigal Son was a few verses earlier.

What happens next is the difficult part. This dishonest manager tells the people who owe his master money to slash what they owe to his master. In other words, they are conspiring to cheat his boss. And then, the master commends him! That's like someone

telling you to slash your mortgage in half. You would be thrilled! But it doesn't make sense that the one getting screwed compliments his employee on the screwing, does it?

This dishonest man made friends by slashing those accounts. He did that so they could help him out later when he was out on his own. It was a "I scratch your back if you scratch mine" sort of deal. He's hoping to be paid back.

Biblical commentators and preachers have been trying to figure out this parable for millenia. Ever since Jesus told it.

But one thing I'm sure of ... whatever dishonest transactions the guy was making with his master's money ... he was not squandering his opportunities. He was taking full advantage of the situation. He wasn't losing the money because he was lazy or inept. He was losing money for a reason ... to find himself a home.

I don't understand why the master commended him for ripping him off. Could it be that that was the master's wish all along?

God, our master, blesses us with uncountable riches.

Verse 8 says, "... his Master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light." And then it goes on in Verse 9: "... make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so then when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes."

That sounds bitterly ironic to me. The master commends this guy for "acting shrewdly" and then says, ironically, I imagine, "and you can depend on those shrewd people to get you to your eternal home." Obviously, that's not going to happen. God decides who makes it to the heavenly home, not shrewd people on this side of eternity.

So, if it is said ironically, which makes sense, then we need to hear Jesus' message being "People of the light do not deal shrewdly. They use their resources in ways that bring life ... life to those who we share them with and life to us as we participate in God's distribution of wealth."

If we look at the man's master as a brute who was only out for a few bucks ... the parable doesn't make sense. But if we understand the Master as God who always has our best interests in mind ... then I think this parable becomes a little more intelligible.

Everything in all of creation belongs to God. And God has called us to be his managers with all kinds of things. God gives us what we have so we'll share what we have. And by doing so ... we earn friends and we are promised a home with the children of light.

Next week we'll be hearing about Lazarus and the rich man. And we'll see what happens to those who act shrewdly. Spoiler alert: It's not favorable.

Scripture Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-7

To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing. —Martin Luther





A quick search of the internet on the subject of answered prayers yielded a ton of responses. People reported that God had answered prayers for healing of diseases, a new job, a raise in pay, saving the lives of their dogs and cats, reconciliation with an estranged loved one, and more. These are wonderful reports, but it does make you wonder whether these testimonies capture the essence of what prayer truly is.

Prayer is one of the greatest gifts God has given us. It is not only a privilege but also a responsibility. In today's Bible reading, especially verses 1-3, the apostle Paul emphasizes the importance of prayer, calling on believers to pray for *all* people — not just those we love or agree with, but everyone, including those in positions of authority. What's startling is that he doesn't emphasize praying *on behalf of ourselves*.

Notice what he says about the types of prayers:

- Petitions bringing specific needs before God.
- Prayers engaging in general communication and worship with God.
- Intercessions standing in the gap for others, seeking God's intervention in their lives.
- Thanksgiving expressing gratitude for God's blessings and faithfulness.

By covering all people in these types of prayers, we align ourselves with God's heart for the world.

With these words, Scripture connects our prayers with the ability to lead peaceful and godly lives. Prayer changes us, softens our hearts, and aligns our desires with God's will. And prayer puts us in direct contact with God. Pastor Max Lucado puts it this way: "Our prayers may be awkward. Our attempts may be feeble. But since the power of prayer is *in the one who hears it and not in the one who says it*, our prayers do make a difference."

Take a moment to reflect: Who in your life needs your prayers today? Remember, prayer is powerful — it changes hearts, circumstances, the world and can even change you!

The Parable of the Dishonest Manager

16 Then Jesus [a] said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. 2 So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.' Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? 

Our book for SEPTEMBER: "The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store" by James McBride



In 1972, when workers in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, were digging the foundations for a new development, the last thing they expected to find was a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held secrets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant CBRIDE Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. Chicken Hill was where Moshe and

Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. When the state came looking for a deaf boy to institutionalize him, it was Chona and Nate Timblin, the Black janitor at Moshe's theater and the unofficial leader of the Black community on Chicken Hill, who worked together to keep the boy safe.

As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community—heaven and earth—that sustain us.
