3-9-2025 Contemporary/Traditional Worship Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Heavenly Father, today's Gospel gives the sobering information about Jesus' temptation in the wilderness by the enemy of God called Satan or the devil. We know who he is; he is the enemy of our souls, too. And we know about temptation. Satan comes to us at our times of weakness, just as he did with Jesus who had finished forty days of fasting and was very hungry. *Lord in your mercy...*

That's when Satan comes to us too: when we're tired, or sick, or depressed or discouraged, or feel that no one loves us, or we have no friends, or we have a health crisis. He knows when to pounce; and his tool is deception. His words are lies and suggestions that seem almost real; they seem like our way out, or the way things will get better. But they won't. Satan stirs up strife; he ignites wars; he operates with half-truths; he makes us believe he has the answer. But he is a liar, a deceiver from the Garden of Eden. The apple did not give our ancestors perfect knowledge; it opened their eyes to evil and pain all around them. Their son killed his brother. Death for everyone was the result. *Lord in your mercy...* Remember this congregation, its pastor and people, as we share the love of Jesus. Touch those who have asked for prayer with healing, comfort and new life. We name those among us who have asked for prayer. And for what else do the people of God pray or praise? *Lord in your mercy...*

Rather, the answer is to praise God. Remember our Creator who blesses us with abundant life through his Son Jesus Christ, as Romans says, "believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, [and] you will be saved." First Sunday in Lent, March 9, 2025

Scripture Reading: Luke 4:1-13

Most people want to be delivered from temptation but would like it to keep in touch. —Robert Orben



In my ministry as a pastor, I've had the opportunity to travel to Israel and visit many biblical sites. One of these is Jericho, behind which rises Mount Quruntul, the traditional site where Jesus began his earthly ministry. Christians know it as The Mount of the Temptation.

As I looked at this mountain, a tower of rock and rubble, I couldn't imagine anyone surviving four days up there, let alone 40! But I started to think again about Jesus' experience alone in this arid environment.

He was not afraid of the wilderness. Perhaps he even embraced it. We know that he emerged from these 40 days much stronger than when he started. In a sense, Lent is our spiritual wilderness, a time to strip away the distractions of daily life and focus on our relationship with God. The wilderness is not a place of *abandonment* but a place to encounter God! In the silence and solitude, if we listen carefully, we will hear his voice more clearly and understand his will for our lives.

He resisted temptation. His retreat involved some heavy lifting. He had to use his words and the weapon of Scripture to keep the devil at bay. He faced three significant temptations: turning stone to bread, worshiping Satan for worldly power and testing God's protection. Each temptation challenged his identity and mission, yet Jesus responded with the truth of Scripture, affirming his trust in God's provision, worship and protection. When we're tempted, the Bible is our most powerful weapon.

As we begin our journey through Lent, let us embrace this season as a time of spiritual renewal and growth. For Jesus, these 40 days were a type of strength training, as though he had his eye on the Olympics — which for him would be his final week in Jerusalem some three years hence. It began here, in the mountain of temptation.

So, let's take heart from the example of Jesus. We, too, can be strong. We, too, can be equipped for everything that lies ahead of us. With prayer and trusting in God's protection and provision, there's nothing that can stand in our way!



GOSPEL Luke 4:1-13

The Testing of Jesus

4 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tested by the devil.
