You are welcome to join us at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Dear Friends,

We currently have more than a few of our members and friends on our prayer list who have cancer. We have had times of celebrating when someone wins a battle with cancer. We have also had funerals of people who died of cancer.

Below is an article I got from my parents' church, Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Surprise, AZ. I thought it would be helpful to share so we can all be sensitive to those who are facing cancer.

Finding out that someone you know has cancer can be difficult. If you're close to the person, this can be a shocking and stressful time for you, too. If you are not comfortable talking about cancer, you might not be the best person for your friend to talk with at this time, as you work through your own feelings. You can even explain to your friend that you are having trouble talking about cancer. You might be able to help them find someone who is more comfortable talking about it (i.e. support groups, pastor).

But if you feel you want to be there to help, here are some suggestions for listening to, talking with, and being around this person. Communication and flexibility are the keys to success. The most important thing is to **listen**. Try to hear and understand how they feel. Don't make light of, judge, or try to change the way the person feels or acts. Let them know that you're open to talking whenever they feel like it. Or, if they don't feel like talking right at that time, that's OK, too. You can offer to listen whenever they're ready.


You're not alone if you don't know what to say to someone who has cancer. Sometimes the simplest expressions of concern or just listening are the most meaningful things you can do.

Try to make your response honest and heartfelt. Here are some ideas:

- "I'm not sure what to say, but I want you to know I care".
- "I'm sorry to hear that you are going through this".
- "How are you doing?"
- "If you would like to talk about it, I'm here".
- "Please let me know how I can help".
- "I'll keep you in my thoughts".

If someone tells you that they have cancer you should never tell anyone else unless they have given you permission. Let them be the one to tell others. It might feel awkward if you hear through the grapevine that someone has cancer. You could ask the person who told you if it's public information. If it's not, you probably shouldn't say anything to the person with cancer. But if it is public information, don't ignore it. You might say, in a caring way, "I heard what's happening, and I'm sorry".

I hope this is helpful in your being a caring, sensitive person. It is wonderful to be a part of this community that cares for each other!

Pentecost BBQ on May 19th



We plan to celebrate by grilling up hot dogs and providing chili to top them. (You are also welcome to bring other






