Dear Good Shepherd Family,

This month income was down. Part of the reason was BIA's rent was paid at the end of May (that's \$5,376.26). The second reason is – summer is here – people are traveling, and income is traditionally down during the sum-



mer. We did get the check in from our insurance company, Church Mutual, for the damage done to the lights in the courtyard and parking lot. The repairs for that were just completed this week, so the bill has not been paid.

If you notice, the expenses were high this month. This was partly due to an error I made last month. I miscalculated when I had to do payroll. I remembered that Memorial Day was a holiday but did not factor in the banks being closed and everyone got paid one day late. Normally our paychecks and the two vendors we pay by direct deposit (our janitor and our lawn service) are issued on the last working day of the month – the May payments went out on June 1st.

As I think everyone has heard we had a second copper theft – this time the air conditioner condenser outside the office (\$6,904.19 in damages). That claim has been turned in and the insurance company has approved on Friday of last week and the check should come in very soon. The AC condenser will be installed on 6/29 and the bill will be payable after that date. We will be responsible for our \$1000. deductible. The company doing the work gave us a quote for placing a cage over the condenser. This should prevent future vandalism. The cost is \$1,750.00 and we have authorized it – it just makes sense since they will see we replaced and will be headed back to do it again.

The next major expense we have is replacing one of the window air conditioners in one of the classrooms. This is a cost of \$3,280.71 and there is no insurance for that – it was just

Report of Assembly

During the 2021 Sierra Pacific Synod Assembly, then Rev Megan Rohr was elected as our Bishop. She had the support of the majority of the LGBTQ Lutheran members. Undisclosed by the candidate Rohr was the ongoing case in San Francisco Superior Court for misappropriation of funds from Grace Lutheran Church in San Francisco.

During preparations for the 2022 SPS Synod Assembly this case came to light. In addition, the events of December 12, 2021, the Fiesta de la Guadalupe for Latino members were also divulged. The Mission Latina at St Paul's Lutheran in the Stockton Conference was closed in an inappropriate confrontation. <u>https://www.spselca.net/post/synod-</u> council-statement-regarding- misi%C3%B3n-latina-luterana

When the 2022 Assembly began, it was evident that now Bishop Rohr had lost a great deal of support of the LGBTQ community. Churchwide Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was present throughout the Assembly, in itself unusual. Also Carlos Pena from the Churchwide Council facilitating and observing the entire Assembly.

When the vote was finally called on the resolution of dismissal, a 2/3 votewas required. Voting members counted 309; 183 votes were cast for dismissal 138 votes cast against. The vote for dismissal failed.

The final business meeting was held Saturday morning when 4 resolutions published in the guidebook were considered. We were then hurriedly dismissed for closing worship WITHOUT the consideration of 2 resolutions which were submitted in writing during the Assembly. They were not read aloud or given to the voting members in any form. All unconsidered resolutions automatically go to the Synod Council for decision. We have no way to know what they are.

This was my third Assembly as a delegate. Overall it was very poorly organized, procedures were not understood by organizers, translations of information was not prepared ahead in spite of the knowledge of the makeup of our membership. This observation and disappointment was shared by other members at the microphone, including LGBTQ and Latina members.

I have prayed for the fire of Pentecost to inflame the leadership of our Synod so that we will be truly able to share the love with our diverse membership.



Driving Jesus to Little Rock by Roland Merullo Wednesday, July 6 at 6:30 pm – Community Center





The narrator of the story, Eddie Valpolicella, is on his way from Massachusetts to Arkansas to give a talk on "his" novel, Breakfast with Buddha, when, not far from home, he picks up a mysterious hitchhiker. Plainly dressed, insisting that he's a fan of the author, the hitchhiker claims to be Jesus, the Jesus, and accompanies Eddie on a five-day road trip that challenges him in an amusing variety of ways.

Every night on the way south, Eddie calls home to speak with his wife, and Anna Maria's fiery insistence on choosing trust over suspicion gradually pushes him out of his original cynicism. Jesus plays tricks appearing and disappearing, changing shape, vacillating from stern teacher to affectionate friend-and Eddie, confused, suspicious,

and wrestling with his own preconceived notions of spirituality, only very slowly realizes that he's being given precious guidance in the art of living.


Roland Merullo manages to walk a tightrope by raising deep philosophical questions without sounding preachy. The author provokes readers to think about life while also making them laugh and providing them with a boots-on-the-ground view of America. This journey includes wealthy Russian businessmen, poor Appalachian deer hunters, South American spirit guides, and tours of places as seemingly disparate as a therapeutic massage studio in Lower Manhattan, the Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, and Thomas Merton's Gethsemane monastery in rural Kentucky. Along the way there are meals and drinks, wrong turns and intriguing scenery, all brought into focus beside the book's utterly original yet strangely believable Jesus. - Amazon.com



The Unsinkable Greta James

Greta James's rise to indie stardom was hard-won. Before she graced magazine covers and played to sold out venues, she spent her girlhood practicing her guitar in the family garage, full of big dreams and determination. Her first fan was her mother, Helen, who always encouraged Greta to follow her heart. But her father, Conrad, was less supportive; he saw only a precarious road ahead for his daughter, and always pushed her to make more practical choices.



Greta has spent her life trying to prove him wrong. And she's succeeded beyond even her own wildest dreams. But a week after her mother's sudden death, and just before the launch of her highstakes sophomore album, she completely falls apart on stage. The footage quickly goes viral, and she stops playing, her career suddenly in the exact kind of jeopardy her father always predicted.

As Greta works to build back her confidence, and Ben confronts an uncertain future, they find themselves relying on each other to make sense of life's difficult, unexpected choices. 

Did you see our new green paraments when you entered the sanctuary on Sunday, June 19th? They are a generous gift from two couples in our membership and we are so very grateful!

Paraments are liturgical hangings on and around the altar. The color of the paraments that are hanging define what church season we are in, such as purple is for Lent, blue is Advent, red is Pentecost, etc.

Green is used for "ordinary time" of the church year when we are not in any liturgical season. Ordinary time usually lasts 30 weeks of the 52 weeks in the church year. We are now in ordinary time and it will last through October.

Because our green paraments hung for many years, they were very faded from the light hitting them. The donating couples said, **"It's time for new green paraments!"**. They generously ordered them and now they are hanging! Thank You!

Julie Werfelmann conducted a "Blessing of the Paraments" during our worship service on June 19th.






