April is not only the month of Easter, it is also "Donate Life Month" highlighting the importance of organ and tissue donation. Being an organ recipient myself I know the new life organ and tissue donation brings. Did you know:

- 100,000 are waiting for an organ transplant in the United States.
- Every 10 minutes another person is added to the transplant waitlist.
- Less than 1% of all deaths meet the specific medical criteria to be an organ donor.
- 22 people die every day waiting for a life-saving organ transplant.
- 1 organ donor can save up to 8 lives.

On this month that we celebrate new life for eternity it is appropriate for us to consider what we can do to provide new life for others now. We have that opportunity. And you don't have to give anything until after you don't need it anymore! I hope you will consider being an organ and tissue donor. Please let your family and friends know about your decision. It is a powerful way to give life as Jesus did for us!

Happy Easter! I hope you experience new life however you may need to!

March Financials

YOUR GIVING MATTERS!

Dear Good Shepherd Family,

The numbers below do not reflect the kind of month we had. As way of explanation, last summer we had three air conditioner units go out in the school rooms. All three were on back order until just recently. The total cost of all three units was \$9,842.13. We received a very generous donation of \$10,000.00 to cover the cost. Unfortunately for the last many months we have had more expenses than income. I had been using the \$10,000.00 as a buffer to cover our expenses. All three units have come in. One bill came in at the beginning of the month, the second two bills just came in this week. That meant it was time to use the designated donation.

Since the Community Center was built, we have had a small saving account through Bank of America that was designated Community Center. The balance in that account was \$6,870.99. I have transferred \$6,600.00 from that account to our general account to cover payroll. That \$6,600.00 is showing as income. I have asked the council to think over where we can start making significant cuts to our expenses. We will be discussing this at our council meeting on the 20th.

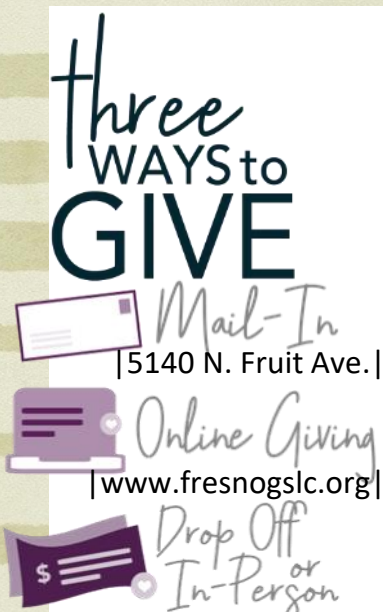
We cannot continue to spend more than we take in. We have to get our expenses more in line with what we have coming in as income. It doesn't work for your home finances, and it does not work for our church. Next week I will be sending a breakdown of exactly what our ongoing expenses are for their review. If anyone in the congregation would like to be included in my email, I will include you. Just let me know. If anyone has thought, feel free to share those thoughts.

In the meantime, there is one thing we can all do. Please pray for your church. Pray for guidance for your council as we face some hard decisions.

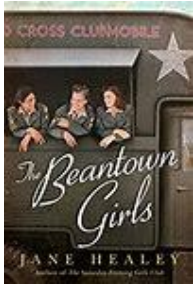

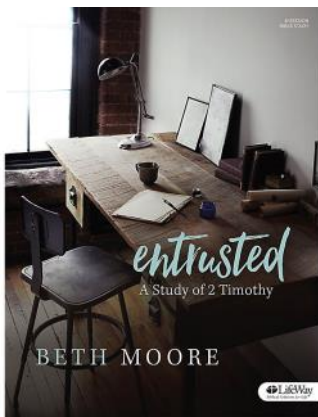
WEDNESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY

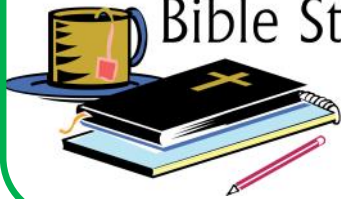

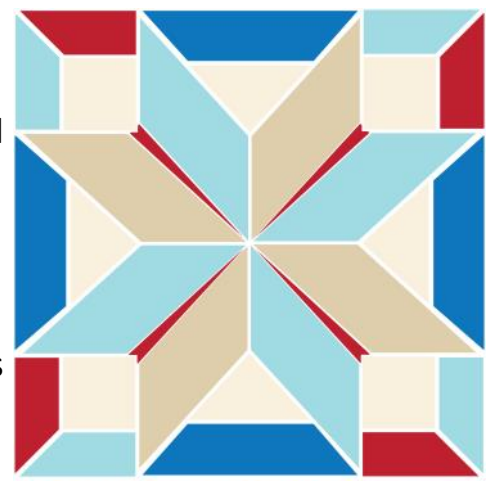

"My Faith and My Family"!

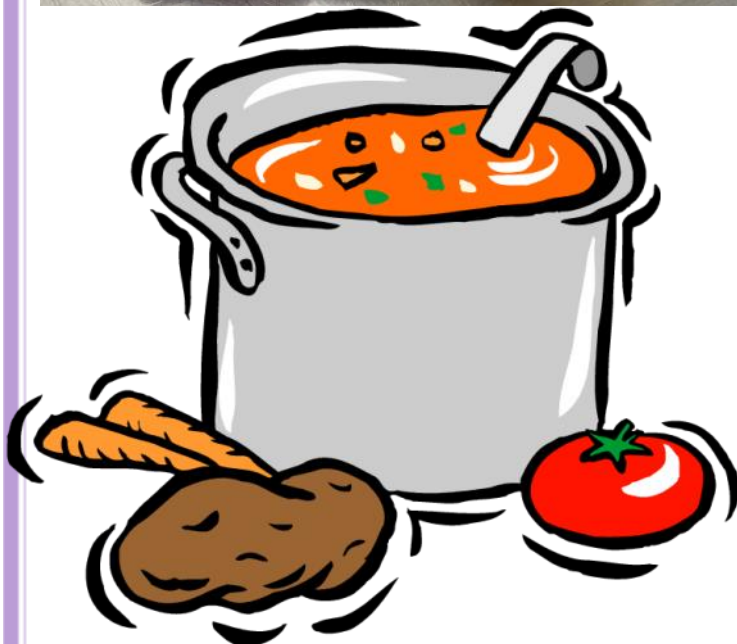

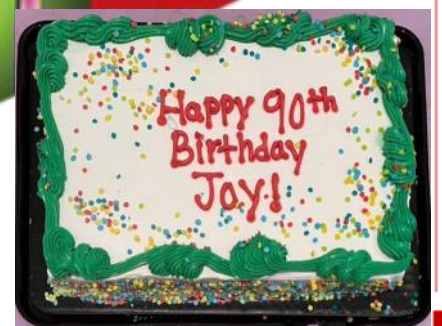
